

## IDEA Maintenance of Effort: Eligibility for FY2021

## What is Local Education Agency Maintenance of Effort?

The local Maintenance of Effort (MOE) requirement obligates any local education agency (LEA) receiving IDEA Part B funds to budget and spend at least the same amount of local - or state and local – funds for the education of children with disabilities on a year-to-year basis. The required MOE levels for budgeting and spending are referred to, respectively, as the "eligibility standard" and the "compliance standard."

### Why is LEA MOE important?

The intent behind the LEA MOE requirement is to help ensure that the LEA is expending at least a certain level of non-federal funds for the education of students with disabilities.

## What are the consequences for failing to meet the MOE Standards?

- An LEA is not eligible to receive IDEA Part B funds until it has met the MOE eligibility (i.e., budget) standard.
- If an LEA fails to meet its MOE compliance (i.e., expenditure) standard, the Arizona Department of Education must repay the U.S. Department of Education.
  - The ADE requires the LEAs who fail to meet the compliance standard to reimburse any funds remitted to the federal government on the LEA's behalf.

#### Arizona's Federal Fiscal Audit Finding

- The Arizona Department of Education received a finding from the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) in which it was determined that the department was not allowing adequate input for testing methodologies for testing Maintenance of Effort, specifically local only funds.
- Maintenance of Effort and also determined that certain values for exceptions and/or reductions specifically for local-only funds were not storing values year-over-year correctly. This was fixed but required all testing to be recalculated from 2012 to the current fiscal year.

Subject: Maintenance of Effort Testing Has Begun

The purpose of IDEA Maintenance of Effort Compliance (MOE) Testing is to ensure that local education agencies (LEAs) are not supplanting state and local funds with IDEA federal funds in accordance with 34 C.F.R. §300.203(b). Therefore, any LEA that has received federal funds for IDEA must complete Maintenance of Effort Testing.

To accurately test for MOE expenditures, the Arizona Department of Education (ADE) requires LEAs to log in to the MOE application that is located in ADEConnect. If you need access to the application, please contact the ADEConnect Entity Administrator within your LEA.

After logging into the application in ADEConnect, LEAs can then indicate whether they wish to identify local special education expenditures from the total amount that is extracted from the annual financial report submitted by the LEA to ADE School Finance. Users will be prompted to indicate any local special education funds expended as an option. If you choose "yes," you will be required to upload documentation that reflects the amount of local special education expenditures.

Maintenance of Effort is comprised of four fiscal tests for maintaining expenditures over time

- State and Local Total Special Education (SPED) Expenditures:
- Local-Only Total SPED Expenditures;
- State and Local Per-Pupil SPED Expenditures; and
- Local-Only Per-Pupil SPED Expenditures

Any LEA that does not provide local-only expenditures will not have local-only tests calculated and processed

LEAs will be able to review their MOE information and indicate local fund expenditures beginning May 2, 2018. The application will stop accepting submissions from LEAs by close of business on May 15, 2018.

LEAs are categorized into different statuses for Maintenance of Effort:

- · Passing MOE by passing all four tests (considered passing);
- · Passing MOE by passing at least one or more tests (considered passing); or
- Failing MOE by not passing any tests (considered failing).

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#### When is MOE calculated in Arizona?

- Arizona breaks down the testing into two separate testing windows using data gathered by School Finance.
  - The compliance standard is tested in March using the Annual Financial Report (AFR) submitted to School Finance by October 15 using data from the prior fiscal year.
  - The eligibility standard is tested in July using the Adopted Budget submitted to School Finance by July 15 of the upcoming fiscal year.

#### Example

Compliance – FY19 AFR was submitted by October 15, 2019, and the compliance standard was tested in March 1- April 10, 2020.

Eligibility – FY21 Adopted budget will be submitted by July 15, 2020, and the eligibility standard will be tested July 16 – August 15, 2020.

### Where does ADE/ESS get the data?

For the Eligibility standard, the Exceptional Student Services (ESS)
team looks at the data from the specific cell on the Adopted Budget
for the upcoming fiscal year, typically found on page 2 of the Budget.



 For the Eligibility standard, the data in the cell for Total All Disability Classifications for Program 200 Budget Year 2020 will be your testing year data that we compare to your LEA's comparison year data.

#### How is MOE calculated in Arizona?

- For both standards, LEAs have four options to demonstrate they have met the MOE requirement:
  - Method 1 Total amount of local funds
  - Method 2 Total amount of state and local funds
  - Method 3 Per capita (i.e., per child with a disability) amount of local funds
  - Method 4 Per capita amount of state and local funds
- For the eligibility standard, the amount an LEA budgets for the education of children with disabilities (upcoming budget year) is compared to the amount the LEA spent in the last year in which the LEA met the MOE requirement for each of the methods (comparison year).
- For the compliance standard, the amount an LEA spent in the testing year (prior year AFR) is compared to the amount the LEA spent in the last year in which the LEA met the MOE requirement for each of the methods (comparison year).
- Remember, an LEA only needs to meet the standard for ONE of the methods to pass the MOE test.

# Why are there two different comparison years?



- The LEA only needs to pass ONE of the methods to meet the MOE standard. That is why there are some LEAs that have different comparison years for each of the methods. The comparison year is locked in when an LEA meets the standard for a given method during the Compliance testing window.
- In the compliance example on this page, the Method 2 comparison year would be 2 fiscal years prior and the Method 4 comparison year would be the prior fiscal year.

# How does ADE/ESS determine which comparison year is used?

Comparison years are established when your LEA meets the MOE Compliance standard each spring. In the example below, the LEA met the standard for Method 4 – locking in a new funding threshold to budget against for the next eligibility test \$6,587.66 per pupil. However, the Method 2 comparison year target remains the 2018 value of \$142,546.00.



### Arizona uses an ADE/IT-built application found in the ESS Portal of ADEConnect.






# ESS Maintenance of Effort Application – Home Page

• In this example, the LEA has passed both Method 2 and Method 4. The comparison years were 2018 for both methods. Click Continue to advance to the next screen.


#### Eligibility Test Results

In order to meet the MOE eligibility requirement in this fiscal year the district/charter must budget, at least the same total or per capita amount, of local funds or state and local funds, as it spent during the most recent year for which information is available.



## Eligibility Test Results – Successful Submission




In this example, the LEA has successfully submitted the MOE data and is now ready to have the FY21 IDEA grant processed for State Education Agency (SEA) Director approval.

## What happens if my LEA doesn't meet the Eligibility standard?

- Remember, an LEA is not eligible to receive IDEA Part B funds until it has met the MOE Eligibility standard.
- If your PEA does not pass the MOE Eligibility test, you will have two options:
  - 1 submit allowable exceptions and reductions through the ESS Maintenance of Effort application
  - 2 submit a new budget to School Finance that appropriately meets the Eligibility standard requirement
- Please note, your IDEA Consolidated Entitlement Grant cannot be approved until you meet the Eligibility standard. If your LEA fails Eligibility testing on 7/16/20, your application will be returned and you will be required to submit your application again **once** your LEA has met the MOE Eligibility Standard.
  - This may affect your LEA's ability to obligate funds and claim reimbursements in the new fiscal year.







### Eligibility Test Results – Fail Example 1



In this example, the LEA has failed both Method 2 and Method 4. The comparison years were 2017 for Method 2 and 2014 for Method 4. As this LEA did not budget anything for SPED M&O, they will need to submit new budgets to be tested.

### Eligibility Test Results – Fail Example 2



In this example, the LEA has failed both Method 2 and Method 4. The comparison years were 2018 for Method 2 and 2017 for Method 4. This LEA has the opportunity to submit allowable exceptions/reductions to meet the Eligibility standard.

#### SEC. 300.204 Exception to maintenance of effort.

Notwithstanding the restriction in Sec. 300.203(a), an LEA may reduce the level of expenditures by the LEA under Part B of the Act below the level of those expenditures for the preceding fiscal year if the reduction is attributable to any of the following:

- (a) The departure, by retirement or otherwise, or departure for just cause, of special education or related services personnel.
- (b) A decrease in the enrollment of children with disabilities.
- (c) The termination of the obligation of the agency, consistent with this part, to provide a program of special education to a particular child with a disability that is an exceptionally costly program, as determined by the SEA, because the child
  - (1) Has left the jurisdiction of the agency;
  - (2) Has reached the age at which the obligation of the agency to provide FAPE to the child has terminated;
  - (3) No longer needs the program of special education.
- (d) The termination of costly expenditures for long-term purchases, such as the acquisition of equipment or the construction of school facilities.
- (e) The assumption of cost by the high cost fund operated by the SEA under Sec. 300.704(c).

#### SEC. 300.205 Adjustment to local fiscal efforts in certain fiscal years

(f) Amounts in excess. Notwithstanding Sec. 300.202(a)(2) and (b) and Sec. 300.203(a), and except as provided in paragraph (d) of this section and Sec. 300.230(e)(2), for any fiscal year for which the allocation received by an LEA under Sec. 300.705 exceeds the amount the LEA received for the previous fiscal year, the LEA may reduce the level of expenditures otherwise required by Sec. 300.203(a) by not more than 50 percent of the amount of that excess.







### How does MOE Eligibility affect my IDEA Grant application?

- Your IDEA Consolidated Entitlement Grant application's approval is dependent on programmatic review and meeting the MOE Eligibility standard.
- Your LEA's IDEA Consolidated Entitlement Grant application will be <u>rejected</u> if you fail MOE Eligibility testing on 7/16/20.
- You will need to <u>resubmit</u> your application once your LEA meets MOE Eligibility standard.
- Example:
  - If your grant is rejected on 7/16 and is not resubmitted again until 8/1. Your LEA will not be able to claim any reimbursement for the periods that your LEA was ineligible 7/1 7/31. Any expenses normally charged to the grant will not be approved via reimbursement request for this time period.

## Must ALL LEAs be tested for the MOE Eligibility standard?

- Every LEA that submits a budget to School Finance and intends to receive IDEA Part B funds must be tested for MOE Eligibility before the funds are made available to the LEA.
- If a school wants to waive the IDEA Part B funds (IDEA Preschool and IDEA Basic grants), then the school will not need to pass MOE Eligibility testing. The LEA will not be tested for the MOE Compliance standard in the year in which they waived IDEA Part B funds.
