



Different states in which lay people find themselves with regard to the charism


9. Some live identities distinct from the Marists: some, because they have made vital choices different from Christians; others, because they have already found their own place in the Church.

We welcome and respect the different choices and paths, share with all human and Christian values and we work together in the building of a better world and we give thanks to God for everything we receive from the others.


10. Other lay people have felt attracted by the witness of the Brothers. They admire their life and wish to be joined in some way with their spirituality or in mission, without this signifying consciousness of a shared vocation.

It is possible that some have not reflected sufficiently on the significance of these ties and need space and accompaniment which would allow them to discover what God wishes of them.

11. A third group of persons exist who, after a personal journey of discernment, have decided to live their Christian spirituality and mission in the manner of Mary, following the insight of Marcellin Champagnat. These are we, the Lay Marists.

As a charismatic family we should walk together respecting the diversity of the Marist world.

All Marists are co-responsible for Marist life and mission.

We need new structures and processes that recognize and support our distinctive vocational paths as Marists.



#### Therefore, we suggest that:

Each Administrative Unit (AU) discerns, proposes and accompanies concrete ways of building up communion as Marists.

Each AU develops a plan for promoting different forms of Marist life, including appropriate strategies for formation, accompaniment and belonging,


drawing on the document *Gathered Around the Same Table*, and others, such as *Being a Lay Marist* and the *Project of Life in Fraternity (CMMF)*.



#### Therefore, we suggest that:


That all levels of government establish and/or strengthen structures for all Marists to share leadership and responsibility for Marist life and mission.





#### From where do we start...

- From the reality during 25 years.
- Re write the Life Project using a lay language involved all the Movement members.
  - Reflection about how to accompaniment CMMF.
    - Integrate in laity's movement of the Institute.

On June 2012, an international team formed with CMMF members started working a design for a actualization process. Regional suggestions were very value for this work.

# Keys of new Project of Life for Champagnat Movement

- Written in a lay language.
- Specific elements of lay Marist vocation: family, job, social commitments...
  - Present a way of faith in Jesus as Mary.
    - > Formation proposal for lay people.
- Growing in autonomy but in communion.
- CMMF needs an international organization: make known where it doesn't exist.
  - Connect with youth.
