

Top Social Media Report


Over the last month, our followers were mostly interested in posts about job opportunities, TreePhilly Yard Tree Giveaways, maple sugar days, the Citywide Tumbling Championship, the new Soccer for Success program, a *New York Times* article featuring Commissioner Ott Lovell, and Environmental Education Planner Tony Croasdale's guide to finding foxes in Philly's park system. As usual, our <u>Facebook</u> followers gravitated toward posts about job openings. In the beginning of March, we announced five openings, including lifeguards, park rangers, teaching artists, Philly Pumptrack SMAs and a Get Healthy/PPR project coordinator.

The post reached almost 12,000 people and was shared 117 times. Additionally, 767 people clicked on the post to learn more about the jobs.

In late February, TreePhilly announced the opening of registration for its much-awaited Spring Yard Tree Giveaways, gaining a lot of engagement from <u>Twitter</u> followers. Each spring and fall, TreePhilly hosts this giveaway program, which provides free trees for Philadelphians to plant on private property. The giveaway events occur at various locations throughout the city. After registering for a free yard tree, recipients choose their preferred pickup location and tree species.

Local celebs Preston & Steve (of WMMR) and Zach Miller (of Dr. Dog) joined PPR, TreePhilly, Fairmount Park Conservancy and TD Bank to make the big announcement in Rittenhouse Square.

This tweet gained 11,500 impressions and engaged 257 people, making it the highest performing tweet since July 2016.
