Scripture to live by

- Proverbs-A-Day want a foundation in wisdom and doing what is right? Read and discuss a chapter from Proverbs each day.
- Exodus 1-20 Moses standing against Pharoah (and Injustice) and the Ten Commandments (plumb line of Justice) (You can follow this up with Charlton Heston's Ten Commandments movie!)
- Micah 6:8 Read, memorize, discuss. What does it mean to DO justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God? This is an action oriented, soul-stirring verse that our boys will love.

Conversations to have

- What is justice, injustice?
- What should be done when facing injustices?
- We live in a country ruled by law which means we usually shouldn't take the law into our own hands. What ought we do instead? What are peaceful ways to stand against injustice? Pg 120
- Talk about the Bystander Effect pg 116 and 120
