



#### Council highlights ~ May 16, 2023 mtg in person!

◆ Pastor's Report: Pastor Utecht will be on vacation June 26 through

July 11. He reported the average attendance over the past five weeks — 62 on Sundays and 13 on Saturdays. He's working with Mike on a 2-3 minute video on the importance of worship & attending worship services. The Elders will distribute the video to their people.

Church

- ♦ Vice President & Elder's Report: Dick Robertson met with Rhonda, Mike and Cyrus on the remaining Fellowship of Care funds which they decided to be used for a marketing campaign. SOLC is also involved with an advertising campaign that is targeting 24 Hour Fitness members in the Sherman Oaks Galleria. Ads will be presented for both church and school. Dick attended the LAPD Active Shooter event and will train our ushers. Elders continue to make efforts to *call / email / text past* and *present* congregants to encourage them to come back to church. "We miss you!"
- ◆ Treasurer & Financial Secretary Reports: Leslie O'Byrne and Heather Wolter discussed the financial reports. Next month a liability insurance premium of \$14,000 is due. We anticipate it will create a \$8,000 deficit in June.

Heather mentioned that each committee chair is responsible for keeping track of their spending. If we go over budget, that money comes out of savings, of which we only have 4 years of savings left. Anyone who buys anything to be reimbursed must fill out the proper forms and submit to Liz. (Forms are in the church office.) Non cash donations, non reimbursed receipts are also requested for record keeping purposes and will be included in your giving statements. The Above and Beyond total is \$9,126, which will be matched at the close of the funding.

◆ Mary & Martha Report: Dorene Rubin reported that Sat., June 10 will be the next Women's Bible Study. They will be off for the months of July and August. Fundraising schedule is November 5 for the Potato Bake and February 11 for the Cookie Walk.

They dispersed \$400 equally to Children's Hope Chest, Elizabeth House, Open Arms Pregnancy Clinic, and the Above and Beyond campaign.

◆ Trustee Report: Larry Hanna reported the Fellowship Hall AC and heating has been fixed for \$5,500. Next projects include trimming the parsonage trees and shrubs and painting an upstairs classroom.

- ◆ School Board Report: Dorene Rubin reported the summer registration is 68 out of our approved number of 78. The employee handbook is being updated. The school board paid 50% of the AC repair cost. The school will have a new logo soon (see page 2). Dick is exploring how to get the preschool to pop up consistently in Google searches. Most of our students are finding out about our preschool through word of mouth. The School is marketing more towards the brand of *preschool* over *children's center*, since people know what a preschool is.
- ◆ Outreach Committee Report: Rhonda Renneker reported all Outreach Committee members have agreed to continue and serve. Lorraine Salcedo is joining the Committee. The mission of the Committee was discussed. Increasing church and school attendance is one goal, but the great commission of telling people about Jesus can't always be measured in numbers. We are looking to create a **slogan** for the new advertising campaign that will run at 24 Hour Fitness beginning June 26. Suggestions are welcome!
- ◆ Christian Education Report: Chris Gordon reported there is still work to be done to align the Christian Ed roles and responsibilities with the constitution. There is a separate Sunday School Superintendent who oversees just the Sunday School teachers. In order to continue to build connections with SOLCC, Christian Ed members will attend the preschool graduation June 13. Chris and Jeff are looking for others to help them in planning for VBS with help from Trinity Lutheran of Simi Valley (see page 4). A budget line item for the FEET program was requested.
- ◆ President's Report: David Seaver reported the Church directory still needs folks to send in their pictures.

Memorial Plaques: David said some changes need to be made before plaques can be hung.

**Nominating Committee** is still working on the slate.




2023-24 Fiscal Year Budget was presented to the Council. We are on an honor system to not overspend. Income funds did not allow for any pay raises for church staff in the new fiscal year. The budget was passed by Council to be presented at the congregation meeting after worship, Sunday, June 11.

#### A Message from Pastor...

In the first of the 95 Theses, Luther said "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, "Repent," he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance." However, after some experience in this matter I have found that it is far easier and more comfortable to live "a life of pretendance" instead. After all, repentance means taking a deep and honest look at my life. opening myself up to the possibility that I am really the one to blame for my problems, and openly facing the reality that I have fallen far short of the calling God has for me. That's hard.

A life of pretendance is so much easier! Whereas a life of repentance is all about taking a close and honest look at sin, a life of pretendance is all about pretending that the problems aren't my fault. I pretend that all of my decisions and actions and thoughts are quite good and reasonable. I can pretend that I am basically a good person. (I don't need to pretend that I'm perfect, just that I'm overall a pretty good person.)

Our human nature by default sets us strongly toward living a life of pretendance, and many follow it. Broad is the path that leads to destruction. It is so easy to go through life quietly excusing and justifying myself the whole way. Even for Christians, one can easily go through life without taking time to honestly repent. I know from my own experience how easy it is to even show up to church, go through the motions for confession and absolution without ever coming close to rending my heart or examining my own sin. Unlike a life of repentance, a life of pretendance takes no effort.

Yet here I find one of the liturgies we often use in confession and absolution to be guite striking. Citing 1 John 1:8, we are reminded: "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us." That is, if we ignore the reality of sin and live by self-justification, we are truly living a life of pretendance. It is all pretend, and there is no reality to it, because the truth is that we have all sinned in many grievous ways and are in desperate need of God's mercy. Thus our Lord calls us to "repent."

With that in mind, I urge you to consider carefully and honestly: Do you live more of a life of pretendance or a life of repentance? I myself am rather convicted by this question. I'd like to pretend that as a pastor I am disciplined in examining my life, realizing my faults, and confessing my sins to God, but the truth is I am far too infrequent in my own repentance. So I find that I must even repent over my lack of repentance!

Yet God is faithful and forgiving. Even our sin of failing to repent, he forgives. Our salvation is not dependent upon our ability to repent heartily or frequently enough. It depends solely on God's grace. Yet as we grow into a life of repentance, we come to learn just how gracious our God is, we grow in our relationship to him, and we are able to put away many of the sins which we would have simply ignored in a life of pretendance. So I encourage you this day and always to truly live a life of repentance. Humble yourself before the Lord, confess your sins, and receive his forgiveness.

P.S. One great place to grow in a life of repentance is every weekend in the divine service! Cultivate a habit of not just saying the words during confession and absolution, but truly repenting in your heart.
