What do you think makes the Advocate distinctive in terms of culture, values and practice?



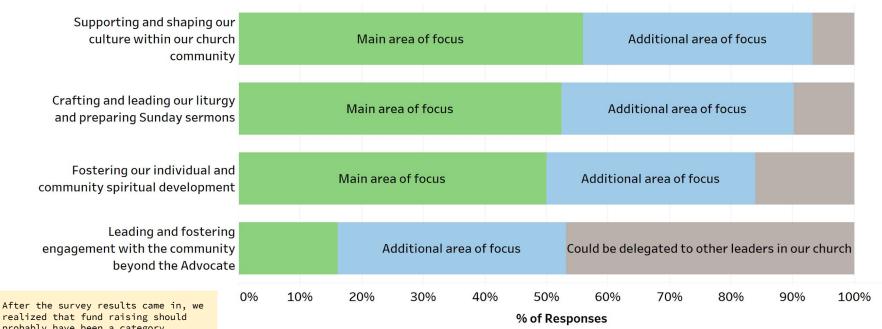
We respect the liturgy while also being free in liturgical practices.
