



## Mission Focus:

Each month we highlight a ministry that First Pres supports.  
This month we are focusing on the Medical Benevolence Foundation.



### A New Approach to Medical Mission

The first responders to many remote villages after the 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck Haiti in 2021, were team members from MBF's partners in Haiti: Hospital Ste-Croix Mission Hospital and FSIL Mission Nursing School. These teams were on their way, loaded with supplies and crossing high waters, long before international aid could arrive. Offering immediate care and aftercare at the hospital, even for those who could not pay, the teams made a tangible difference for thousands of people. This is a story of courage and hope and healing. It is also a story that showcases how the MBF approach to medical mission is paying dividends for the residents of developing countries.

This approach centers on developing dependable, locally-owned sources of quality medical care by working with medical ministries of churches in lower-income countries. Why? First, because the medical care needs in countries like Kenya, Haiti, DR Congo, and Malawi are immediate and immense. In the 15 seconds you will spend reading this paragraph, another 650 people there will die, mostly from preventable causes. Second, because existing church-owned ministries already deliver up to 60% of the medical care in their countries, but often have no clear course charted for how to continue to meet evolving medical needs, and do so sustainably. MBF currently partners with faith-based medical ministries in Africa, the Caribbean, and the Middle East, including nearly 100 hospitals, nursing schools and clinics.

**Working with these existing ministries, MBF provides partnership, resources and expertise to:**

- Expand medical services and improve quality of medical care.
- Continue to be a light of hope by sharing the Gospel of Christ through spiritual ministry and charity care.
- Become economically sustainable in order to dependably offer both healing and hope for generations to come.



The Medical Benevolence Foundation takes a unique approach to medical mission. The approach provides a foundation for sustainable medical benevolence to be offered by the medical ministries of local churches in developing countries.

Every year our budget includes money to cover our congregation's share of the administrative costs of being a part of the Presbyterian Church (USA). An individual congregant's share is calculated on its total membership. This is called "Per Capita." This year the per capita is \$37.18 per member or \$74.36 per couple. There is a blue Per Capita offering envelope located in your box of offering envelopes. The Per Capita assessment covers overhead cost of our Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly. # PNC Update

---

At the February 26<sup>th</sup> Congregational Meeting, Chuck Hampton provided an update on the progress of the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). Chuck indicated that the committee feels that God has already chosen the new pastor for us, and the PNC is working to discern God's will. We have received 44 Personal Information Forms (applications). We have reviewed each of them individually, and as a group, in order to decide which candidates we feel are worthy of interviewing. We have interviewed them, checked references, and we have decided which candidates to refer to our Presbytery of San Fernando. The Presbytery conducts background checks and interviews the candidates regarding their statement of faith. Once our candidates have passed those steps, the Presbytery will arrange for the candidates to preach at neutral pulpits (outside First Pres Granada Hills). Although the PNC has viewed many virtual sermons, the neutral pulpit will provide an in-person experience. Unfortunately, churches are unwilling to give up their pulpits during the Lenten Season, so the process will be delayed until after Easter. The PNC will choose the final candidate who will preach at First Pres before a vote is taken by the congregation. The congregation will make the final decision about calling the new pastor.

Continue to keep the PNC in your prayers.


