WORKSHOP 2 PLAYING WITH SOUND



HI all! Welcome to our second home session this spring - our topic today is SOUND!

We'll be listening in and making sounds, but first you need some tools and instruments.

For a listening tool, we will be making a simple 'sound amplifier' out of a used milk bottle. You could use also a toilet roll, paper scroll... anything that makes a conical shape, but if you have a milk bottle, it works great - as it even has a handle! :)

Here's how:



...just cut the bottom of the jug out! You can save it for later, we can use it for one of the later sessions. It would even make a great soap dish!

Next, you can use felt tip pens or crayons to decorate your tool (or even your new soap dish, if you want!)



NOW that we have our tools - it's time to go **SOUND HUNTING**!

DID YOU KNOW that **SOUND** is actually waves in the air, a series of ripples that carry over the distance from the source of the sound all the way into your ear.

DID VOUS The rhythms in these waves make up the different sounds that we hear. Our ears have a delicate instrument inside them - the EARDRUM - that registers the ripples. These then turn into all the beautiful and crazy sounds that we hear!

Let's take care of our amazing ears!

DID YOU know that even a simple piece of paper makes a brilliant **INSTRUMENT**?

Here's how:

take a single sheet of paper and experiment with different sounds you can make with it by:

ripping,

flipping,

stroking,

dangling,

crumpling,..

TRY TO MAKE AT LEAST 10 DIFFERENT SOUNDS, ALL WITH PAPER... DO YOU THINK IT IS POSSIBLE?

How many sounds did you make?

(a hint - try ripping fast and ripping slowly... very different effect..!)

HOW CAN WE MAKE MUSIC out of the sounds we have discovered? HERE'S HOW:

1) Select three of your favourite paper sounds.

2) Give them a number: Sound 1, Sound 2, Sound 3.

3) Now 'play' them in the following order:

3-2-2, 3-1, 3-1, 3-2-2

- your very first paper composition!


...NOW TRY YOUR OWN SCORE!
