08-28-19: The Undersigned has been assigned the case and the initial information sent to the PIO/Chiefs Office has been reviewed. The Undersigned made contact with the reporter, Jessica Brown from PETA via e-mail. The Undersigned asked Ms.Brown to give him a contact number so he could inquire about the original source of the information. Ms.Brown sent a return email stating that she would set up a conference call with PETA National Animal Care services. The Undersigned advised her that a call like that could come further into the investigation, but that the Undersigned needed to speak with her directly being that she is the reporter of the information. She returned an email with her personal number, but did not answer when the Undersigned called her. A voicemail was left.

The Undersigned and Sgt. Lozano sat down with Animal Cruelty Unit Officer Gutierrez, he was asked about the alleged incidents at the shelter and if he felt there was any validity to the allegations. He stated that based on the allegations he did not believe them to be truthful. The documents sent in stated that the shelter is failing to provide care for sick and injured animals. Officer Gutierrez stated that he was attached to the Vets at the shelter for approximately two months and that the staff there does everything in their power to do what they can for the animals with what resources they have available.

08-30-19: Ms.Brown sent an email stating that she did receive the Undersigneds voicemail, but that she would prefer a conference call and that she has no other information other than the information she sent to Chief Allen. The next step will also include contacting Paula Powell, who is in charge of the El Paso Animal Services to talke about the alleged incidents.

09-05-19: Ms. Powell the Director of Animal Services for the City of El Paso came into the SIU office on todays date to provide a statement on behalf of the shelter. The Undersigned Ms. Powell the evidence presented in which she already had copies and was aware of all allegations and photo evidence as it was sent to multiple agencies and offices in the City of El Paso. All allegations on the letter sent in by the Complainant were addressed and a follow up at the Shelter is forthcoming. The interview was audio/visual recorded and will be submitted as evidence.

10-18-19: On todays date the Undersigned along with Officer Gutierrez #2314 from the ACIU met with Director Powell at the El Paso Animal Services Shelter. A walk through of the entire facility was conducted along with photos taken of all areas of the shelter. The allegations sent forth in this case stated that the shelter was violating elements of Texas penal code. The below PC section is the direct statute sent in by PETA.

Sec. 42.092. Cruelty to Nonlivestock Animals prohibits "any act that causes unjustifiable pain or suffering" and states that "(b) A person commits an offense if the person intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly: . . . (3) fails unreasonably to provide necessary food, water, care, or shelter for an animal in the person's custody" [emphasis added].[1] Animal shelters are not exempt from the law. We believe that the reported conditions at the El Paso facility present sufficient cause for your department to visit the property and undertake a thorough criminal investigation.

Throughout the process of this investigation, none of the elements for this offense were proven or observed to be committed by the Animal Services Shelter. All animals in the shelter are provided with, food, care, shelter and attention. The shelter is also in the progress of having additional housing sections built on premise grounds to increase the housing areas for the animals.

Officer Gutierrez #2314 (K504) was assigned to the Animal Cruelty Investigative Unit since the unit was created on November of 2017. The officer's assignment with in the unit was to act as a liaison between the new formed unit and Animal Services. The first two or three months the officer worked with the Veterinarians from the Animal Shelter (5001 Fred Wilson). At that time there were 4 Veterinarians. During this time the officer observed that the Veterinarians would start their day with surgeries to the felines and canines. After surgeries the Vets would start doing their runs checking all the animals in the shelter, one vet would take care of the felines and other veterinarian would tend the canines. The other veterinarian would take care of the incoming animals either from the public or from the Animal Services Officers on the field, also the veterinarians started assessing the canines and felines that were victims of cruelty with what they had. Since none of the Veterinarians were Forensics Pathologist they did not have all the necessary equipment for a complete assessment especially on necropsies.

The officer never saw the animals being mistreated, on the other hand, the officer saw that the shelter was always full with canines and felines that arrived from the City and County of El Paso. As an Animal Science major the officer believed that is very hard to keep the shelter free of diseases when animals from all over the city and count without history come in and in addition the space to house the animals is limited.
