






Cabin Star is a fun block that combines Log Cabin Blocks and Flying Geese units to make a unique-looking log cabin block. Lots of color combinations!

The number of log rounds you'll need will depend on the size of the finished block. Refer to the Studio 180 Design Traditional Log Cabin Technique Sheet when making the log cabin blocks. You'll also need the Wing Clipper® tool cutting charts for making the Flying Geese units.





Units Name and # of Units	9"	12"	15"
A: Log Cabin Block 4 units	3" Finished 3 1/2" cut sized (2 Log Rounds)	4" Finished 4 1/2" cut sized (3 Log Rounds)	5" Finished 5 1/2" cut sized (4 Log Rounds)
Log Cabin 1" Finished Center Square with 1/2" Finished Logs			
B: Flying Geese 8 Units	1 1/2" x 3" Finished 2" x 3 1/2" cut sized	2" x 4" Finished 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" cut sized	2 1/2" x 5" Finished 3" x 5 1/2" cut sized
C: Center Square 1 Unit	3" Finished 3 1/2" cut sized	4" Finished 4 1/2" cut sized	5" Finished 5 1/2" cut sized



Block Assembly


1. Lay out the block according to the layout diagram shown.
2. Stitch the units into rows, press seams open.
3. Stitch the rows together, press seams open.

Make (1) Block.


