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# Super Scarf

## SHOPPING LIST

### Yarn (Medium Weight)



[3.5 ounces, 200 yards

(100 grams, 182 meters) per skein]:

□ 8 skeins

### Crochet Hook

□ Size K (6.5 mm)

or size needed for gauge

## GAUGE INFORMATION

In pattern,

(sc, dc) 5 times = 3½" (9 cm);

15 rows = 5" (12.75 cm)

**Gauge Swatch:** 3½" wide x 5" long  
(9 cm x 12.75 cm)

Ch 10.

**Row 1:** (Sc, dc) in second ch from hook, ★ skip next ch, (sc, dc) in next ch; repeat from ★ across: 10 sts.

**Rows 2-15:** Ch 1, turn; skip first dc, (sc, dc) in next sc, ★ skip next dc, (sc, dc) in next sc; repeat from ★ across. Finish off.

## STITCH GUIDE

### SINGLE CROCHET 2 TOGETHER

(abbreviated sc2tog)

Pull up a loop in each of next 2 sts, YO and draw through all 3 loops on hook (counts as one sc).

## SCARF

Ch 44.

**Row 1** (Right side): (Sc, dc) in second ch from hook, ★ skip next ch, (sc, dc) in next ch; repeat from ★ across: 44 sts.

**Rows 2 and 3:** Ch 1, turn; skip first dc, (sc, dc) in next sc, ★ skip next dc, (sc, dc) in next sc; repeat from ★ across.

**Row 4:** Ch 1, turn; sc in first dc, sc2tog, sc in each st across: 43 sc.

**Row 5:** Ch 1, turn; sc in first 3 sc, ch 5, ★ skip next 2 sc, sc in next 5 sc, ch 5; repeat from ★ across to last 5 sc, skip next 2 sc, sc in last 3 sc: 31 sc and 6 ch-5 sps.

**Row 6:** Ch 1, turn; sc in first 2 sc, ch 3, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 3, ★ skip next sc, sc in next 3 sc, ch 3, sc in next ch-5 sp, ch 3; repeat from ★ across to last 3 sc, skip next sc, sc in last 2 sc: 25 sc and 12 ch-3 sps.

**Row 7:** Ch 1, turn; sc in first sc, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next sc and in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, ★ skip next sc, sc in next sc, ch 3, sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next sc and in next ch-3 sp, ch 3; repeat from ★ across to last 2 sc, skip next sc, sc in last sc.

**Row 8:** Ch 5 (counts as first dc plus ch 2), turn; sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next 3 sc and in next ch-3 sp, ★ ch 5, skip next sc, sc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next 3 sc and in next ch-3 sp; repeat from ★ across to last sc, ch 2, dc in last sc: 32 sts and 7 sps.

**Row 9:** Ch 1, turn; sc in first dc, skip next ch, sc in next ch and in next 5 sc, ★ skip next ch, (sc in next ch, skip next ch) twice, sc in next 5 sc; repeat from ★ across to last ch-2 sp, sc in next ch, skip next ch, sc in last dc: 44 sc.

**Row 10:** Ch 1, turn; skip first sc, (sc, dc) in next sc, ★ skip next sc, (sc, dc) in next sc; repeat from ★ across: 44 sts.

**Rows 11-34:** Ch 1, turn; skip first dc, (sc, dc) in next sc, ★ skip next dc, (sc, dc) in next sc; repeat from ★ across.

Repeat Rows 4-34 for pattern until Scarf measures approximately 120" (305 cm) long, ending by working Row 12.

Finish off.

## SYMBOLS & TERMS

colon (:) — the number(s) given after  
a colon at the end of a row  
denote(s) the number of  
stitches or spaces you should  
have on that row.

## GAUGE

Exact gauge is **essential** for proper  
size. Before beginning your project,  
make the gauge swatch in the yarn  
and hook specified. After completing  
the swatch, measure it, counting  
your stitches and rows carefully. If  
your swatch is larger or smaller than  
specified, **make another, changing  
hook size to get the correct gauge.**  
Keep trying until you find the size  
hook that will give you the specified  
gauge.



\*GUIDELINES ONLY: The chart above reflects the most commonly used gauges and hook sizes for specific yarn categories.

\*\* Lace weight yarns are usually crocheted with larger hooks to create lacy openwork patterns. Accordingly, a gauge range is difficult to determine. Always follow the gauge stated in your pattern.

\*\*\* Steel crochet hooks are sized differently from regular hooks—the higher the number, the smaller the hook, which is the reverse of regular hook sizing.

 <b>BEGINNER</b>	Projects for first-time crocheters using basic stitches. Minimal shaping.
 <b>EASY</b>	Projects using yarn with basic stitches, repetitive stitch patterns, simple color changes, and simple shaping and finishing.
 <b>INTERMEDIATE</b>	Projects using a variety of techniques, such as basic lace patterns or color patterns, mid-level shaping and finishing.
 <b>EXPERIENCED</b>	Projects with intricate stitch patterns, techniques and dimension, such as non-repeating patterns, multi-color techniques, fine threads, small hooks, detailed shaping and refined finishing.
