## Become a Cambridge inspector for History-Geography

Cambridge International Examinations prepares school students for life, helping them develop an informed curiosity and a lasting passion for learning. We are part of Cambridge Assessment, a department of the University of Cambridge. We are responsible for managing the development and administration of the British version of the International Option of the French *Baccalauréat*.

The French *Baccalauréat* is the national examination that French pupils take at the end of seven years of secondary education. All students are taught and examined in Philosophy, French, History-Geography (a single subject), Mathematics, at least one foreign language and Physical Education. Students entered for the British version of the International Option (OIB) study two of their subjects in English: History-Geography and English Language and Literature.

We are seeking an experienced teacher of History and/or Geography to act as senior consultant overseeing the quality assurance of the History-Geography examination (written and oral) for the candidates of the British Option. This is an exciting opportunity to represent a department of the University of Cambridge and work in partnership with the French Ministry of Education to oversee the examination of the History-Geography component of the French *Baccalauréat* for the British Section. The role is based in the UK, but involves travel to France to attend meetings and visit examination centres at key times during the year.

The Cambridge Inspector will be required to liaise with a French counterpart Inspector, the French Ministry of Education and other key personnel including the Cambridge Inspector for Language-Literature, the OIB Schools' Chair and the two Subject Leaders in France.

An important element of the role involves working closely with the OIB subject community of teachers and schools, with opportunities to play a leading part in curriculum and assessment development and in delivering Continuing Professional Development in France.

Nearly all the meetings with key personnel will be conducted in English, but a basic working understanding of French would be an advantage.

The appointment of the Cambridge Inspector will be on a rolling contract, renewed annually. The role begins in January 2016; however, the successful candidate will also be invited to attend the annual subject community meeting in France in October 2015.
