- c) Provide weekly structured reporting to the Under 19's coach on player performance. Feedback on performance will have a direct impact on Under 19's selection outcome.
- d) Work closely with the all coaches reinforcing individual player performance objectives.

- a) In collaboration with the all Coaches design individual development plans.
- b) Provide support and nurture talent within the under 19's squad. In particular those not regularly selected in the under 19's squad.

- d) In consultation with SDC Set and monitor individual fitness, strength and conditioning programs and targets.
