WALLACE WOWS

att Wallace prevailed on Sunday at the Made in Denmark in a playoff that featured three PING pros, marking his third victory of the season and his fourth in 16 months.

Wallace poured in eight birdies over his last 11 holes including five of his last six in regulation and on both of the playoff holes.

"I set myself in positions where I have to do things and, more often than not, I get it done," Wallace said of his season thus far. "I'm very fortunate to have done it when I needed to in a few tournaments now."

HATTON IS A RYDER CUPPER

yrrell Hatton is one of eight players who qualified on points for the European Ryder Cup team, it was confirmed after the Made in Denmark on Sunday. It will be the first Ryder Cup for the world's 25th-ranked player.

Hatton, 26, has three European Tour victories, most recently winning backto-back titles last October. Lee Westwood will be a Vice Captain for Europe when the event is held Sept. 28-30 outside Paris.



PROS ALL ADVANCE

ed once again by the steady force that is Tony Finau, who earned a T4, all six PING pros competing at the Dell Technologies Championship positioned themselves inside the top 70 in FedExCup points and will advance in the playoffs this week at the BMW Championship. It was Finau's 10th top 10 this season; he is fourth in FedExCup points.

Bubba Watson surged on Monday with a 66 to finish T7 at the Dell. He is seventh in points. They will be joined at the BMW by Louis Oosthuizen, Tyrrell Hatton, Austin Cook and Andrew Landry. Coming into the Dell, Hatton was 71st in points but he climbed to 54th after his T12.
