
IT'S OUR BIRTHDAY




Using your imagination - what can you see through the keyhole? can you draw it?




COLOUR US WITH RAINBOWS







EASTER EGG HUNT

SCONES




These are easy to make and we often have the ingredients in our cupboards already.

225g/8oz self raising flour
pinch of salt
55g/2oz butter
25g/1oz caster sugar (if making cheese scones then leave this out)
150ml/5fl oz milk
1 egg to glaze (alternatively use a little milk)
If making cheese scones: 100g of grated cheese

- 1. Heat your oven to 220C/200C Fan/Gas 7
- 2. Lightly grease a baking tray.
- 3. Mix together the flour and salt and butter, rubbing between your fingers to mix it all in.
- 4. Stir in the sugar (or if making cheese scones leave out the sugar but put 75g of your grated cheese in the mix)
- 5. Add the milk and stir to a soft dough.
- 6.Turn the dough to a floured work surface and knead very lightly. Pat out to a round 2cm/¾in thick. Use a 5cm/2in cutter to stamp out rounds and place on the greased baking tray.
- 7. Brush the tops of the scones with the beaten egg or milk.
- 8. Bake for 12-15 minutes, or until well risen and golden-brown. If making cheese scones sprinkle your cheese a few minutes before taking out of the oven.
- 9. Cool on a wire rack and eat!


Stanton Village Hall was originally purchased as a pre-fab building, although over the years it's had new walls, roof and floor!

We've worked hard over the past six months to secure investment for the Hall and are delighted to share with


