
- Impact schools will have a differentiated centralized educational and administrative mechanism to set instructional priorities, identify professional development needs, and oversee progress.
- Impact schools will receive special intervention and technical assistance until the Superintendent determines that they have the capacity and commitment to support the redesign plan.



Review and Assessment

Each Impact school will engage in a multi-part review/assessment:

Principals will identify specific actions and supports they feel will help them move their schools forward.





Review and Assessment

- 2. A team of professionals will conduct a review visit of each school. The review includes examination of the school's instruction, curriculum, assessment, management, leadership, professional development, parent and family involvement, discipline and safety, facilities, and the adequacy of district support for the school.
- Members of each school will study its own data, characteristics and practices, report their findings, and offer recommendations for action.



- School Governance, in collaboration with the school leaders, will develop a corrective action plan based on the review team's findings and other pertinent data.
- This plan will include professional development, reviews of resource management, data reviews, classroom monitoring, work sample studies, interviews, and planning sessions.





- A service team of central office personnel and other professionals is charged with assisting the schools with meeting their established targets in all areas.
 The team leader is Andrea DeShazo, Executive Director of Elementary School Governance.
- Meetings with all key staff will be held monthly, at a minimum, to monitor progress. Adjustments to the CARE plan will be made based on data.

- September-October 2014 Parts 2 & 3 of Assessment; CARE Plan created, Professional Development begins
- November 2014- June 2015 CARE Plan executed;
