Nightingale House remembers school

NIGHTINGALE House has unveiled a plaque honouring an historic Jewish school for the deaf that stood in its grounds more than 50 years ago.

At an event last Sunday, the Mayor of Wandsworth, Councillor Adrian Knowles was amongst more than 60 guests who attended the event at the Jewish care home in Clapham, where the Residential School for Jewish Deaf Children stood between 1899 and 1965. Members of the Jewish Deaf Association, which offers support to people with hearing loss and their families, were joined by former teachers and students of the school, as well as Shanee Buxton,

Headmistress of Oak Lodge School, which also now occupies part of the land. Both Nightingale House and the Residential School for Jewish Deaf Children had their properties donated by local Jewish philanthropists of the time, Sydney Stern, Baron Wandsworth and his brother Sir Edward Stern in the 1890s.
