

Lentswe, Klerksdorp - The Phelophepha HealthCare Train steamed into Klerksdorp last week and with it, Health Minister Dr Zweli Mkhize launched the national Cancer Campaign in the city this week.

Minister Mkhize was accompanied by the North West Health MEC Madoda Sambatha on Tuesday 6 October at the train in Klerksdorp Railway Station.

At the train, patients were screened and tested for health issues. Cynthia Chishimba of Phelophepa said the theme this year is "Give Hope. Save Lives". Pink ribbons to create awareness for breast cancer were distributed.

Chisimba said they offer clinical breast examinations and show how to do self-breast examinations, "We also do testicular self-examinations to reduce the risk of testicular cancer, pros-

tate Specific Antigen with a full blood test to help detect prostate abnormalities. Pap smears, screening test for early detection and diagnosis of cervical cancer," she added.

Minister Mkhize said he's pleased that he was requested to focus on breast cancer awareness month after Covid-19 changed his original plan of visiting the train early in March.

"As a nation we have done extremely well in the fight against the Covid-19 surge and, if we continue to stay vigilant and adhere to non-pharmaceutical interventions we can, through our actions, mitigate a potentially devastating second wave.

"In the past few weeks we have observed a rise in numbers and it's important to say that our behaviour is what will turn the tide. But now we need to turn our attention back towards the implementation of the National Health Insurance by building on the gains we have made as we implemented our strategies for COVID-19," he added.

Millions can be lost

Lentswe, Klerksdorp - The postponement of last week's council meeting could mean that Matlosana Municipality stands a chance to lose a R71 million government grant.

Matlosana Municipality's first council meeting in chambers since the start of lockdown was disrupted on Wednesday 30 September by members of the public who stormed in the council chamber and caused chaos leading to the meeting being postponed.

On Friday 2 October, security at the meeting was so tight, whereby the public and the media were not allowed inside as the gates were also locked.

A high number of police and municipal security monitored the situation outside the building, while at the main entrance, the municipal traffic officers and the private security did not allow anyone inside. Most of the municipal officers knocked off early around 13:00 as the meeting started at 14:00.

Speaking to DA Caucus Leader, Cllr Elmarie Postma and EFF Regional Secretary Cllr Buti Shuping after the meeting, they confirmed that the council meeting took place and that the Special adjustment budget and R71 million grant from the Provincial Government were on the agenda. "The provincial government placed special conditions that needed to be adopted by Matlosana to receive the R71 million. Amongst this was that there must be compliance to stringent cost-containment measures, payment arrangements with creditors such as Eskom and Midvaal and that there must be a revision

of the municipality to ensure it adopts a funded budget," Cllr Postma said.

Postma said the provincial government also stipulated that this budget must be adopted by 30 September. "When the item of the budget came, the ANC decided that they would not discuss that, but postpone it to the next council meeting. Their reason for this was that they needed time to study through the document.

"The DA objects to this delay tactic by the ANC to adopt the R71 million grant. The ANC is merely stalling until a new leadership comes into effect. The provincial government clearly stipulated that this budget must be adopted by 30 September and these delaying tactics by the ANC risk making Matlosana lose the grant money which it needs to improve service delivery," she added. Postma believes that the ANC is playing political games and risking a delay in bringing service delivery to the people of Matlosana.

Speaking to Washington Ntozini who said he is still Speaker during council meetings even though the provincial executive committee of the ANC recalled him last month, said: "The reason why we decided to postpone the meeting was because of the people who stormed inside the chamber, so we had to stop."

Asking him about any challenges of these postponements he said: "Normally, municipalities have to adopt on 30 September, but if you fail with reason, you then report to the provincial government.

"On Friday 2 October, we postponed because we were not aware that the Executive Mayor Maetu Kgaile was not present as she was sick, so we'll sit again this Friday (9 October)."

Deputy Principal now healed

Lentswe, Khuma - A veteran teacher passed away after almost three months in hospital.

Thabo Charles Moeti (62) was with the department of Education for at least 36 years as a teacher and was deputy principal at the time of his passing.

His death is mourned by his family, friends and former students

According to his younger brother, Kgala, who is also a school principal, his brother passed away on Friday 2 October.

He said his brother became ill in 2019 and recovered, but got sick again. He was admitted at Life Anncron Hospital in July.

"He started his primary school

education at Khuma Combined School then moved to Matlosana Secondary School. In 1978 he trained at Strydom Training College for Primary Teachers Certificate. He matriculated in 1981 at President Mangope Technical and Commercial High School.

"He completed teaching qualifications like Senior Secondary Teachers' Diploma in 1991 at University of Zululand, Further Diploma in Educational Management in 1998 at Rand Afrikaans University and Bachelor of Education (Hons: Education Management, Law and Systems) at Potchefstroom University for Christian Higher Education," his grieving brother Kgala said.

The family said Bro Charlie as he was affectionately known started working as a planning clerk at Stilfontein Gold Mine from 1982 to 1983.

"From 1984 to 1988 he was a teacher at Borakanelo Junior Secondary, 1988 to 1991 he studied and from 1992 until date, he assumed a teaching position at Borakanelo Secondary School.

"Then from 1997 to 2016 he was appointed as departmental Head of Business and Management Science at the same school.

"In 2017, he was appointed as the Deputy Principal of Borakanelo Secondary School," Kgala added.

Bro Charlie contributed a lot to the community as he was a staunch member of Uniting Reformed Church in Southern Africa (URCSA) Stilfontein congregation and has served in different positions as Deacon, Elder, Cashier and Treasurer.

Kgala said he was also a member of URCSA Christian Men Ministry

and served in different positions both in branch and Presbytery levels.

"He was a member of SADTU and served as its Stilfontein Branch Treasurer, served in SGB of Borakanelo Secondary and Strathvaal Primary school as a treasurer, member and one of the founders of Khuma Men's Burial Society.

"He also served as electoral officer for Independent Electoral commission, so he will be sadly missed as a prolific Accounting teacher," Kgala concluded

Bro Charlie of 2594 Rammekoa Street, AECI Section Khuma was married to Ousi Disebo Sabatian Lebitso on 1 July 2000 and they were blessed with 4 children and 4 grandchildren.

His funeral service will be held at home at Uniting Reformed Church in Khuma on Saturday 10 October from 07:00.

Operation "Tiotia Molao" nets 144

Lentswe, Klerksdorp - Operation "Tlotla Molao" resulted in the arrest of 141 suspects between 30 September and 5 October.

According to Brig Sabata Mokgwabone, police spokesperson, the suspects were apprehended in all four districts in the province and include 20 for contact and property related crimes.

"The other suspects were nabbed for additional offences under crimes dependent on police action such as drug related and driving under the influence of alcohol. Furthermore, 88 individuals were fined

for liquor related contraventions like drinking in public, drunk in public place and illegal dealing in liquor."

The operation also led to issuing of 27 fines for road traffic related offences while liquor, counterfeit cigarettes and drugs were confiscated.

"Members of the public are reminded and urged to comply with the Disaster Management Act, 2002 (Act No. 57 of 2002) Regulations - Alert Level 1, particularly on issues relating to sale and dispensing of liquor, gatherings and mandatory protocols when in in public places," Mokgwabone concluded.

Siblings accused of murder

Lentswe, Potchefstroom - Two brothers and a sister, Meriam Mahlapa (20), Petrus Mahlapa (24) and Andries Mahlapa (28) are detained after they were arrested for the murder of a Potchefstroom man.

The trio who were charged with the murder of a 71-year-old Sias Renier Willemse on Monday 5 October. The case was postponed to 13 October for a formal bail application.

According to the North West police spokesperson Col Adéle Myburgh the siblings were arrested in Ikageng.

"Willemse's body was found on the floor with a bullet wound on his neck, in his house in Bailie Park, Potchefstroom on 22 September.

"It is further alleged that the victim's body was found with ties wrapped around his neck.

"He was declared dead on the scene," she said.


who escaped from Hartbeesfontein police cells are back behind bars.

Doors open again at Legal Aid office

Lentswe, Klerksdorp - Legal Aid South Africa (Legal Aid SA) re-opened its office for walk-in clients this week.

The organisation operated on a minimal staff work plan and appointment basis du-

ring Lockdown Alert Levels 5-2. From Monday 5, the Walk-in Client Programme re-commenced and clients are able to go to their nearest office directly without having to first call the Legal Aid Advice

Line to request an appointment. Operating hours of all offices, as well as the Legal Aid Advice Line, will also be extended from 08:00-16:00 weekdays.

"We remain committed to

taking proactive measures to ensure your safety and wellbeing during these trying times. With the announcement of Alert Level I we slowly in creased the number of staff attending our offices," says Legal Aid SA Communication Executive and National Spokesperson Mfanafuthi Shabangu. The public are advised that they will not be granted access to Legal Aid SA offices without a face mask.

Illegal taxi operators irk taxi industry

Lentswe, Klerksdorp - The North West department of Community Safety and Transport Management believes that given the challenges that had been besieging the taxi industry, the current interactions with the role players could be a solution long yearned for.

The department MEC Sello Lehari completed a whirlwind tour of the province building up to a district makgotla in Klerksdorp on Thursday 1 October accompanied by MEC Saliva Molapisi.

Representing the industry at Dr Kenneth Kaunda District Taxi Lekgotla, the SANTACO Provincial Deputy Chairperson, Mpho Matsemela appealed to government to deal decisively with illegal operations.

"We cannot compete as we operate from designated ranks but these illegal operators, stop anywhere at any time and do as they wish with impunity," he said.

It is said that these discussions launched recently with public discourse seek to ensure that the province contributes to Provincial and National Taxi Lekgotla to be held towards the end of October.

MEC Lehari said its satisfying to see what has been achieved from the three District Makgotla that have been held so far in the Dr Ruth Segomotsi Mompati, Ngaka Modiri Molema and Dr Kenneth Kaunda Districts.

MEC Lehari said it is time that the taxi industry plays a full and active role in the revival of the economy.

"We need all stakeholders' participation to sharpen the taxi industry. There was a time when the industry was regulated and this Lekgotla is a necessary intervention to professionalise the industry which is overdue. The journey will not be easy but we must all play our roles to change the industry," said Lehari.

MEC Lehari reminded the taxi operators that the violence that characterized the industry is delaying them and only unity will lead to tangible changes.

"When two brothers are fighting each other, only strangers will inherit their wealth. The industry which contributes a lot in the economy of the country cannot continue to operate on an informal basis.

"As we embark on this important consultative process, it will equally do justice to all the four thematic areas so that as we consolidate the provincial position, we could come out with clear position to influence the national discourse," said MEC Lehari.

MEC Lehari said the challenges facing this taxi industry cannot be ignored forever.

Acting Head of the department Molefi Morule

said the industry must be formalised because conflict can no longer be tolerated.

"These conflicts are often caused by those who always want to lead but don't want to be led. This Lekgotla should ultimately lead to where the industry could fully play a role in the economic development of the country. What we do here should find expression in where the country needs to go to change the face of the taxi industry", Morule said.

Part of the long term solution to these challenges which these mak-

gotla should provide is the complete overhaul of the industry. This is the view of Ramodise Tsolo from the Transport Education and Training Authority, TETA.

Arson, murder suspects in court

Lentswe, Klerksdorp - Shacks and a house were torched in Jouberton and at Jakaranda a while back and a man died and other were assaulted in gang related violence.

The North West police spokesperson Col Adele Myburgh confirmed cases of attempted murder, arson, assault GBH and murder were registered.

On Thursday 1 October, two suspects appeared in the Klerksdorp Magistrate Court.

Thabo Sethunya (29) and Teko Lebeko (36) are represented by lawyer Khotso Balovi.

During their appearance,

members of the ANC and the EFF were not singing the same tune from their slogans outside the court.

ANC members made it clear that they want bail for the suspects they claim are their members, meanwhile the EFF said no bail for the suspects whom they labelled as 'Alaska' gangsters. Just after the prosecutor Hannelie Oberholzer and lawyer Baloyi explained the course of the delay for bail application, magistrate Zelda Strauss agreed to postpone the matter to Thursday 8 October for formal bail application.

According to the ANC group, the fight started when members of the EFF came to

another ward in Jakaranda to lobby for EFF and their shacks were also burned.

The ANC ones said that's when a revenge came to torch the EFF's shacks and a house.

EFF's Lesole Malefo whose house was burned is asking for justice.

The victim was identified as Dan Phoagae.



Schools reopen later in 2021

AMENDED 2021

Lentswe, Klerksdorp - Basic education minister Angie Motshekga published the updated 2021 calendar for South African public schools.

Schools will reopen later than planned in 2021 due to the coronavirus pandemic, with teachers set to return on 25 January and pupils set to return on 27 January.

"Taking into account the disruptions that have occurred in 2020, we will need to carry over some of the curriculum work into 2021 and we have done our best to accommodate the interests of everybody. But our priority, is the learner," the Minister said.

The later start to the year is partly

due to the later matric examinations which were rescheduled to accommodate the disruptions caused by the pandemic, she said.

"As we had already announced before, the June Senior Certificate examination was postponed, and will now be written together with the National Senior Certificate examination in November 2020," she said.

"The examination timetable for the combined June and November examination had to be amended; so that this examination commences in November, instead of October 2020, as was initially planned."

Motshekga said that the late start of the examination is intended to allow as much time as possible to cover critical curriculum content, and to ensure that all examination processes are appropriately managed.

"The combined examination makes this the largest public examination that has been administered in our country," she said.

"More than 1 million (1,058,699)

candidates, will sit for the examinations; and we certainly have never had to manage a number that large before. It is going to be a huge task, but one that we will need to ensure it is managed and coordinated smoothly."

The writing of the 2020 NSC examination, will commence on 5 November, and conclude on 15 December.

Depression: Get help

Lentswe, Klerksdorp - The world is celebrating World Mental Health Day on 10 October and by helping the community, the Sanpark Alcohol and Drug Rehab Centre is highlighting the strong connection between substance use and mental illness.

Annaleen van Staden, head of therapy, states that depression is a mental illness frequently co-occurring with

"The relationship between the two disorders is bidirectional, meaning that people who abuse substances are more likely to suffer from depression, and vice versa. People who are depressed may drink or abuse drugs to lift their mood or escape from feelings of guilt or despair. But substances like alcohol, which is a depressant, can increase feelings of sadness or fatigue. Conversely, people can experience depression after the effects of drugs wear off or as they struggle to cope with how the addiction has impacted their life," she said.

According to Van Staden, because drug use symptoms can imitate the symptoms of depression, it can be difficult to diagnose depression when a person is actively using. Depression can look different depending on the person experiencing the disorder. Though some may exhibit more recognizable signs like fatigue and low mood, others may appear more irritable or angry. Other signs of depression can include lack of interest in activities, changes in sleep patterns, changes in appetite, feelings of guilt or despair, lack of energy, trouble concentrating and suicidal thoughts.

"Comprehensive treatment is available for both depression and substance use and is usually the best course of action. Antidepressants can do a great deal to reduce depressive symptoms. Research shows that medication

frequently is more effective when an individual seeks counseling and behavioural support as well."

What to expect

Effective treatment programs typically utilize support (often in the form of group counseling), individual counseling, individualized treatment plans, medical assistance, family involvement, and follow up support to prevent relapse.

If you have been diagnosed with depression, talk to your doctor about the risk of substance use. You may want to closely monitor your intake of alcohol and seek alternative coping strategies for stress and low mood.

If you have an active substance use disorder or a history of substance abuse, it's possible that you have undiagnosed depres-

A combination of regular communication with your physician, counseling, and support can help you develop protective coping skills to reduce the risk of relapse or developing depression.
