## Calla Lily

The calla lily is a type of calla, which is a flowerlike herb. Its funnel- or bell-shaped leaf is often white, and many people mistake it for the flower. The flowers are actually inside the leaf. The calla lily is a tropical calla that grows on the banks of the Nile River in Egypt. Other names for it are the Ethiopian lily or common calla. It has a 10 -inch (25-centimeter) leaf.

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## Carnation

The carnation is a tall flower with colorful blossoms. It is between 1 and 3 feet ( 30 and 91 centimeters) high. The carnation was first grown in southern Europe, but several types are grown now in other areas. It can bloom any time of the year, depending upon the climate and how it is taken care of. A carnation can be blue, pink, purple, red, white, or yellow. The scarlet carnation is the state flower of Ohio.

Follow these instructions to draw a carnation on the next page like the one shown below:

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## Daisy

There are many types of daisies, but the name comes from Old English words that mean "day's eye" because of the way daisies open in the morning and close at night. A daisy is actually made up of two kinds of flowers, a tiny disk flower in the middle and ray flowers that are like petals around the edge. The most common wild daisy in North America has a yellow disk flower in the middle, with white or yellow rays. It grows up to 3 feet ( 1 meter) tall, with flowers up to 2 inches ( 5 centimeters) across.

## Iris

The iris has a very unusual shape, with three sets of petallike parts. The iris plant can be anywhere between 6 inches ( 15 centimeters) and 6 feet ( 2 meters) tall. The flowers on the plant can be from 1 inch ( 2.5 centimeters) to more than 1 foot ( 30 centimeters) across. The iris grows in the northern temperate areas. It can be nearly any color, and its name comes from a Greek word that means "rainbow."

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## Magnolia

Magnolia is the name of many types of trees and shrubs that grow in North and South America and Asia. The southern magnolia is a popular tree in the United States. It is native to the area from North Carolina to Florida and from the Atlantic coast west to Texas. It has beautiful large white flowers. The tree is the state tree of Mississippi, and the flower is the state flower of Mississippi and Louisiana.

Follow these instructions to draw a magnolia on the next page like the one shown below:

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## Narcissus

The narcissus is an early spring flower often called a daffodil. The narcissus is native to Europe and Asia, but it is grown in North America, too. The flower is often yellow in the center with white on the outer petals. A narcissus grows from a bulb. A common narcissus is the short-trumpet type called the poet's narcissus. This flower has a yellow cup in the center with a red edge and white petals surrounding it.

Follow these instructions to draw a narcissus on the next page like the one shown below:

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## Pansy

The pansy is a type of violet. The flower can be many colors, such as purple, violet, blue, yellow, white, brown, deep red, or any combination of these colors. The plant does not grow very tall and grows best in shady, moist places. Many types only live one year, but some are perennials and live at least three years.

Follow these instructions to draw a pansy on the next page like the one shown below:

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## Petunia

The petunia is a plant with funnel-shaped flowers. It is a very popular flower for gardens in the United States and other countries. The petunia flower is about 4 inches ( 10 centimeters) or more across. It can be many different colors, including pink, rose, salmon, red, white, blue, or a combination of these colors. The petunia originated in Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Paraguay, and Uruguay. It was brought to Europe in the early 1800s and is now grown around the world.

Follow these instructions to draw a petunia on the next page like the one shown below:

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## Rose

There are thousands of different kinds of roses in the world. They come in many colors including shades of pink, red, yellow, white, or lavender. Roses can grow in many different areas, but it is best if there are warm summers and cold winters. The old type of garden rose only blooms once a year, however, newer types of roses are everblooming, which means they bloom almost constantly during the growing season.

Follow these instructions to draw a rose on the next page like the one shown below:

- In the first grid, draw the half of the picture that is missing.
- In the second grid, see if you can draw the entire picture.


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## Tulip

The tulip grows from a bulb and is native to Africa, Asia, and southern Europe, though many people connect tulips with the Netherlands. A tulip stem can be from 4 inches ( 10 centimeters) to more than 30 inches ( 76 centimeters) tall. There is usually only one flower on a plant, and it is either shaped like a bell or like a saucer. A tulip can be almost any solid color or even two colors.
