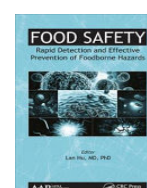

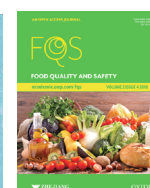

A joint FAO/WHO program on food standards



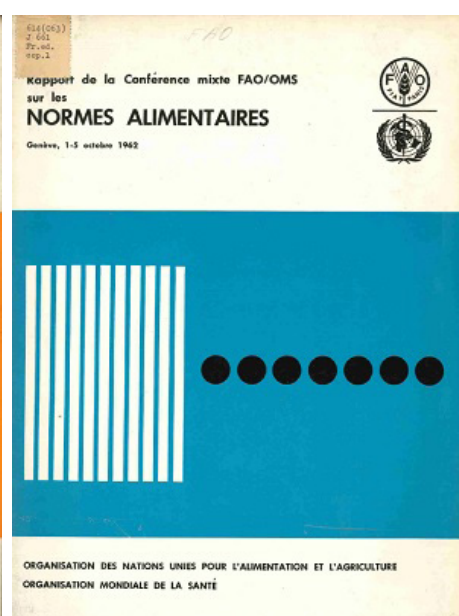
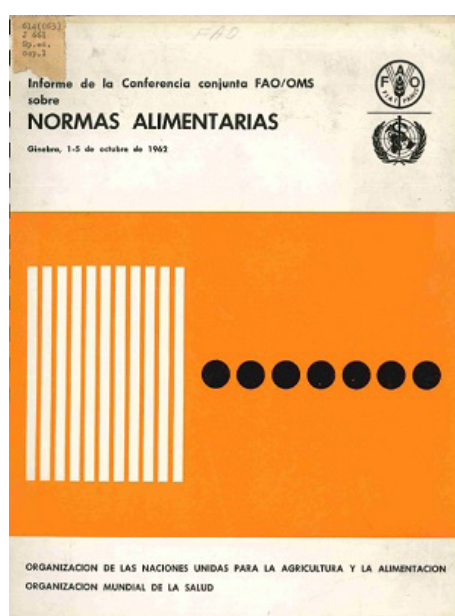
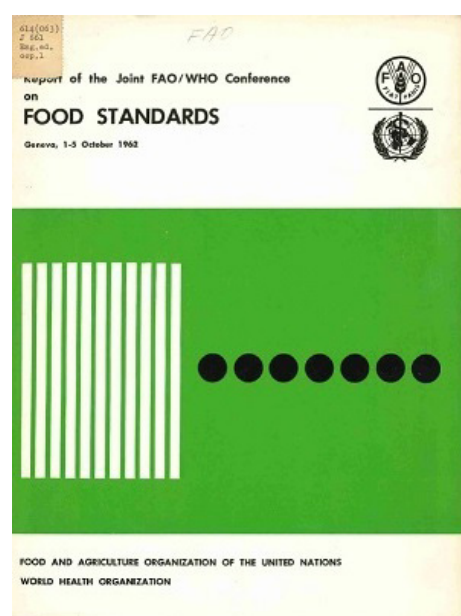
The FAO Conference paper on the left contains an extract from the first FAO Regional Conference for Europe (Oct. 1960) which initiated the idea of a joint FAO/WHO program on food standards; and an extract from the 35th session of the FAO Council (June 1961) in which this idea was examined.

Some months later, at the [11th session of the FAO Conference](#), such a joint program is established having as its principal organ a Codex Alimentarius Commission.

The FAO Library preserves the reports, papers and publications regarding the foundation of the Codex Alimentarius.

In 1962, FAO and WHO come together in Geneva to establish the guidelines for the work of the Codex:

The Codex Alimentarius is to be a collection of internationally adopted food standards presented in unified form. These food standards aim at protecting consumers' health and ensuring fair practices in the food trade. (p.5)
