GUIDED TOUR FEATURES

K The Family of Freemasonry. An exhibit featuring organizations such as the Scottish Rite, Shriners International, Grottoes of North America, the Order of the Eastern Star, the Tall Cedars of Lebanon, the York Rite, and Youth Orders.

L The George Washington Museum. The exhibit presents a variety of displays illustrating specific aspects of Washington’s life and career. Visitors may see items from Mount Vernon that were donated by Washington family descendants, including the 1792 Washington Family Bible.

The Chapel. On the tower’s eighth level there is an impressive chapel expressing the symbolism of the Masonic Knights Templar.

The Observation Deck. Our outdoor observation level offers a stunning view of historic Alexandria, the District of Columbia, and the surrounding region.

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WELCOME

The George Washington Masonic National Memorial is a memorial and museum, an active Masonic temple, a research library, a cultural space, and a community and performing arts center. This magnificent nine-story neoclassical structure has been erected and maintained by the Freemasons of the United States as an expression of the high esteem in which the memory of George Washington is held within the Masonic fraternity, and to preserve the history and heritage of American Freemasonry.

In recognition of its unique status as a privately-built tribute to Washington, the Memorial was named a National Historic Landmark in 2015.

AREAS & EXHIBITS

A Memorial Hall. Polished granite pillars frame spectacular works of art: two magnificent murals painted by Allyn Cox, and a colossal statue of Washington by Bryant Baker that was dedicated in 1950 by President and Freemason Harry Truman.

B The Replica Lodge. On display here are a 1794 Masonic portrait of Washington, a replica of the famous Watson-Cossoul apron, the Capitol Cornerstone Trowel, and other historic artifacts.

C Founders Hall. This exhibit features photographs and busts of the Masonic leaders, past and present, who built and maintain the Memorial.

D The North Lodge Room. This Gothic Style lodge room features an adjacent exhibit where selections from the most recent additions to the Memorial's collections are displayed.

E The Theater. Our classical Theater, an important arts and community venue, seats nearly 400.

F The South Lodge Room. This neoclassical space includes a small exhibit gallery which offers a number of artifacts, paintings, and portraits of Past Masters of Alexandria-Washington Lodge N^o 22.

G The Form & Function of American Freemasonry. This exhibit tells the story of Freemasonry's origins, its arrival in America, and the role it has come to play in the history of the United States, with a special emphasis on George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, Andrew Jackson, and Harry Truman.

H The Golden Age of Masonic Architecture. Located on the first floor, this exhibit displays prints of American Masonic buildings constructed during the same time period as the Memorial.

I Grand Masonic Hall. This spacious area is often used for large social gatherings. Adjacent is a bronze casting of Jean-Antoine Houdon's statue of George Washington, based upon the c. 1791 original.
