We've had yet another great week at Downtown eStem Junior High School. I'd like to end the week by asking for you help in two areas.

First, we are well into the school year and have been practicing our safety drills: Fire, Tornado, as well as Shelter and Place. We've had several discussions with students about taking these drills seriously, learning the procedures, and moving quickly and quietly to their designated locations. These drills are going well, but we'd like to ask that you reinforce these expectations at home.

Second, please talk with your child about their morning routine. We have noticed a growing number of students that are gathering at 4th and Center in front of the Corner Store. All of the surrounding businesses have been given contact information for school representatives, and we have not received any complaints from our neighbors. However, in an attempt to be proactive, we are asking that you speak with your child to reinforce the expectations for reporting to school in the morning as well as the expectations for being exemplary representatives of eStem Public Charter Schools within the Downtown community.

We will be performing our annual vision and hearing screenings for the 8th grade students September 18 – 20. These screenings are mandated by law and will be

Students will be rescreened if they do not pass the initial screening. Once a student is identified as having a vision or hearing issue, a notification for referral to a specialist will be sent to parents.
