Rev. Cecil "Chip" Murray to receive 2014 Courageous Peacemaker Award

On Sunday, Oct. 12, 2014, Interfaith Communities United for Justice and Peace (ICUJP) will present the 2014 George Regas Courageous Peacemaker Award to Reverend Dr. Cecil L. "Chip" Murray for his steadfast leadership in South Los Angeles, especially in the African-American community. Murray will be honored at Holman United Methodist Church, 3320 W. Adams, Los Angeles, 90018, with a ticketed reception beginning at 5:30 pm and a free public program at 7 pm.

Murray is most well-known for his peacemaking work after the 1992 Los Angeles Riots and his work in building community by fighting for more jobs, affordable housing, homeownership, HIV/AIDS awareness, among a wide variety of other social justice issues.

Although now retired from the First African Methodist Episcopal Church, he continues his work, specifically in the Passing the Mantle project, which trains clergy from African-American churches in California in effective development and organizational skills.

Congresswoman Barbara Lee will also be presented with a Special Leadership Award for her tireless pursuit of Peace.
