

Tumble Through the Looking Glass ~ Quilt Pattern Created by Leah Day

What does Alice see as she tumbles through the Looking Glass? This scrappy quilt showcases a beautiful array of Alice and Wonderland themed fabrics pieced together with easy tumbler shapes.

Finished quilt size: 50 x 60 inches

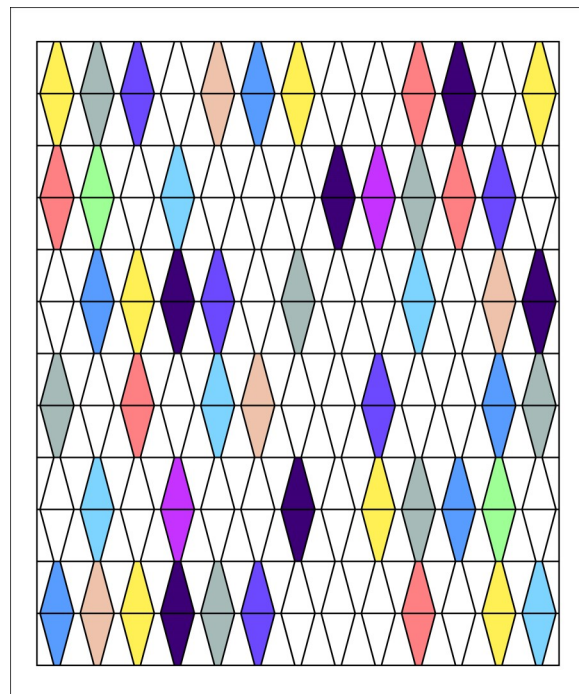
Materials

This pattern is calculated for 40-inch wide, 100% cotton fabric.

- 32 - Precut 10-inch squares – Fabric A
Windham Curious Dreams designed by Angela Pingel
- 3 1/3 yards – Fabric B - Kona Solid White
- Template #3 from the [Dresden Plate Template Set](#)
- Thread to match background fabric

Fabric Preparation and Quilt Piecing Tips

For best results, prewash, starch, and press all fabrics before cutting. Remember to lower your stitch length to 1.5 mm to create a tight stitch. Unless otherwise noted, press all seam allowances OPEN to reduce bulk and make quilting easier.



Cutting Chart

Fabric A

Cut 96 tumbler shapes (instructions below)

Fabric B

Cut 216 tumbler shapes (instructions below)

Cut 7 - 3 1/2 x 40-inch strips

Cutting Instructions for Tumblers

Cut one 5 x 10-inch rectangle from each Fabric A Precut 10 inch square.

Cut 3 tumbler shapes from this rectangle using Template #3 from the Dresden Plate Template Set. Repeat with all the precut squares to create a total of 96 colorful tumbler shapes.

Slice Fabric B into 16 - 5 x 40-inch strips. From each strip cut 14 tumbler shapes using Template #3 from the Dresden Plate Template Set to create a total of 216 solid colored tumbler shapes.

Slice 12 of the Fabric B tumbler shapes in half lengthwise to create the tumblers on the edges of the quilt.

Piecing Instructions

Arrange the Fabric A and Fabric B tumbler shapes in rows to match the diagram above with the half Fabric B tumblers on the sides. Piece tumbler shapes together into rows.

Piece the rows together, carefully matching seams between the tumbler shapes.

Piecing the Border

Seam together three Fabric B 3 1/2-inch strips with a diagonal seam. Cut two - 47 inch strips from this extra long strip. Piece these strips to the top and bottom of the quilt and trim off any excess that extends beyond the edges.

Seam together two Fabric B 3 1/2-inch strips with a diagonal seam. Cut this strip down to measure 62-inches long. Piece this strip to the left side of the quilt and trim off any excess that extends beyond the edges.

Repeat this step with the remaining two Fabric B 3 1/2-inch strips to piece the border onto the right side of the quilt. Your quilt top should now measure 50 x 60 inches.
