

Major Antique Auto Show coming to New Bern



Many near priceless and seldom seen vintage automobiles from throughout the country will be showcased on the streets of Historic Downtown New Bern, N.C., Saturday, August 13, in the Antique Automobile Club of America's 2016 Southeastern Fall Meet.

Billed as a premiere juried exhibition of heritage and classic vehicles, the meet is expected to attract upwards of 350 automotive marvels exemplifying the evolution of passenger vehicles over the last century, according to Marshall Van Winkle, meet co-chairman and a member of New Bern's First Capital chapter of the AACA which is hosting the event.

Entries will span the ages from a 1903 one-cylinder Cadillac, a 1904 Pope-Toledo Type V and a "Barn Fresh" 1924 Model Tto a 1973 Mohs Safarikar and a 1991 Cadillac Eldorado. Muscle cars, race cars, classic Ford Thunderbirds, Chevrolet Corvettes, and Pontiac GTOs will be featured along with Auburn and Model A Speedsters, Studebaker Golden Hawks, Hudsons, DeSotos and various other American and foreign marques

"This meet is a celebration of automotive history that not only features cars but also trucks, jeeps, motorcycles, mopeds, fire engines and other motorized vehicles that are at least 25 years old and were produced to be driven on the road and to carry passengers", Van Winkle said.

The vehicles will be displayed on sections of Broad, Middle, Pollock, and Craven streets in the heart of the downtown area which will be closed to vehicular traffic to create the show field that will be open free to the public. Thousands of car enthusiasts and the curious are expected to turnout for the meet which begins with vehicles entering the show field at 7 a.m. and ends with the completion of judging at 3 p.m. Attendees will not only get to see treasured vehicles of the past, but also will be treated to a special automotive-education program for youth and the much acclaimed Take-Apart-T demonstration featuring a team that disassembles and reassembles a 1917 Ford Model T in minutes. Both events will take place at the intersection of Middle and Pollock streets beginning at noon.

AACA members will begin arriving in the host city two days before the judging for a series of member-only activities, ranging from roundtable discussions and judges training to seminars and various social events. The threeday program concludes with an awards banquet Saturday evening at the New Bern Riverfront Convention Center. Awards will be presented to winners in various classes ranging from historical preservation of original features to daily drivers, and from un-restored race cars to special interest vehicles.

"The AACA's selection of New Bern to host this national meet was a major coup for the club and the city," Don Temple, president of First Capital said as he praised city leaders for their cooperation in planning the event and promoting the city as a welcoming, must- see destination for AACA members. "This is a win, win, win situation for all concerned. Meet goers will revel in the prowess, styling and grace of unforgettable automotive engineering, the AACA will advance its mission of preserving automotive history, and the local economy will be spurred as visitors frequent our hotels, restaurants, shops and various attractions", he added.

Charles Wells, meet co-chairman responsible for logistics, noted that "New Bern has been a popular show place for the AACA which has sponsored several meets in the city over the years, including Grand National Meets in 2002 and 2010, the latter of which attracted 511 entries, the second most in Grand National Meet history at the time. This is the sixth AACA national meet hosted by First Capital and our goal is to ensure its success by enriching attendees with indelible images of automotive masterpieces and a vibrant, hospitable, culturally rich city."

Founded in 1935, the AACA is the world's largest automotive historical society with 60,000 members and 363 regions and chapters in 41 countries. Headquartered in Hersey, Pa., it sponsors a dozen or more meets annually across the country. New Bern's First Capital is one of 14 AACA chapters in North Carolina.

Boating, fishing, paddling, hunting, golfing, biking, hiking, bird watching, photography, camping, and tennis are only a few of many outdoor recreation opportunities in New Bern, NC!

Nestled between the Neuse and Trent Rivers in Eastern North Carolina, New Bern is a haven for boaters, fishermen, and water sport fanatics. From large Marina's to off the path boat ramps, you'll find them here: <u>www.ncwildlife.org</u>.

Fishing is plentiful! Some of the water is brackish so you can catch both salt water and fresh water fish - you may need both licenses. For a unique outdoor experience, call <u>Spec</u> <u>Fever Fishing Guide Services</u> (249-1520). Join the <u>Anglers</u> <u>Anonymous Fishing Club</u> (919-757-5715). Bear Foot Kayaks (229-4846). Are you a boater? Join the New Bern Yacht Club (634-2626)or the New Bern Grand Marina Yacht Club (638-0318). Do you prefer paddling? Contact the <u>Neuse Riverkeepers</u> (637-7972) and/or the <u>Twin Rivers Paddle Club</u> (636-6606) for paddle trail maps and details about boating and fishing on the Neuse and Trent Rivers along with their tributaries. A "Nature Lover's Paradise", enjoy the Croatan National Forest (NF). The forest's habitat has exotic plants like the Venus flytrap, making it the only NF with the largest carnivorous plant population. The Croatan spans approximately 160,000 acres and is located in New Bern's backyard. It's a sanctuary for black bear, deer, wild turkey, quail, coyote, beaver, porcupine, bobcat, American alligator, bald eagle, red-tailed hawk, and other wildlife you may see.

Talk to the people at the Croatan NF Ranger's Station on Hwy 70 E (638-5628). The Croatan is full of history and untamed lands!

Campers have many choices. Stay at New Bern's KOA located on Hwy 17 N in Bridgeton (800-562-3341). Visit Flanner's Beach Campground or Neuse River Campground which are run by the Croatan National Forest. Brice's Creek also has a small primitive campground.

Join cyclists at Flythe's Bike Shop, 2411 Trent Rd, as Flythe's leads bike rides around town (638-1544). You can also rent bike's from them at the Galley Stores, 300 E. Front St. Atomic Cycles also leads rides around town. Visit them at 504 S. Front St. (633-2242).




