
American Bashkir Curly Horse


American Bashkir Curlies have very dense bones in their legs. Their hooves are almost perfectly round. They have a coat of fine, often curly hair and are considered to be hypoallergenic. They have wide set eyes with eyelashes that curl up. They are a very hardy horse and can survive harsh winters.


American Bashkir Curlies are generally about 56-64 inches (142-163 cm) tall at the withers and usually weigh approximately 800-1,250 pounds (363-567 kg).


American Paint Horse




Paints are generally about 57-64 inches (145-163 cm) tall at the withers and usually weigh around 950-1,200 pounds (431-544 kilograms).


Andalusian Horse


Andalusians have massive chests, with muscular bodies and long legs. They were bred on the Iberian Peninsula and were considered to be a symbol of power for the Spanish and Portuguese kings of the past. Andalusians are one of the ancestors of the Lipizzaner breed. Today, Andalusians are officially known as the Purebred Spanish Horse.


Andalusians are generally about 56-64 inches (142-163 cm) tall at the withers and usually weigh around 1,000-1,200 pounds (454-544 kg).

- In the second grid, see if you can draw the entire picture.








Arabian Horse


Arabians have powerful lungs and very strong bones. They are famous for their stamina and are able to compete in long races through difficult areas. They are able to run about 25-30 miles (40-48 km) per hour.


Arabians are generally around 57-61 inches (145-155 cm) tall at the withers and usually weigh about 800-1,000 pounds (363-454 kilograms).

- In the second grid, see if you can draw the entire picture.








Gypsy Vanner Horse


Gypsy Vanners are also known as Irish Cob or Gypsy Cob horses. They have powerful shoulders, strong backs, and muscular legs. They are athletic and colorful, with heavy bones and broad bodies.


Gypsy Vanners are generally about 56-60 inches (142-152 cm) tall at the withers. The first characteristic that stands out to many is the long hair on the legs and the mane and tail. The hair is usually straight and silky, but it often has some wave or even a little curl.

- In the second grid, see if you can draw the entire picture.








Quarter Horse


Quarter horses have very muscular bodies and strong legs. They are famous for their speed, as they were bred to run short races. They got their name from the fact that they dominated the quarter-mile races for a time.


Quarter horses are generally about 57-64 inches (145-163 cm) tall at the withers and usually weigh around 950-1,200 pounds (431-544 kg). Their life span is approximately 25-30 years.

- In the second grid, see if you can draw the entire picture.








Shetland Pony




Shetland ponies are generally up to 42 inches (107 cm) tall at the withers. They are one of the smallest breeds of horses and often have a long life.

- In the second grid, see if you can draw the entire picture.








Shire Horse


Shire horses are one of the strongest horses alive and are considered to be the world's largest horses. They are descended from the massive chargers used in medieval jousting tournaments. These horses were able to carry men in full armor into battle.


Shire horses are generally more than 68 inches (173 cm) tall at the withers and usually weigh up to about 2,000 pounds (910 kilograms).

- In the second grid, see if you can draw the entire picture.








Thoroughbred Horse


Thoroughbreds are known for their powerful bodies and long legs. They are famous for their speed. The fastest recorded speed for a thoroughbred is almost 44 miles (71 km) per hour.


Thoroughbreds are generally about 60-68 inches (152-173 cm) tall at the withers and usually weigh around 900-1,200 pounds (408-544 kg). Their life span is approximately 25-30 years.

- In the second grid, see if you can draw the entire picture.








Welsh Pony


Welsh ponies are a smaller type of horse. They were bred to work in the small tunnels of coal mines. Today, they are often used as a small horse for children and even adults.


Welsh ponies are generally about 48 inches (122 cm) tall and usually weigh around 500 pounds (225 kg).

- In the second grid, see if you can draw the entire picture.







