CO-PRESEASON FAVORITES EUREKA, AURORA SET TO FINALLY COLLIDE

After first loss, bye week, Red Devils eager to open NACC play against Spartans



On Saturday, the Red Devils will take on Aurora in the team's first North Athletics Collegiate Conference Series game of the season.

AURORA, Ill. — It wouldn't be overselling it to call this the matchup of the year.

Four weeks into the regular season, two weeks after its first loss and one week after the Eureka football team's bye week, the Red Devils are chomping at the bit for this one.

On Saturday at 1 p.m., EC will kickoff at Aurora in a matchup between the two preseason co-favorites of the Northern Athletics Collegiate Conference.

What a way to kick off conference play in their second season in the NACC.

"We're excited," EC coach Kurt Barth said. "It's a great opportunity for us to get back into conference play. I think that's the main thing. What everybody's got to understand is that the winner or loser of this game isn't out of anything.

"Football is probably the one sport

getting bested by Albion on the road in Week 3.

Since then, the maroon and gold have used their time off to address the team's shortcomings and get prepared for the challenge that could go a long way toward deciding the NACC championship.

"For us, it's a game that has to kind of wake you up," Barth said of the Albion loss. "We've certainly been productive and had our moments on both sides of the ball (this season). It's just a consistency thing for us, and that's what we've tried to address the last two weeks."

Led by quarterback Drew Barth, the EC offense racked up 531 yards of total offense and put up over 40 points for the third straight game.

However, the Red Devils didn't sustain their running game as well as they did in the previous two weeks, the defense allowed 521 yards of total offense and 56 points and the special teams conceded 232 yards on seven kickoff returns.

The team still managed to put itself in position to win after a strong start to the second half, but the mounting errors — some due to communication, others due to individual efforts — were evident.

"I think that was a great game for us to have right before coming in to conference play," Barth said. "It was a very good team that, as I told the guys yesterday, exposed some things that we needed to fix. That's what you want."

As it stands, Eureka ranks second in the NACC (behind Aurora) and 10th nationally with 507.7 yards per game. The team is also second in the NACC behind Aurora in passing yards per game (333.7) and third in rushing yards (174).

Barth is second in the league in both passing yards per game (333.7) and passing touchdowns (13). His top target,

James Douglas III leads the league and is second in the nation with 166.3 receiving yards per game. He's also fifth in the nation in overall receiving yards (499) and second in the NACC with seven receiving touchdowns.

On the other side of the ball, Bryson Smith and Jon Jackson are tied for third in the NACC with 2 1/2 sacks apiece. Eight Red Devils have made at least 10 tackles, with Austin McCarty leading the way with 21, including tied for a team-high 3 1/5 for loss.

Jackson and Amari Smith each have 15 total tackles, along with 3 1/2 and threw for loss, respectively. Nehemiah Butler has a team-high two interceptions, while Lane Short, Adrian Walker and Matt Sutton have all contributed a pick apiece. Also a key factor in EC's success, kicker/punter Tanner Kuhne is 2-for-2 on field goals, 16-for-17 on extra point attempts and averaging 35.9 yards per punt.

ABOUT AURORA

Aurora will welcome Eureka to Vago Field for its homecoming weekend while hosting a 2-1 record.

The same weekend, the Red Devils fell short at Albion, Aurora dropped its NACC-Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association Challenge Series matchup at Hope College in Holland, Mich.

The Spartans fell into a 20-0 hole in the first half, but nearly came back in a thrilling second-half comeback bid. They were within two points with 53 seconds left in the game after quarterback Gavin Zimbelman connected with Jacolby Maxwell on a 43-yard touchdown reception.

However, they were unable to recover the ensuing on-side kick and lost 34-32. So, like EC, the Spartans will be looking to get a bad taste of their mouth this weekend as well.

They'll also be looking for a little payback

from last year.

In Eureka's first game as an associate member of the NACC, EC barely held off the Spartans at McKinzie Field.

The Red Devils held a 10-point in the fourth quarter, but AU battled within 31-28 on Zimbleman's 72-yard throw to Connor Olson with 3:15 left in the game. A 38-yard run by two-time All-America running back Le'Anthony Reasnovor pushed EC deep into AU territory on the next drive, and another Reasnovor conversion on 3rd-and-2 allowed the Red Devils to kneel out the clock and win their first-ever NACC contest.

"They were a very well-coached team last year," Barth said. "Strong group, and they've got a lot of those guys back. They were very athletic, played physical and we matched that with them.

"It's a game where we feel we've grown as a program (since then), and they've grown as a program."

This year, with Zimbleman under center again, Aurora has the top passing offense in the nation (388.7 yards per game). Zimbleman also leads the nation in total offense (408.7 yards per game) is responsible for the second-most points of anyone in Division III (110) and has racked up the most passing touchdowns of anyone in the NACC (18).

Maxwell, meanwhile, is fourth in the nation in scoring (16.7), second in the league behind Douglas in receiving yards per game (144.3) and at the top of the conference in touchdown receptions.

Defensively, the Spartans have allowed the third-fewest yards per game of any team in the league (369.3) and is fifth in points allowed (96). lake Martz is tied for third in the league in sacks with three, and Rob Stark has 2 1/2.

The Spartans are 12-3-1 against the Red Devils all-time and 7-1 at home. They'll be looking to deny EC's first road win at Aurora since 1941.

OLD BUSINESS: DREW BARTH NAMED NACC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After Eureka's shootout at Albion, Drew Barth was selected the NACC Offensive Player of the Week.

On Sept. 21, the Red Devils' senior quarterback racked up 459 total yards of offense and scored five touchdowns against the Britons. He threw for 410 yards and four touchdowns on 24-for-46 passing while running for 49 yards and another score.

Barth's 459 total offensive yards is the fourth-most recorded by a Division III quarterback this season. It was only the eighth time in program history that a Eureka quarterback had eclipsed the 400-yard passing mark.

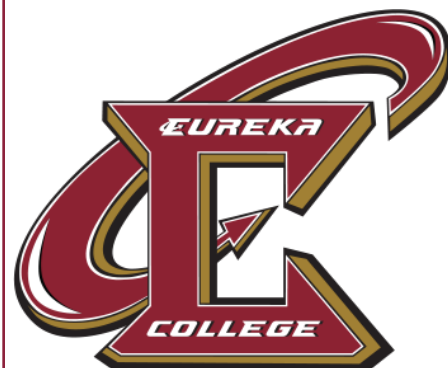

Eureka College Athletics Hall of Famer Kurt Barth will enter his 11th season as the head coach of the Red Devils in 2019. The winningest head coach in Eureka football history, Barth has been the architect of a program that has soared to new heights both on and off the field, including a return to the national postseason for the first time in nearly a quarter-century, back-to-back conference titles in 2017 and 2018, an unprecedented renovation to McKinzie Field and the transition to associate membership in the Northern Athletics Collegiate Conference.

In the program's first season in the NACC, Barth piloted the Red Devils to their most successful season of the 21st century in 2018, even outshining EC's watershed 2017 campaign. The Red Devils snatched the conference crown with a 6-1 run in league play, clinching the team's second straight berth to the NCAA Division III playoffs. Eureka finished the campaign with a 9-2 record overall and received votes in the final AFCA Top 25 poll for the second straight year.

Fifteen Red Devils were named to the 2018 All-NACC team, including six first teamers in Le'Anthony Reasnover, Ryan Barth, Macae Skaggs, Jon Jackson, Trevon Moore and James Douglas III, and Coach Barth was named the NACC Coach of the Year. It was the best offensive season in school history, as the team broke program records since 1980, including total rushing yards (3,429), rushing touchdowns (47), plays (774), offensive yards (5,159), first downs (251), touchdowns (64), extra-points-attempts (54-60), points (455) and points per game (41.1).

With the help of a dominant offensive line, Le'Anthony Reasnover notched a historic season for the Red Devils and collected a slew of awards, including NACC Player of the Year, and AFCA, Associatoin Press and D3Football.com All-America honors. The senior running back rushed for 2,187 yards and 40 touchdowns, breaking records he set the previous season and finishing his career the owner of more than a dozen school records. Barth earned his 50th win at Eureka after a 54-35 homecoming triumph over Wisconsin-Lutheran at McKinzie Field on Oct. 6, 2018.

In 2017, he guided EC to the outright Upper Midwest Athletic Conference championship and the Red Devils' first-ever bid to the NCAA Division III playoffs. Eureka finished the campaign with an 8-3 record and received votes in the final AFCA Top 25 poll, the program's first appearance on at least one national ballot since the 1994 season.

The Red Devils romped to eight consecutive conference victories in 2017, including critical wins over longtime nemeses MacMurray and St. Scholastica in consecutive weekends. A 63-26 drubbing of Martin Luther in rural Minnesota on Nov. 4 secured Eureka's place in history — its first national playoffs appearance since 1994 and its first conference championship since 1995.

Eight Red Devils were named to the All-UMAC Team in 2017. Behind the legs of Reasnover and the power of a formidable blocking game,

EC broke then-single-season school records with 401 points scored and 3,033 rushing yards. The Red Devils put up 4,477 yards of total offense, then the second-most in a season in program history. Reasnover broke six program rushing records, including single-season marks with 1,875 yards and 31 touchdowns, en route to becoming the 2017 UMAC Offensive Player of the Year and Eureka's first-ever AFCA All-American.



In 2016, Barth led the Red Devils to an 8-2 record for the second time since 2013. The Red Devils opened the season with a Lincoln Bowl victory over Knox for the fourth time in five seasons, defeated Greenville for the first time since 2002, won their homecoming game for the fifth time since 2011 and collected six straight UMAC wins midway through the season. Eureka's 14-7 victory over Minnesota Morris on Oct. 29 at McKinzie Field was the 37th of Barth's career, vaulting him ahead of Eureka icon Ralph McKinzie for the most coaching victories in the 126-year history of the program.

Using a similar innovative attack that made Barth a three-time All-American as a receiver at Eureka over two decades ago, the Red Devils have eclipsed the 3,500-yard plateau in eight of Barth's 11 seasons as head coach. The Red Devils led the UMAC in passing three times and reached as high as 16th in the nation in passing offense in 2009. In all, Eureka has received 84 all-conference selections in nine seasons under Barth's direction.

While most of Eureka's eye-popping statistics come from the offensive side of the ball, the Red Devils have also developed one of the region's top defenses. Under the direction of Eureka alum and Barth's former EC teammate Deric Linder, Eureka ranked 17th nationally in total defense in 2016 and limited opponents to just 17.4 points per game, the lowest average by EC opponents since 1991. The defense frustrated opponents all throughout the 2017 regular season and allowed only 257.1 yards per game, 14th-fewest in Division III. The Red Devils allowed only 119 first downs in the 2017 regular season, sixth-fewest in the country.

Eureka has also excelled on special teams under Barth, who recruited the two most successful kickers in program history. Travis Huber, one of Barth's first recruits after arriving in 2008, shattered all-time Eureka records with 108 extra points and 20 field goals. Huber's successor, Tyler Winders, went to break Huber's field goal record with 21 career kicks and added 93 extra points to rank second in program history behind Huber. Tanner Kuhne succeeded Winders in 2017 and promptly broke Huber's single-season extra points record with 47 in 2017 and broke his own mark with 54 in 2018. Heading into 2019, Kuhne is eight extra points away from becoming the program's all-time leader.

Barth and the Red Devils had a breakthrough season in 2013, finishing the campaign with an 8-2 record. The final mark was Eureka's best since 1995. Quarterback Blake Robles broke the single-season school record for completions (215) and a veteran EC defensive unit limited

opponents to 18.6 points per game, the lowest mark by a Eureka defense in more than two decades. The Red Devils also posted a perfect 5-0 road record in 2013 for the third time in program history.

In 2012, EC captured national attention after a 736-yard passing performance from quarterback Sam Durley in EC's 62-55 season-opening victory over Knox. The performance, which landed Durley, Barth and the Red Devils in the national media spotlight, helped Eureka break a single-game school record with 826 yards of total offense. The Red Devils went on to receive unprecedented accolades for an NCAA Division III school, as Durley became the first non-NCAA Division I player to receive the Manning Award Player of the Week. Durley, who played for Barth at Eureka High School and later came to EC as Barth's first quarterback recruit, went on to break all-time Eureka records in completions (572), passing yards (8,162) and passing touchdowns (61). He is now an EC assistant coach and the athletic program's Strength and Wellness Coordinator.

In his first season as head coach in 2009, Barth directed the Red Devils to four wins for the first time in a decade. Now the longest tenured Eureka football head coach since community icon Warner McCollom (1979-89), Barth is coaching for the third time on the Eureka staff. Shortly following his record-breaking playing career for the Red Devils, Barth served as an assistant coach in 1998, then returned to the EC staff from 2003-04 as offensive coordinator.

Perhaps the most decorated student-athlete in the history of Eureka College, the Minonk, Ill. native was a three-time NCAA Division III All-American from 1995 through 1997 and was inducted into the Eureka College Athletics Hall of Fame in 2004. He is a 1998 graduate of Eureka College with a B.S. in physical education and earned his master's degree from the American College of Education in 2010.

The Red Devils compiled a 27-13 record during Barth's playing career, which included an NAIA playoff berth in 1994 and a 9-1 record in 1995 for an Illini-Badger Football Conference championship. The 27 wins between 1994 and 1997 represent the most successful four-year stretch in program history, as Barth and teammate Damon Gladney were the only four-year players on the 1997 team.

On October 11, 1997 against Concordia (Ill.) at McKinzie Field, Barth set the NCAA Division III record in career receiving yards. He finished with 4,311 yards, currently ninth in Division III history. He also recorded 256 career receptions and scored 51 touchdowns in regular-season competition. As a sophomore in 1995, Barth led the country in receiving yards per game at 133.7. The Red Devils lost just one game that season as Barth recorded 68 catches, 1,337 yards and 18 touchdowns. Against Concordia (Wis.) on Sept. 28, 1996, Barth made 20 receptions, which is still tied for fifth-most in a game in NCAA Division III history.

By the time he had completed his EC playing career, Barth ranked second in NCAA Division III for career touchdowns (51), career receiving yards per game (110.5) and TDs in a season (18).

Prior to his appointment at Eureka College in December 2008, Barth was the football head coach at Eureka High School from 2005 until 2008, leading the Hornets to a berth in the IHSA 4A state playoffs in 2007. Barth also coached at the high school level from 2000 until 2002 as the defensive and special teams coordinator at his alma mater, Fieldcrest High School.

Following his first stint as an assistant coach on the Eureka College staff, Barth enjoyed two seasons as a professional player. He was an Indoor Football League Pro Bowl selection in the summer of 2000 for the Duluth-Superior Lumberjacks. The following summer, Barth was named the most valuable player of the af2's Peoria Pirates in 2001.

In addition to his football duties, Barth will begin his seventh year as Assistant Athletic Director at EC in 2019. He and his wife Becca have two children, Brayson (13) and Kamille (11), and reside in Washington.
