About Us

WA Primary Health Alliance (WAPHA) is the peak planning and commissioning body for primary health care services in Western Australia (WA). WAPHA's primary objective is to improve health outcomes and patient experiences through the commissioning of appropriate services where they are most needed.

The Role

The placement opportunity is for registrars to work one or two days per week on the HealthPathways program as a GP Reviewer. This role will be focused on reviewing HealthPathways localised to WA and will be supervised by a GP Accredited Supervisor.

Successful candidates will have access to all tools and resources necessary for the role and will join a team of seven GP Clinical Editors with varying experiences and backgrounds. They will receive assistance from the HealthPathways team with editing, style and writing guidance as well as exposure to the HealthPathways Community across Australia.

Reviewing pathways is a collaborative process between the HealthPathways team, Hospital Clinicians, Clinical Networks and GPs. The role will involve research into current best practice and guidelines and distilling it into a pathway that is easily accessible by GPs.

Why take this placement?

This is a unique and exciting non-patient facing role. The successful candidate will be presented with the opportunity to shape and design service delivery whilst being exposed to the latest research and evidence available. In addition, opportunities to network with hospital clinicians, service providers and other GPs will frequently arise.
