

## **RECRUITMENT PROCESS**

FOLLOW LEADS	Collect leads from social media, Facebook pages, churches and ministry groups, etc. Face-to-face contact (brainstorm places and people)
INITIATE CONTACT	Call, text, email, etc. Pray before contacting Discover through good questions their calling, passion, or needs If appropriate, share how Stonecroft might meet those needs
AFFIRM & INVITE	Affirm their giftedness, kindness, etc.  Ask a quesion: If I, would you?  Ex. If I sent a video, would you take a look? If I connected you with another volunteer, would you talk with her?
FOLLOW UP	First question after small talk: "What did you like?" Pray with them Keep the mission of Stonecroft front and center
DIRECT QUESTIONS/ COMMIT	At the conclusion, ask her to take a responsibility at the next hub gathering

## **NEW VOLUNTEERS**
