### FOR OPENERS

- Charleston Southern opened its 14-game home schedule inside CSU Field House for the 2018-19 season, as the Buccaneers took care of Converse for a 101-50 season-opening win.
- All 11 Buccaneers that saw the floor played at least eight minutes in the win as 10 played 10-plus minutes.
- Sunday marks the first matchup against a Division I foe this season for both squads after Davidson opened with (result) against Queens (N.C.) Wednesday.
- Sunday is also Military Appreciation Day for CSU women's basketball as all military members and families as well as veterans will receive FREE admission with a valid ID.
- Sunday marks the first-ever matchup with an Atlantic-10 member for Charleston Southern as the last time CSU and Davidson squared off (1993, '94, '95) the Wildcats were not a member of the conference. Sunday is also the fourth all-time meeting between the schools and just the second inside the Buc Dome.

### LAST TIME OUT

- Paced by a double-double from Jasmine Blackmon and four other players in double figures, Charleston Southern women's basketball routed Converse 101-50 for a season-opening win Tuesday.
- CSU saw big nights around the floor paced by Blackmon's 14-point, 11-rebound effort while seniors Ke'Asia Jackson (16 points, five assists), Rachel Burns (13 points, three assists, three steals) and Shelby Wilbanks (11 points, three assists) began their final campaigns on a high note.
- Wekynne Dumorne stuffed the stat sheet Tuesday collecting nine rebounds and nine assists as well as four blocks and two steals. The Big South's leading shot-blocker last season, Dumorne began her second season at CSU with another strong defensive performance
- CSU shot a blazing .571 from the floor, their first time reaching that feat since a road win at Longwood last season. CSU also forced 33 Valkyrie turnovers and came just one assist shy of tying the program record, dishing-out 27 in the blowout win.

**BY THE NUMBERS**

- The Buccaneers are in their seventh season under the direction of head coach Fred Applin, who took over prior to the 2012-13 season.
- Applin became the 15th coach in program history and he enters the 2018-19 campaign as the third-winningest coach at CSU. He led CSU to a WBI appearance following the team's 18-14 season during 2016-17, which tied the program record for wins.
- Charleston Southern returns 11 players from last season's squad, trailing only Longwood for number of returners. CSU does return 75% of their scoring from a season ago - tops in the Big South.
- Charleston Southern will host its first Education Day this season when Erskine invades the Buc Dome on Dec. 11. The Bucs will also host their first Thanksgiving Tournament - the Buccaneer Classic - under Fred Applin with matchups against Tennessee Tech and Jacksonville slated. The entire field will consist of CSU, Jacksonville, Old Dominion and Tennessee Tech.

**A WIN ON SUNDAY WOULD...**

- Be the first for CSU against Davidson in the all-time series, currently trailing 3-0.
- Make the Bucs 2-0 for the first time since beginning the 2014-15 season 2-0.
- Give the Bucs a 2-0 record at home, their best mark to begin play inside the Buc Dome since a 5-0 start in 2016-17.
- Mark the first win over an Atlantic-10 opponent in program history having only played the Wildcats.

**SCOUTING THE WILDCATS**

- Davidson enters Sunday's matinee with a 1-0 record after an 80-47 win over Queens (N.C.) Wednesday night. The Wildcats are fresh off a 12-win 2017-18 season, doubling their win total from the previous campaign and collecting a 7-9 A-10 record.
- Second year head coach Gayle Coats Fulks has injected new energy into the program. She became the third head coach in program history to win her home debut last season, they overcame a 19-point deficit to beat Big South power High Point, and set a new road winning streak in A-10 games taking three-straight at Richmond, St. Bonaventure and Rhode Island.
- Now a sophomore, Katie Turner set the program record with 75 treys, turning that into a spot on the A-10 All-Rookie team. She and current senior Justine Lyon combined for over 25.0 points per game last season.
- Turner opened the season with a team-high 21 points Wednesday on 6-of-10 shooting in 31 minutes. She headlined a pack of four Wildcats in double figures including Kianna Speight (14 points), Cassidy Gould (12 points) and Kelly Fitzgerald (11 points).

**COACHING CONNECTIONS**

- Charleston Southern head coach **Fred Applin** and Davidson head coach Gayle Coats Fulks each had assistant coaching stints at Wake Forest University before their current positions.
- Both head coaches have also been on the sidelines for current Big South teams Hampton University and Longwood University. Applin was the head coach from 1995-97 before heading to Houston while Coats Fulks began her collegiate career as an assistant at Longwood from 2007-11.

**OLD SERIES REKINDLED**

- Sunday's contest is a rare one for CSU as it's just the fourth meeting with the Wildcats all-time and first since 1995.
- Davidson is the lone current A-10 member the Bucs have played in program history with the only meetings happening in the early 1990s before Davidson joined the A-10 Conference.
- While CSU hasn't played any other current A-10 foes, Davidson has made their tour of the Big South. In their 39-year history, Davidson has played eight current Big South members including five matchups this season with CSU, Gardner-Webb, UNC Asheville, High Point and Presbyterian.

**OFF AND RUNNING**

- Charleston Southern was one of 11 Division I teams to score at least 100 points on Opening Day joining the likes of ranked powers Baylor, Louisville and Iowa.
- The 101 points put up against Converse were the most by the Bucs in a season opener since a 98-35 win against Trinity Baptist during the 2014-15 season.
- CSU hit the century mark for the first time since the 2013-14 season against the same Trinity Baptist program collecting a 101-47 win.
- Since Fred Applin took over in 2012-13, CSU has reached the century mark three times with a high of 105 on Nov. 15, 2012 against Hiwassee.

- The Bucs have reached the 100-point mark a total of seven times in program history. Six of those seven have come inside the Buc Dome with their lone road feat coming in 1985 at Methodist.
- Since that 101-point effort at Methodist, CSU has come close to another 100-point road win scoring 98 at Big South foe UNC Asheville Feb. 19, 2011.

**IT'S A BLOCK PARTY**

- Junior college transfer **Weknyne Dumorne** enjoyed a near-record debut season in 2017-18 swatting away 60 opponent shots - second-most in program history for a single-season. Her 60 were the most for a Buccaneer in their first season at CSU surpassing Shaunte Small's previous mark of 53.
- Dumorne's shot-blocking ability led the Big South Conference a season ago besting some of the more dominant post players the league has to offer in Radford's Janayla White and Lydia Rivers. Dumorne averaged 2.0 blocks per game as CSU finished second in team blocks at 4.0 per contest.

- The shot-blocking is nothing new for a Fred Applin-coached team as current Director of Operations **Elyse Kiploks** finished third in the conference her senior season (2016-17) with 1.3 per game.
- Dumorne's 2.0 blocks a game lead all returners in the Big South as Lydia Rivers is the only other returner that averaged 1.5-or-more blocks.

- Dumorne wasn't alone in the shot-blocking industry last season as current junior **Tierra Steede** added just under 1.0 blocks per game - good for T-8th in the league.
- The retention of Dumorne and Steede make CSU the lone Big South team with two players that finished in the top-10 in blocks per contest last season.

**PICKING POCKETS**

- To go along with their post defense, CSU picked-off 7.29 passes per game in 2017-18 headlined by **Rachel Burns'** 2.1 per contest. Burns finished third in the Big South behind only Presason Player of the Year Emma Bockrath (High Point) and All-Big South guard Cortney Storey (Presbyterian).
- Burns has been known throughout her career to force bad passes and pick opponents' pockets. While donning a CSU uniform, Burns averages 1.8 steals per contest with a 2.1 average each of her last two seasons. Her 2.1 average in 2016-17 was good for T-2nd with Storey and trailing just Danyael Goodhope from Winthrop.

**1,000 POINT WATCH**

- Senior guards **Rachel Burns** and **Ke'Asia Jackson** are poised to become the two newest members of the 1,000 point club at CSU during the 2018-19 season.
- A product of Irmo, S.C., Jackson enters Sunday just 61 points shy of the milestone. She averages 10.5 points per contest as a Buccanner with a career-best 15.0 coming as a sophomore while shooting .412 from the floor.

- A native of Gainesville, Va., Burns is just 140 points from reaching the 1,000 point feat at 860 in her time at CSU. Burns is averaging 9.0 points per contest and had a career-best 10.9 as a sophomore as well. Burns is the leading-returning scorer for CSU with her 9.3 average.
- If the two both reach the 1,000-point club, it would be the first time since 2011 that two Buccaneer teammates had 1,000 career points. Former Big South Player of the Year Katie Tull (2007-11) and Kelsey Wasmer (2007-11) were the last teammates to each have 1,000 points in a career.

**EXPERIENCE ABOUND**

- Charleston Southern returns 11 players from last season's team - second-most in the Big South - headlined by a senior class of six - Breannah Bretches, Rachel Burns, Lexii Cassell, Wekynne Dumorne, Ke'Asia Jackson and Shelby Wilbanks.
- With the amount of players returning, CSU sees 75% of its scoring output back for another season - the most in the Big South.
- That experience and scoring output were in full effect in CSU's season opener as the Bucs put up 101 points - their most in an opener under Fred Applin.

- Charleston Southern seniors Rachel Burns and Wekynne Dumorne were named 2018-19 All-Big South Preseason Team members with both making the second team.
- Dumorne, who made her CSU debut last season after transferring in, paced the Big South with 2.0 blocks per contest while contributing 8.8 points and 7.3 boards per game.
- Burns has been a force defensively as well sitting among the top-three in steals per contest (2.1) the last two seasons. Burns also leads CSU returners with her 9.3 points per game in 2017-18.

# FRED APPLIN

Head Coach

Ninth Season (7th at Charleston Southern)

Elon, '85

Career Record: 81-145 (Eight Seasons)

CSU Record: 65-118

Fred Applin begins his seventh season as the head coach of the CSU women's basketball team after assuming the mantle of the 15th coach in program history in 2012 after serving as an assistant with East Carolina. CSU is the second head coaching position for Applin after serving as the bench boss at Big South newcomer Hampton from 1995-97. Applin also brings plenty of coaching experience at the Power 5 level to CSU with time at North Carolina, Wake Forest, Texas and Washington in the ACC, Big 12 and Pac-12.

During his time at CSU, Applin has led the Bucs to the Big South semifinals in 2017 - as well as an appearance in the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI). He currently sits third on the all-time wins list (64 wins entering the season) among CSU head coaches behind only Fred Francello (90 career wins) and Julie Goodenough (78 career wins). He enters the 2018-19 season with three-straight 10-win seasons and tied the program record for single-season wins with 18 two seasons ago. CSU also has won a Big South Conference Tournament game each of the last three seasons - a feat they haven't accomplished since collecting wins in five-straight tournaments between 1998 and 2002.

The Bucs have also garnered numerous Big South accolades under Applin's guidance with eight total athletes - Lakeitha Alston, Erin Bratcher, Alyssa Mann, Ke'Asia Jackson, Anna Webster, Kirklin Kirkpatrick, Carra Coy and Tatum Jarvis - receiving recognition.

Applin boasts an impressive resume with experience in the ACC, Big 12, Pac 12 and Conference USA. He arrives in Charleston after spending two seasons in Greenville, N.C., where he was an assistant under head coach Heather Macy at East Carolina University. Applin served as the recruiting coordinator for the Pirates, corresponding with potential student-athletes, parents and high school and AAU coaches. He also assisted in all areas of the program, including scouting, coaching, academic support and game preparation.

A member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, the WBCA and Black Coaches' Association, Applin dedicates time to his teams' academic and community service efforts as well. Two of his teams in particular - ECU and Hampton - have been honored for their work in the classroom, as both teams boasted the highest team GPAs in respective program histories during Applin's tenure.

## JILL POE

Associate Head Coach

Jill Poe enters her fifth season with the Buccaneers after joining the Charleston Southern women's basketball staff in the fall of 2014. In her role as associate head coach, Poe leads the staff in player development as well as on-court operations including practice and game strategy.

Under her watch, athletes like Ke'Asia Jackson, Rachel Burns and Alyssa Mann have thrived for successful individual careers while the program as a whole tied the previous record of 18 wins in a single-season during the 2016-17 campaign. Poe has been a key in how practice is ran on a daily basis working with each athlete individually as well as each position on the floor. Other players such as Weknyne Dumorne and Shelby Wilbanks have made immediate impacts while each member of the roster has taken a step forward and seen their opportunities grow.

The 2017-18 season was Poe's fourth at CSU as people around the Big South saw the breakout of transfer Weknyne Dumorne as she was near the top of the league in many facets of the game including first in blocks (2.0 bpg) and top-30 in scoring (8.8 ppg) and rebounding (7.3 rpg). Dumorne also added 1.4 assists to lead the CSU post.

In her third season with the Bucs, Poe helped guide CSU to a postseason appearance in the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI) and an appearance in the 2017 Big South semifinals. Poe helped lead the Buccaneers to a 52-50 win over the Liberty in the 2017 Big South Quarterfinals for CSU's first-ever victory over Liberty in the conference tournament.

In her second season with the Bucs, Poe developed Monique Maximilien and Elyse Kiploks into two of the top shot blockers and rebounders in the Big South Conference with the duo sitting among the conference leaders in the category throughout the 2015-16 season, while also developing and working with Breanna Saunders as the Bucs' post players reached new heights in the Fred Applin era.

During her first season with the Bucs, Poe developed Monique Maximilien into one of the premier shot blockers and rebounders in the Big South Conference. She also developed and worked with Brianna Lakes and Rochelle Brophy, improving their skill sets as the trio out-performed their previous seasons.

Poe came to the Bucs after spending two seasons at East Carolina. Prior to ECU, she served as associate head coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Maine during the 2011-12 season. She owns 20 years of experience at the Division I level as an assistant and head coach, with an emphasis on developing post players. She made two trips to the NCAA tournament as a head coach and has been part of the WNIT two times as an assistant.



## BRAD CHILDERS

Assistant Coach

Brad Childers enters his third season with the Buccaneers women's basketball team after joining the staff in the summer of 2016. Childers oversees all recruitment aspects of the program and has brought in talented players like Weknyne Dumorne, Shelby Wilbanks, Kelsie Ruff-Mills and Cailah Hicklin.

Since joining the staff, Childers has vastly improved the recruiting outreach for CSU taking it from a regional base to a national landscape. Childers has also been instrumental in CSU's 'Preview Day' where they have numerous recruits and families on campus.

Childers is no stranger to the Big South Conference, serving as an assistant coach on the Winthrop women's basketball staff from 2008-2011. During his time with the Eagles, Winthrop advanced to the postseason for the first time in program history as the team earned a berth into the WNIT in the 2008-09 season. He also helped five players move onto pro careers overseas during his time at Winthrop.

During Childers' second season, CSU saw the breakout of Weknyne Dumorne in the post as well as scoring contributions from around the floor. Six Buccaneers finished the season with 7.5 points per game or higher led by Njeri Nelms' 10.1 ppg and Rachel Burns; 9.3 ppg.

His first season with CSU saw the Bucs advance to the postseason for the first time since 2012. Charleston Southern advanced to the Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI) after making an appearance in the 2017 Big South semifinals. Childers helped guide the Buccaneers to a 52-50 win over the Liberty in the 2017 Big South Quarterfinals for CSU's first-ever victory over Liberty in the conference tournament.

Childers comes from Armstrong State University where he spent the 2015-16 season as the recruiting coordinator for the Pirates. Among his responsibilities with ASU included: Scouting Director, Individual Skills Director, Offensive Post Coordinator, Defensive Game Strategy, Game Scheduling and Camp Organizer.



## DEION CRAIG

Assistant Coach

Deion Craig begins his second season as Charleston Southern women's basketball assistant coach after the Bucs posted yet another double-digit win season and Big South quarterfinals appearance.

Craig helps in many facets of the program including recruiting, scouting and on-court operations. He brings an energy and passion each day that shows up on the floor with the effort and hustle student-athletes give both in practice and in games. Throughout his time at CSU, Craig has had a hand in the recruitment process for several student-athletes and handled the scouting department leading up to gameday.

During his first season on the sideline, Craig helped lead the Big South's second-best shot-blocking team (4.0 bpg) and third-highest scoring offense (62.7 ppg) led by Wekynne Dumorne's defense (2.0 bpg) and the trio of Njeri Nelms (10.1 ppg), Rachel Burns (9.3 ppg) and Shelby Wilbanks' (9.2) scoring.

Craig came to CSU from Western Kentucky University where he assisted the women's basketball team and was a former player at Coker College and East Georgia State College.

Craig was a practice player for the WKU women's basketball team that won the 2016-2017 regular season and Conference USA tournament championship and made an NCAA tournament appearance. He received a scholarship to play at Coker College in Hartsville, S.C. and was a member of the men's basketball team from 2014-16.

Prior to playing at Coker, Craig received a scholarship to play at East Georgia State College and was a member of the team from 2012-14. He was a part of the 2013 Georgia Collegiate Athletic Association regular season and conference championship team that made it to the Elite Eight of the National Junior College Athletic Association Tournament.

Craig graduated from Coker College in 2016 with a Bachelor of Arts in Physical Education with a concentration in Exercise Science. He is currently pursuing a Master's in Intercollegiate Athletic Administration from Western Kentucky University and is expected to graduate in May of 2018.



## ELYSE KIPLOKS

Director of Operations

Elyse Kiploks enters her second season as Charleston Southern's Director of Basketball Operations. In her role, Kiploks oversees the daily operations of the program as well as community outreach, travel, meals, logistics and runs the CSU women's basketball social media accounts.

In her two seasons, Kiploks has spearheaded a huge commitment to community outreach for the program as women's basketball has recently helped with organizations such as Louie's Kids, Ronald McDonald House, the American Heart Association, Carolina Youth Development Center, the Humane Society and CSU's Military Clinic at the Charleston Military Base. Each player on the 2018-19 roster will have completed 20 hours of community service before tipoff on November 6 thanks to Kiploks' efforts.

Kiploks also oversees the logistics of the program from pre and post-game meals, travel schedule, and other various operational roles.

During Kiploks' first on the sideline at her alma mater, CSU sat near the top in many statistical categories of the Big South Conference including Wekynne Dumorne's 2.0 blocks per game - making it two-straight seasons CSU had the league-leader in shots deterred.

A two-year starter for the Buccaneers' women's basketball team, Kiploks led the Big South in 2016-17 in defensive rebounds per game (5.6). She was third in the Big South in blocked shots per game (1.3), fourth in the league in rebounds per game (7.3) and fourth in minutes played (1,094).

Kiploks joined the Bucs from Melbourne, Australia, where she lined up at both forward positions at the Sports Education Development Australia. She also played for the Sandringham Sabres club team. She came to CSU from Coffeyville Community College.
