



The tournament competition developed into a two team battle between two-time champions, Alabama, and Virginia during the final round. In the end the Crimson Tide held on to take their third title with a seven-shot victory! Virginia finished a solid second with defending champs, Duke finishing in third. For the individual title, Alabama freshman Cheyenne Knight, shot 67-74-72 for an even par total to take a slim one shot margin over four players at +1 to win her first collegiate title.

In addition to the successful collegiate event, it was recently announced that Long Cove Club moved up 19 spots to No. 62 in Golfweek's 2016 Best 100 Modern Golf Course ranking. We are excited to have moved up in this prestigious ranking.

### **RBC Heritage Week: Tee Time Information**

Heritage Classic week (April 11 – 17) is a lot of fun and a very popular week in Hilton Head as usual following the Masters (April 7 – 10). As in the past, our policy for reserving tee times during this very busy week differs from our standard rules in that a member may book **one tee time only per day.** Multiple times will not be available. Also, LGA and MGA events will take place as usual but with limited spots available.

### **Member Rules Reminder**

In this busy season when many of our Members are bringing guests and family to the club, please remember that Members are responsible for ensuring that guests comply with all club rules including our club dress code policy. **Cargo shorts are not acceptable, shirt tails must be tucked in, and gentlemen may not wear headwear anywhere in the clubhouse**. These are some of the more frequent issues we must address and our hope is to avoid problems and potential embarrassment for our Members and guests. Remember also that these rules apply to the practice areas as well as the golf course whether you're actually hitting or simply observing others. Please note, audible cell phone use is restricted to the bag drop area, parking lot or locker rooms only. Thank you for your cooperation in observing these rules.

## Please be Mindful of Your Pace of Play!

During our busy spring it is particularly important that you remain mindful of your pace of play and position on the golf course. Four hours and 17 minutes is a generous amount of time for 18 holes and should be easily done if all members of the group **play considerately**. We will be watching our "lead off" groups closely to set a good pace and pushing for all groups to keep up. Please be considerate of your fellow members and play without delay! **The goal is to keep up with the group in front of you, not simply ahead of the group behind!** Also note, if you're riding in a cart, a time chart for pace of play is included on the hole location sheet to aid in recognizing if you're on time and on pace. Finally, please recognize that the pace of play is dictated by foursomes! Two and three ball games should not expect to play faster on a busy day dominated by foursomes. Thank you for your consideration.

   Tee time requests cannot be made more than seven days in advance and times will be assigned on a first-come
- first-served basis. Each club allows a limited number of times available for reciprocal play.

#### Major Projects and Golf Course Closing July 18 to August 8 - Summer Maintenance Schedule and Golf Options

Once again, we will be closing the golf course mid-summer to complete necessary course maintenance tasks. We will close from Monday, July 18 through Monday, August 8. This is a bit later than in years past as we want to allow more open time around the July 4<sup>th</sup> holiday for member access to the course. We will utilize this time to do both of our required greens aerifications as well as other needed course projects. We believe this will help us to provide better general course conditions overall for the remainder of the summer months. To accommodate member golf during the down time, we will have our previously mentioned summer reciprocal golf program in place as well as access to the courses of the Heritage Golf Group which includes Palmetto Hall, Oyster Reef, Port Royal and Shipyard.

### Golf Shop and Practice Area Schedule During Course Closure

During the course closure, the driving range will be open from July 19-24 (first week) and August 2-7 (last week). The Golf Shop will open from 9:00 am - 3:00 pm, but will be closed on Mondays as usual.

## HANDICAP REMINDERS

The Handicap Committee is responsible for all aspects of the USGA Handicap System at LCC and is working hard to monitor and manage the process to ensure fair and equitable handicapping within our membership. In order to do this please recognize that the success and accuracy of handicapping is largely dependent upon the integrity of each player to post scores according to the USGA handicapping guidelines.

Each player is responsible for posting all of their scores. As communicated previously, this can be done in a number of ways including the posting stations in the Golf Shop or locker rooms, online on GHIN or with the mobile app available for this purpose. ALL acceptable scores must be posted, whether they were played at LCC or elsewhere. Also, please return fully completed scorecards to the drawer at the posting station in the Golf Shop as the committee performs random audits of member posting. If you have questions or require assistance with posting scores or anything regarding handicapping please contact the golf staff and we are happy to assist.

## **GOLF** MAINTENANCE

As I write this, pollen is in the air, azaleas are blooming, and the bermuda grass is starting to green up after a few months of dormancy. This past winter has definitely been atypical. Christmas and New Year's holiday golf rounds were played in shorts by many and mother winter has

come and gone but now spring is in the air. We can all look forward to warmer temperatures and longer days.

Although many enjoyed the temperatures of this past November and December, the warm, cloudy conditions made it tough for our overseeded rye grass to establish. Bermuda grass growth continued through the New Year and some of our rye grass stand never really got to full maturity due to being choked out by the actively growing bermuda. Then came winter, which brought numerous heavy frost delays and resulted in a patchy stand of ryegrass throughout the course.

As spring time arrives, so does transitioning from our overseeded fairways back to the base bermuda. The bermuda is coming out of dormancy and slow to develop its density and root system that is needed for the summer. The weather in the spring is very conducive to growing rye grass, this is a problem because it can grow faster than our base bermuda that is weak and just starting to grow. In an effort to soften the transition process we will start regulating the growth rate of the rye grass during late April and May. It is our goal to have the majority of our cool season turf eliminated by early June so that our weak bermuda base has as much time as possible to strengthen before we start the overseeding process over again in October. The practice of restraining rye grass growth during late spring has worked very well for us in years past and I expect the same this year. As always, it is likely that the shadier fairways, tees and collar areas will transition worse than the open and sunny sights.

On **May 9** we will be aerating the greens with 1/4" hollow tines followed by a light sand topdressing. This small tine aeration will cause very little disruption to the putting surface but will be very beneficial in removing thatch, warming the soil, and promoting Tifeagle bermuda growth to smooth out the transition process.

In May, our summer interns will be arriving. Daniel Nunn, attending Abraham Baldwin Agricultural College and Austin Brewer, who attends UT Martin. Both young men are looking forward to spending their summer working at Long Cove. Our internship program is beneficial to the student in providing hands on practical experience and beneficial to the employer by providing us with aspiring golf course superintendents that truly care about the golf course. Many previous interns have returned after graduation to work on our management staff.


In closing I would like to remind everyone that our major aerations of tees, greens, and fairways will occur during the 3 week closure, those dates are **July 18-August 8** with the course re-opening on August 9. The details of events that will be occurring during that period will be relayed in future communications.



## **GATESURE** - AN EASY WAY TO ONLINE GATE PASSES Willie Rice, Chief of Security

Members are encouraged to use our online system called "Gatesure" for automated gate passes. This allows us to better serve our Membership! To use Gatesure, login to the Member Central section of the website and follow the link to the left of your screen. Your User ID is your ten digit phone number (example: 8433215567) and your password is the last four digits of that phone number. Once logged in, the system is easy to use! Click on the visitors tabs, Choose "Create and Schedule Visitors", Select visitors to schedule, Schedule selected visitors, Save. If you need assistance with logging into the system, you may contact Erin Khalili at ekhalili@longcoveclub.org.

The information will automatically be retrieved at the Security Gate. Please remember that guest passes can only be extended for up to 30 days and then will need to be updated. As

#### **Gate Fees Enforcement**

All vendors/tradesmen who are invited under a personal name during business hours will be charged a gate fee for services upon entering the community. Commercial contractors and tradesmen hours of operation are following: Monday-Friday (7:30 am—6:30 pm), Saturday (8:00 am—4:30 pm), Sunday (Work not permitted).


