You can choose from a business center, quiet room, simulation room (for those who've never flown or are anxious), pet relief area, and children's play area. And there are sooooo many restrooms (with doors that swing out so you don't wrestle with your luggage), changing rooms, family restrooms, and water bottle filling stations. The variety of local restaurants onsite will have you contemplating early arrival.

Then there's the art – carefully curated to celebrate local and national artists from the moment you drive up until you step onto the jetway. There's so much to experience – think the opposite of old KCI.
