The One & Only 'Testical Festival'

Forget Glastonbury having a fallow year and come to The Testical Festival.... back by popular demand on Saturday 23rd June 2018 at Taunton Racecourse.

This is the biggest event of the year for 'It's in the Bag' who support men with testicular cancer in the South West of England; people just like Graham who talked exclusively to Tone News:

'When I was diagnosed with Testicular Cancer, I was shocked and lost. It's in the Bag put me in touch with men who had been through the treatment and come out the other side. They also supported my wife through my cancer journey, providing the opportunity for her to talk to other wives, girlfriends and mothers who were in the same boat.

It's in the Bag helped me rebuild myself after my treatment. I had lost confidence, gained weight, and it felt like I forgot who I was before cancer. Through the support of It's in the Bag, I have been slowly finding myself again. The It's in the Banter events made me feel like a "normal" man, doing normal things with people who can appreciate how you are feeling. I have made some good friends with guys who share a common thing – we survived cancer.'

It's in the Bag have three simple aims: 1) Support: Being diagnosed with testicular cancer and going through treatment is a huge challenge – physically, mentally and

emotionally. They provide a range of activities and initiatives to help men through this tough time. 2) Awareness: They teach men the importance of checking their balls regularly and taking any issues straight to their GP. Spreading this knowledge promotes earlier diagnosis, which often means simpler, more effective treatment and better chances of a cure. 3) Survival: With UK cure rates for testicular cancer running above 98%, they focus on survival – helping guys tackle the emotional and practical impact of cancer, both during treatment and into their lives after.

Testicular cancer is the most common cancer of 15 to 49-year-old men (but it also affects younger and older men). Although most cancers get more common as we get older, testicular cancer is

Bid for the Bins Opens

Somerset Waste Partnership's plans to revamp waste and recycling services from 2020 have taken a big step forward with the publication of official notice that the kerbside collection contract is open to bidders.

Publication of a notice in the Official Journal of the European Union (OJEU) is the next major milestone in this process.

The new contract will be based on delivery of the much anticipated "Recycle More" service, with new vehicles working from refreshed depots collecting a much wider range of recycling every week, including more plastic packaging, small electrical items and food and drink cartons.

Because Somerset's councils work in partnership, this is one of the largest collection contracts in the UK. so is

expected to attract a lot of interest in the industry, giving SWP the opportunity to make sure local residents get the best contractor to serve their long-term needs.

Cllr Derek Yeomans,
Chair of the Somerset Waste
Board, has told Tone News:
"While this is certainly about
taking a quantum leap
forward in our recycling
rates, it's equally about
finding a partner to share
SWP's wider vision for the
future.

"They will not see their job as simply collecting waste and recycling but will share our ambition to create an exemplar service, demonstrating an absolute commitment to environmental quality while delivering excellent value for money."

Taunton's Dragon Boat Race



Taking inspiration from a trend which started in Los Angeles, the event will be raising funds to help St. Margaret's Hospice continue caring for people across Somerset with life-limiting illnesses.

Sonia Bateman, the charity's events coordinator, has told Tone News: "The buzz on social media since we started talking to our supporters about the Glitter Run has been amazing.

"It looks set to be our most popular fundraising event to date. We always knew it was going to be a huge amount of fun, but even we have been surprised by the response."

International debut for Taunton Target Shooter

Congratulations to Stuart Wright from Galmington who has made his first overseas representation for Great Britain at a target shooting competition. Stu, 39 who is a director at Tone FM and runs the website & social media platforms at the radio station, attended the World Shooting Para Sports Grand Prix event which ran from 11th – 14th April in Szczecin, Poland.

Stuart who sustained a high level spinal cord injury was left paralysed and in a wheelchair after a bicycle accident in April 2010 shot in two events, the standing equivalent (R4) and the Prone equivalent (R5) both at 10 metres with an air rifle. The shooters all shoot 60 qualification shots with a maximum score available of 10.9 per shot and the top eight are put through to the final for elimination rounds. Stuart finished 4th after 60 shots and finished in 8th place in the final for the R4 event and finished in 12th for the R5 event.

Talking exclusively first to Tone News & Tone FM, Stuart told us: "Im so happy to have been selected to shoot in Poland and represent Great Britain, its an honour. Its taken a lot of time and hard work to compete at a high level. I would like to thank people for helping me get there including supportive friends and family,

REMAP, My personal trainer from CLASS, The Doris Dibden Trust, SportsAid, Southern Spinal Injuries Trust (SSIT), Deanna my coach and those at Disability Shooting Great Britain (DSGBI can't wait till the next competition and am excited to get back to training but I wish there was better access at the local facilities to train at"

Originally talent spotted for shooting in 2012 at a Paralympic sports fest event Stuart has regular training and coaching at DSGB based in Stoke Mandeville, Aylesbury. The next competition will be DSGB Nationals in June and the ultimate dream is Tokyo Paralympics in 2020. For more information about the charity please visit www.ssit.org.uk



SWT Reports New Record on the Reserves

Somerset Wildlife Trust are pleased to say that following its annual spring Bittern count, 11 booming Bittern males were recorded on their Westhay Moor, Westhay Heath and Catcott Nature Reserves - the highest number since surveying on these sites began.

This brought the total for the Avalon Marshes to 50 Bittern and 55 for the county. This serves as further evidence that the meticulous land and water level management that has taken place over the years pays huge dividends for these very special birds – as well as the other wetland bird and wildlife species that call these places home.

Mark Blake, the Somerset Wildlife Trust's Senior Reserves Manager, told Tone News: "It seems unimaginable now that there was only a total of 11 males across the whole of the UK when the population of this elusive bird's population reached its low point in 1997. It is fantastic that the numbers of these heron like birds continue to remain strong and is testament to the incredible amount of work that has invested by us and others in the Avalon Marshes partnership (who also report excellent numbers on their reserves) over the years to ensure that the feeding and nesting



habitats that support them are kept in perfect health and remain resilient. Somerset really is the stronghold for this amazing bird."

How do they do it? To record these birds and have an understanding of how their population are faring, a large number of volunteers are paired up at 5am to survey at different points across the Avalon Marshes reserves to listen out for the distinctive 'boom'. Each time a boom is heard, the location is plotted on a map of the area which is split into grid square. All the information from each pair is collected and correlated to identify how many individuals are present based on the location of booms heard.

40 Years of Boys and Girls at Queens

A day of celebrations took place at Queen's College at the end of April to mark 40 years of co-education at the independent school. The gathering included ten of the first girl students - including the very first, Catherine Hubbard – while eight of those present were from the first main cohort, joining in the 1977-78 school year.

The guests were welcomed in the Queen's Hall by Head Teacher, Dr Lorraine Earps, who said she felt a kinship with those present having been appointed as the first female Head in the school's history. Dr Earps told Tone News: "Queen's was unusual among independent boy's schools that had turned coeducational as it now had a 50-50 split of boys and girls across all age groups whereas many still had many more boys than girls. We want to produce strong women and good men I believe we are very successful in doing this at Queen's."

Flatlands are graduates of the Noughties School of Indie Rock with First Class Masters Degrees. With a sound harking back to the notso-long-ago days of The Libertines and The Strokes, The Kooks and The Wombats, the Oxford Quartet make everything sound so easy, releasing what is possibly the best Independent EP this year so far with their second 4 track release "At the Time It Made Perfect Sense". Tom Keogh, Nat Jones, Jamie Corish and Rob MacLennan have managed the difficult challenge of combining two similar but distinct genres and coming away without losing integrity, those being Pop Punk and Indie Rock. Their masterpiece Friday Night, first released as a single early this year, before appearing as the third track on "At the Time...", it's the perfect encapsulation of their intrinsically British sound. Within the two-and-a-half-minute length the band switch it up from a fast pulsing opener à la the Arctic Monkeys, to a mellow Verve like chorus with no effort at all. 50 Years on from the Great Trull Flood by Anne Leamon

The great flood of Trull occurred on 10th July 1968. According to villager's accounts, the flood began at about 5 pm with thunder and lightening and torrential rain. Approximately 5" of rain fell on parts of Somerset in 24 hours and water rushed off the Blackdown Hills into surrounding water courses. At Trull the overhanging trees and branches impeded the flow for a while but then the river flooded into a field at Amberd, Trull and the cut hay was washed into the nearby Sherford Stream, causing the water to back up behind the stone walled bridge in the village, flooding the surrounding houses, privies and pub. At the height of the flood water had risen to the Winchester Arms pub windowsills and reached the steps of the Church some 50 metres away and flooded houses along the road.

The sides of the bridge eventually gave under the strength of the water and the resulting wave of water washed down the stream to the Mill Lane Bridge where a tractor and trailer was ferrying people from the caravan park to safety and the force of the water swept all into the river. A sewer pipe caught the tractor and the people clung on to overhanging branches until they were successfully rescued.

With the sides of the bridge demolished the flood quickly receded and by 10pm the roads were clear but of course the clean up operation in the houses then began.
