WHEN TO GO

Peru and Ecuador are year-round destinations with rains Dec-Mar. Colombia's proximity to the Equator keeps temperatures stable throughout the year, around 24°C along the coast and 7-17°C as you move inland with peak travel times Dec-Feb. The Galapagos Islands are predominantly warm and dry with different wildlife attractions throughout the year.

Brazil is best visited Mar-Nov. In summer Rio is hot and humid while Mexico is at its best between Nov and Apr. Costa Rica has two seasons - dry (mid-Nov to Apr with Dec-Jan peak season) and rainy (May to mid-Nov). Guatemala has a pleasant climate year-round with best time to travel Nov-Apr.

In the continent's south, Argentina and Chile are also year-round destinations with warm-hot summers (Jan-Mar), especially in the north and cold winters, particularly at higher altitudes and in the Patagonian south.

BRAZIL | 10 Days | Rio de Janeiro - Iguazú Falls - Brasilia - Salvador



Welcome to Brazil, a vast nation overflowing with vibrant cultures, unstoppable rhythms and infectious energy. Discover a city where music and dance are as vital to life as air and water. Seek out the country's pulsing epicentre of Afro-Brazilian culture. Contemplate the architectural marvel that is Brasilia. And let endless thunderous waterfalls take your breath away.

JOURNEY HIGHLIGHTS

- Drink in Rio's magical twilight on the summit of Sugar Loaf Mountain
- Witness an explosion of drums and energy in the epicentre of Afro-Brazilian culture, Salvador
- Stand amongst the thundering, steaming cauldron of 275 waterfalls at Iguazú Falls
- Wander through the futuristic cityscape of Brasilia

Day 1: Arrive Rio de Janeiro. Step into the steamy, sensuous, ever-surprising world of Rio de Janeiro. Get your bearings in this impossibly marvellous city, with its curving white beaches and city neighbourhoods studded with green-shrouded mountains. Belmond Copacabana Palace (Superior Partial Ocean View)

Day 2: Design Your Day Rio de Janeiro.

Witness one of the Seven Wonders of the Modern World, Corcovado's Christ the Redeemer. Gaze skywards at the sandstone figure towering 38 metres high, with arms pointing north and south, and breathe in sweeping views of the city. Drive via the Maracanã stadium and famous Sambadrome. This afternoon, choose how to continue your city discovery. Step backstage into the captivating world of Rio's Carnival and see the making of the elaborate costumes and imaginative floats, or visit the Botanical Garden, one of the world's most important ecological sanctuaries, at the foot of Corcovado Mountain. Alternatively, head to the bohemian Santa Teresa neighbourhood on Morro do Desterro (Exile Hill) for a taste of Old Rio. Take to the hills in a charming street car, seek out art studios and bars, and stop at the "Little Castle" (B). Belmond Copacabana Palace (Superior Partial Ocean View)

Day 3: Rio de Janeiro. Hover over Sugar Loaf Mountain, Christ the Redeemer and the golden beaches of Ipanema and Copacabana in a helicopter flight over the city (additional charge). Then, navigate the streets by bicycle, taking in the hotspots of Copacabana, Ipanema, Leblon and Rodrigo de Freitas Iagoon. Reward yourself with refreshing exotic fruits from a local street market. Having gazed at Sugar Loaf from Copacabana beach, take a driving tour through local

neighbourhoods to the base of the mountain. Enjoy the cable car ride to the summit for the best sunset views in the city. Enjoy sundowners and watch in awe as the city lights twinkle through the sea mist (B). Belmond Copacabana Palace (Superior Partial Ocean View)

Day 4: Rio de Janeiro – Iguazú Falls. Fly* to Foz do Iguaçu on the Brazilian side of the mighty Iguazú Falls. Drop your bags at the only hotel located within Brazili's Iguassu National Park, Belmond Hotel das Cataratas, just a short stroll from one of the New Seven Wonders of the World. Descend into the canyon and drink in the vista of some 275 falls, before taking a glass elevator back to the top. This evening, relax and witness rainbows of colour on this incredible force of nature (B,L). Belmond Hotel das Cataratas (Deluxe Garden)

Day 5: Iguazú Falls. No visit to the Iguazú Falls is complete without experiencing them from the Argentinian perspective, as today's tour will prove. Cross the bridge to Argentina and wander along the network of pathways around the endless sheath of water. Venture by train to the suspended platform at the very brink of the roaring 'Garganta del Diablo' waterfall (Devil's Throat). Take a helicopter flight (additional charge) over the Iguazú National Park for an unrivalled view of the waterfalls, Três Fronteiras (the meeting point of Argentina, Brazil and Paraguay) and the Itaipú Dam and reservoir. Head to the Bird Park, an internationally recognised rescue and conservation centre for birds for an exclusive behind-the scenes experience where you get up close to rare birdlife. (B,L). Belmond Hotel das Cataratas (Deluxe Garden).



Day 6: Iguazú Falls - Brasilia. Fly* to Brasilia, an architectural masterpiece in the middle of the Brazilian savanna. Lose yourself in this beguiling city, which was designed specially to replace Rio de Janeiro as Brazil's capital. Classified as a UNESCO World Heritage site, Brasilia is a definitive example of 20th century modernist urbanism. On your city tour, explore the genius of city architect Oscar Niemeyer - the sweeping plazas, imposing white concrete monuments and his masterpiece, Catedral Metropolitana (B,D). Windsor Plaza Brasilia (Superior Executive)

Day 7: Brasilia - Salvador. Spend a culture-filled morning in Brasilia and learn more about this power centre and architectural showpiece. Later, take your flight* to Salvador, once the magnificent capital of Portugal's New World colony and today the country's Afro-Brazilian jewel. Spend your first evening immersed in the Bahian heritage at the intimate Miguel Santana Theatre. In an explosion of drums and energy, the world-renowned Bahia Folklore Company will enact the dances of the gods in the Candomblé pantheon and the rhythmic martial art, the capoeira. End with a feast of the foods of African gods (B,D). La Villa Bahia (Standard)

Day 8: Salvador. To peel back the layers of this Brazilian enigma, start in Pelourinho, a UNESCO World Heritage site and the largest complex of colonial architecture in South America. Wander the cobbled, hilly streets and stop awhile in the municipal square to soak up the city vibe. Take the Elevador Lacerda, a concrete-encased elevator, down to the lower, more modern Salvador where the air is filled with the aroma of acarajé, an African-inspired street food of sizzling shrimp-filled dumplings. Learn to

drink like a local with a curated tasting of cachaça, the Brazilian sugar cane liquor (B,L). La Villa Bahia (Standard)

Day 9: Salvador. Spend a whole morning soaking up the local culture in São Joaquim market, the largest market in Salvador. Wander the labyrinth of passageways filled with everything from fresh meat and fish to shoes and statues. Look out for cilantro, limes, garlic, coconut milk and dendê palm oil - all the ingredients for Bahia's best-known dish, moqueca. Then, head to a local restaurant to sample this rich stew of fish and prawns. Fuelled by Bahian inspiration, find your rhythm in an intriguing percussion demonstration and workshop. Pick up the cuica or berimbau drums and follow the local percussionist through a cacophony of beats and techniques (B,L). La Villa Bahia (Standard)

Day 10: Depart Salvador. Take a final stroll around this enchanting destination before your transfer to the airport (B).

ARGENTINA | 12 Days | Buenos Aires - Cafayate - Salta - Iguazú Falls - Iberá



Embark on a pilgrimage from the Argentinian capital north. Discover how sultry Buenos Aires has been igniting passions since South America's colonial days. Venture into a surreal world of gauchos, mineral-coloured hills, dramatic gorges and impossibly good wine in the Calchaquí Valley. And let the wilderness circus of the Iberá wetlands entertain you day and night.

- Seek out dreamy old cafes, lively steakhouses and chic boutiques in Buenos Aires's Palermo Soho
- Sip world-class wines in the rugged Calchaguí Valley

Day 1: Arrive Buenos Aires. Welcome to the Paris of the South where your base is the superb Hotel Legado Mitico, situated in the heart of trendy Palermo Soho. Step out onto the cobblestone streets for your first taste of the capital. *Legado Mitico Buenos Aires (Classic)*

Day 2: Design Your Day Buenos Aires. Spend your morning discovering the many sides to this passion-filled city. Start in the high-class hustle of Recoleta where mansions take you back in time to a grander Argentina. Visit the vast, surprisingly romantic Recoleta Cemetery and find the tomb of Argentina's first lady, Eva Peron. Then, step inside the dazzling opulence of the Teatro Colon opera house to discover a seven-storey labyrinth of stages. chandelier-lit hallways and dressing rooms. The afternoon is yours to design - choose from a bike tour of city highlights, a discovery of vibrant street art, or or uncover some of the most recognisable landmarks in the "Paris of the South". 





Then, drive south to Cotopaxi for your unforgettable stay at Hacienda San Agustin del Callo, built on a 600-year-old Incan ruin, on the high plains below the snowcapped volcano. Take a stroll around the Laguna Limpiopungo, visit the Salitre pre-Inca ruins or simply bask in the splendour of the perfectly cone-shaped Cotopaxi (B,L,D). Hacienda San Agustin del Callo (Standard)

Day 4: Antigua - Lake Atitlán. Journey through rolling farmland and villages to the highland town of Chichicastenango. Follow the chaos of vibrant, almost endless stalls running from the central square, up through the

stairs of the Santo Tomás Church, and beyond. From the rich textures of native textiles to smells of traditional incense, this market promises a feast for the senses. Later, visit the surprisingly colourful cemetery, where a local shaman will perform a Maya ceremony for you. Sample local delicacies over lunch before continuing onwards to Lake Atitlán, Guatemala's geological show-stopper (B,L). Casa Palopó (Deluxe)

Day 5: Lake Atitlán. Cruise across the crystal-clear lake to the shore-side village of San Juan La Laguna. Meander through this petite Tz'utujil Maya town to admire impressive murals, galleries and artisan shops. Step inside a local artist's studio to spark your creativity with naïf paintings. Then, try your hand at weaving richly coloured textiles in a workshop led by a women's cooperative (B,L). Casa Palopó

Day 6: Lake Atitlán - Guatemala City. Lose yourself in the magic of Lake Atitlán during your morning at leisure before your journey continues to Guatemala City. With a free evening to explore, venture into the city's bohemian hub of Cuatro Grados Norte for surprising street art, artisan cooperatives and chef-owned restaurants (B). Westin Camino Real (Standard Deluxe)

Day 7: Guatemala City - Copán, Honduras. Journey to the Honduras border and on to Copán, home to one of the ancient Maya's most lavish cultural centres and now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Your lovingly restored Spanish colonial hacienda is perched on the hillside overlooking the picturesque Copán Valley and temple tops of the ancient site itself (B). Hacienda San Lucas (Standard)



Day 8: Copán. Breathe life into this ancient city as you explore with an archaeologist. Unravel the mysteries behind the intricately carved pillars, marvel at the large ball court, and venture into the two excavated tunnels under the ruins. Later, continue your archaeology tour to Las Sepulturas, once a residential area for Copán's nobility, and Rastrojón, an ancient Maya defensive fort only recently opened to the public. Learn about the discoveries of a six-year excavation led by Harvard University and the Honduran Institute of Anthropology and History (B,L). Hacienda San Lucas (Standard)

Day 9: Copán. Travel into the Copán Valley and spend the day in the warm hospitality of the Castejón family at Finca El Cisne. Together with your host, Carlos, take an easy horse ride through the forests and fields, and learn the secrets of coffee, cardamom and cacao farming. Gather around the family table for a hearty farmhouse lunch, prepared by Carlos' mother from home-grown produce. Before you return to Copán, take a soothing dip in steaming thermal pools hidden in the forest (B,L). Hacienda San Lucas (Standard)

Day 10: Copán - Livingston, Guatemala. Cross back into Guatemala and spend your morning decoding beautifully engraved monuments at Quiriguá, one of the wonders of the Mayan world. Travel onwards to Puerto Barrios to board your boat to Livingston, a wonderfully strange and captivating fishing enclave at the mouth of the Río Dulce. Relax into the Caribbean-infused pace of life of the Garífuna people, descendants of shipwrecked African slaves. Move to the hypnotic beat of bongo drums, conch shell horns, turtle shell drums and maracas that echo from street corners. And taste a whole other side to Guatemala, starting with the remarkable coconut seafood soup, tapado (B,L,D). Villa Caribe (Junior Suite)

Day 11: Livingston - El Remate. Journey to Rio Dulce and cruise along mesmerising blue-green waterways past coastlines lined with pines, Casa Maria trees and mangroves. Stop at the Maya village of Ak-Tenamit and meet the locals. Venture further into the jungles of El Peten where the awe-inspiring pyramids of Tikal's ruined temple complex rise through the rainforest. Walk in the footsteps of royalty in the majestic Great Plaza and Temple of the Jaguar, as howler and spider monkeys look on from the dense jungle. Your sunset picnic at Temple IV is one of those never-to-be-forgotten moments (B,L,D). La Lancha (Rainforest Junior Suite)

Day 13: El Remate - Guatemala City. Transfer to Flores for your flight to Guatemala City and onward arrangements (B).

1. Definitions

- "A&K" means Abercrombie & Kent (Australia) Pty Ltd ACN 005 422 999
- "ACL" means the Australian Consumer Law Schedule to the Competition and Consumer Act
- "Conditions" means these Terms and Conditions.
- "Contract" means any agreement for the provision of Travel Arrangements or Services by A&K to the Customer;
- "Customer" means a person, jointly or severally if more than one, acquiring Travel Arrangements and Services from A&K. "Departure Date" means the date scheduled for the Customer to depart at the start of the Travel Arrangements.
- "GST" has the definition given in A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999 ("Act") or any amending legislation, and includes any similar value-added or consumption tax.
- "Material Alteration" means a material change to the Travel Arrangements as determined at A&K's sole discretion. "Products" means individual components of Travel Arrangements, such as accommodation, meals, transport, cruises and tours.
- "Services" means the booking and payment services provided by A&K in relation to Travel Arrangements.
- "Suppliers" means the third parties that are responsible for providing the individual Products.
- "Tax Invoice" means a tax invoice which complies with the definition contained in section 29 - 70 of the Act or any amending legislation.
- "Travel Arrangements" means the travel arrangements made by A&K including all Products.

2. Basis of Contract

- 2.1 The Conditions apply exclusively to every contract for Services by A&K to the Customer and cannot be varied or supplanted by any other condition unless expressly accepted in writing by A&K.
- 2.2 Acceptance: Payment of a deposit indicates the Customer's acceptance of the Conditions.
- 2.3 Different Products may have specific terms and conditions, deposit requirements and cancellation charges applicable to the Product. These will be communicated during the quoting and booking process.

3. Booking Your Holiday

- 3.1 Quotes will be provided in relation to a price for the Travel Arrangements. The quote is valid for a period of $7\,\mathrm{days}$. 3.2 Deposit - a deposit of 25% of the total booking cost or \$1,000 per person (whichever is the higher amount) and full names of all Customers as per passport are required to secure the booking. There may be an additional deposit depending on the policies of the Supplier of Products being booked. Any additional deposits will be advised at time of booking. 3.3 Booking requests within 90 days before the Departure Date must be accompanied by full payment and may be
- subject to an urgent processing fee. 3.4 A minimum stay of 3 nights is required for all bookings.

4. Price Policy

4.1 Prices are valid for travel arrangements made and travelling in the period until 31 March 2019. All prices are per person in Australian Dollars unless otherwise specified. Private Travel 'from' prices shown are indicative only. Prices do vary across date ranges, are subject to availability and to change due to factors including currency exchange rate fluctuations, fuel levies, tax changes or any other changes in connection with the Travel Arrangements. Please contact A&K for best available price for your preferred travel dates. Prices are

- subject to the quote provided.
- 4.2 Travel Arrangement prices are quoted for the entire package and itemised component costs cannot be given. 4.3 Travel Arrangements - prices may be based on Products being booked for all Customers in the Booking, and accordingly Customers must travel together throughout the Travel Arrangements, unless variations are explicitly agreed 4.4 Surcharges - the price of the Travel Arrangements is subject to the possibility of surcharges. Surcharges may be incurred (without limitation) in connection with: currency exchange rates, increases in Product prices, fuel levies, scheduled airfares, hotel, cruise and ground transportation charges, game park entrance fees and any other increases in connection with the Travel Arrangement.
- 4.5 Where there is any change in the costs incurred by A&K in providing the Services, A&K may vary its price to account for such change by notifying the Customer, whether or not the Customer has made full payment.
- 4.6 Changes in the Australian Dollar the financial commitments A&K undertakes in order to offer the prices mean that prices cannot be reduced or refunded if the Australian dollar strengthens.
- 4.7 Products not Utilised no refunds are made in respect of Products not utilised, for example, flights, accommodation, meals and sightseeing excursions.
- 4.8 Goods and Services Not Included the following are excluded from the Travel Arrangements price: International Airfares, arrival and/or departure taxes, fuel levies and surcharges, passport and visa costs, travel insurance, personal expenditure including drinks, laundry, room services, meals and gratuities, unless expressly included
- 4.9 Prices quoted include GST. Prices for the supply of the Travel Arrangements and the Services exclude any other taxes, duties or imposts imposed on or in relation to the Travel Arrangements and the Services in Australia or overseas. The Customer is liable to pay any amount of GST imposed on any Product.

- 5.1 Final Payment unless otherwise agreed in writing the final payment must be received by A&K $90\,\mathrm{days}$ prior to the Departure Date
- 5.2 Where bookings are made less than 90 days before the Departure Date, full payment must be made at the time of the booking.
- 5.3 If you pay A&K by credit card a surcharge will be added to the total price. The current surcharge for all credit cards is 1.5% of the total price

6. Amendments

- 6.1 A&K reserves the right to modify program itineraries, including arranged sightseeing, and substitute accommodations, including vessels and trains, at any time due to unforeseen circumstances or circumstances beyond A&K's control. Every effort will be made to operate itineraries as planned, but alterations may occur after the final itinerary has been issued.
- 6.2 A&K will endeavour to assist if the Customer requests an amendment to the Travel Arrangement booking up to 90 days prior to the Departure Date subject to the following;
- a) Amendment Charge fees apply to any Customer requesting a change to a confirmed booking.
- b) Additional Charges all other expenses incurred by A&Kmay also be payable by the Customer at A&K's discretion.
- c) Any charges arising from a request for an amendment are payable by the Customer whether or not A&K is successful in confirming the requested amendment.
- d) Late Amendments amendments made by the Customer within 90 days of the Departure Date are treated as

cancellations and re-bookings. Cancellation charges apply as detailed below.

7. Cancellations By The Customer

7.1 The Customer must give A&K notice if it intends to cancel any Travel Arrangements.

7.2 Charges - the following charges, exclude international airfares, are payable by the Customer in accordance with the number of days prior to the Departure Date following notice being received by A&K of cancellation:

Days prior to Departure Date	Percentage of Travel Arrangements Price Payable
91 days or more	\$1,000 per person
90 - 46 days prior	50% cancellation fee
45 - O days prior	100% cancellation fee

7.3 Additional Charges - the Customer may incur further cancellation charges from some Suppliers, including international flight providers and local agents.

$8. Cancellations \, and \, Material \, Alteration \, by \, A\&K$

8.1 A&K may treat a booking as cancelled and levy cancellation charges if the Customer does not pay the balance of the Travel Arrangements price at 90 days prior to the Departure Date. 8.2 Force Majeure - A&K may, at its sole option, where circumstances outside of its control affect the provision of Travel Arrangements (such as flood, fire, act of God, war or threat of war, physical unrest, riots, civil disturbances, terrorist activities (threatened or actual), strikes, port or airport closure, technical problems with transport, alteration or cancellation of scheduled travel services) cancel scheduled Travel Arrangements at any time at A&K's sole and absolute discretion:

- a) offer the Customer alternative Travel Arrangements or Products of comparable standard as may be appropriate in the circumstances; or
- b) if alternative Travel Arrangements or Products are not offered by A&K, A&K will make a prompt proportional (taking into account the extent of the Travel Arrangements that have been provided or arranged) refund of monies paid by the Customer. 8.3 A&K may charge a reasonable fee to cover the administration costs associated with providing alternative Travel Arrangements or Products.
- 8.4 A&K reserves the right to modify program itineraries, including arranged sightseeing, and substitute accommodations, including vessels and trains, at any time due to unforeseen circumstances of circumstances beyond A&K's control. Every effort will be made to operate itineraries as planned, but alterations may occur after the final documents have been provided to the Customer
- 8.5 Material Alteration if a Material Alteration becomes necessary within 90 days of the Departure Date for any reason other than the circumstances described in clause 8.2 A&K will endeavour to offer comparable Products or a full refund of all monies paid by the Customer.

9. Obligations and Liability

- 9.1 Booking Agent A&K acts as a booking agent for the Suppliers of Products and accepts no liability for any injury, loss, damage, accident, delay or irregularity that may arise to any Customer or third party resulting from the Customer's or third party's use of the Products, unless recoverable from A&K on the failure of a statutory guarantee under the ACL. A&K makes reasonable enquiries to determine that Suppliers provide appropriate Products, but A&K is not responsible for the Products or their standard
- 9.2 Except as the Conditions specifically state, the Agreement

does not include by implication any other term, condition or warranty in respect of the quality, merchantability, acceptability, fitness for purpose, condition, description, specification or performance of the Travel Arrangements or Services or any contractual remedy for their failure.

9.3 Nothing in these Terms restricts, limits or modifies the Customer's rights or remedies as a consumer against A&K for failure of a statutory guarantee under the ACL.

9.4 Loss - A&K is not liable for and accepts no responsibility for any direct or indirect loss, financial loss, consequential loss, loss of enjoyment, pain and suffering, damage, injury, accident delay or irregularity occasioned to the Customer, other than if the Customer is a consumer, then to the extent the loss was reasonably foreseeable.

9.5 Nothing in the Conditions is to be interpreted as excluding, restricting or modifying the application of any relevant State or Federal legislation which cannot be excluded, restricted or modified

9.6 Visa Requirements - it is the Customer's responsibility to ensure that it has valid passports, visas and permits which meet the immigration and governmental requirements of the country

9.7 The Customer agrees and acknowledges that A&K will not be liable for any loss or damage incurred by the Customer due to the Customer's failure to obtain any valid passports, visas, permits or any other governmental requirements of the countries of transit or travel.

9.8 Medical Conditions - the Customer must notify A&K of any pre-existing medical conditions that might reasonably be expected to affect the Travel Arrangements. The Customer agrees and acknowledges that A&K will not be liable for any loss or damage incurred by the Customer as a result of any pre-existing medical condition or health issue of the Customer that may preclude, delay, affect or interfere with the Travel

9.9 Health Issues - It is the Customer's sole responsibility to a) obtain any vaccinations or take any other health precautions applicable to the country of travel;

b) take all steps reasonably necessary (including, without limitation, the consultation of appropriate medical professionals) to identify whether they have any pre-existing medical conditions or health issues (whether known or unknown) that may preclude, delay. affect or interfere with the Travel Arrangements; and c) notify A&K if the Customer has any pre-existing medical conditions or health issues that may preclude, delay, affect or interfere with the Travel Arrangements.

9.10 A&K strongly recommends that the Customer insure themselves against loss of deposit, cancellation charges, medical expenses and loss of personal possessions, and any other foreseeable loss or expense.

9.11 The Customer acknowledges and accepts that different places, countries, facilities and tour operators may have lower standards of safety, labeling, warnings and precautions. The Customer is responsible for maintaining personal diligence and safety notwithstanding the level of standards. A&K is not liable for any loss, damage, injury or death that could be avoided if the Australian standards were to apply.

10. Notice

10.1 A notice by the Customer must be in writing, and may be delivered by hand, sent by prepaid mail, sent by facsimile or sent by electronic means such as e-mail to the address or number specified.

- 10.2 A notice is treated as given to A&K, when:
- a) if hand delivered, when delivered;
- b) if sent by prepaid mail, when received or within 48 hours after posting, whichever is the sooner:
- c) if sent by email or facsimile, on confirmation of successful transmission

11. Governing Law

11.1 These Conditions are governed by and are to be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Victoria and Australia. 11.2 Each party irrevocably and unconditionally submits to the exclusive jurisdiction of the Courts and Tribunal of Victoria and Courts entitled to hear appeals from those Courts and Tribunals.

12. Privacy Information

12.1 Any personal information that A&K obtains from the Customer, or about the Customer from its representative, is necessary for A&K's business purposes or providing the Customer with A&K's Travel Arrangements, Products and Services, and may be used in answering any queries the Customer may have, considering the Customer's application for credit or to become a Customer, performing internal administration and operations, developing, improving and marketing A&K's products and services, and related purposes. 12.2 A&K's Privacy Policy details why A&K collects this personal information, who A&K may disclose it to (including whether A&K is likely to disclose it to overseas recipients), and the main consequences (if any) if A&K does not collect the personal information of the Customer. A&K's Privacy Policy also contains information about how the Customer may seek access to, or correction of, the personal information held about the Customer, and A&K's complaint resolution procedures. 12.3 A&K will not disclose any personal information to any other party without the consent of the Customer except to the Suppliers, a related entity or adviser of A&K or where A&K is otherwise required by law to do so.

13. Consent for cross-border disclosures

13.1 By making a booking, the Customer acknowledges and consents that A&K will not, as would otherwise be required, be obliged to take steps to ensure that an overseas recipient of Customer Information complies with the APPs.

14 Miscellaneous

14.1 A&K's failure to enforce any of these Conditions shall not be construed as a waiver of any of the A&K's rights. 14.2 If any Condition is unenforceable it shall be read down to be enforceable or, if it cannot be read down, the condition shall be severed from the Conditions without affecting the enforceability of the remaining conditions.

14.3 A&K reserves the right to correct any errors or omission in its published materials and to amend these Terms and Conditions at any time as a result of any material change to legislation or regulations. Amended Terms and Conditions shall automatically be effective upon being posted by A&K to the website www.abercrombiekent.com.au

15. Photography During Travel

15.1 A&K reserves the right to take photographs or video during the operation of any program or part thereof and to use them for promotional purposes during the program and thereafter. 15.2 By booking a program with A&K, guests agree to allow their images to be used in such photographs. 15.3 Guests who prefer that their images not be used are asked to identify themselves to a A&K representative at the beginning
