prepare	verb	to make or get something or someone ready for the future Lita will prepare Kiky's dinner at 6 PM.
opportunity	noun	a set of chances that makes it possible to do something Taking the TOEIC can open working opportunities for me.
proficiency	noun	a high degree of competence or skill; expertise TOEIC, TOEFL, or IELTS tests your English proficiency.
required	adjective	officially considered compulsory, essential, or a must Foreign students are normally required to take TOEFL or IELTS.
requirement	noun	something that you must do, or something you need A good degree is a minimum requirement for many jobs.
abroad	adverb	in or to a foreign country She's going abroad to the UK to continue her studies.
wink	verb	to close and open one eye quickly, usually as a signal, joke, etc. I thought he was being serious until he winked at me.
comfortable	adjective	relaxed; not worried I'm not comfortable with the idea of my child studying abroad.
fluent	adjective	can speak a language easily, well, and quickly I'm learning English to be more fluent in the language.
