INFORMATION: Chapter 11, Article 1 of the Town Code, Section 11-1, "Definitions," is amended by adding fourteen new definitions and by renumbering the entire section in alphabetical order. Chapter 11, Article II of the Town Code, Section 11-8, "Noxious Growth," is rewritten. Chapter 11, Article II of the Town Code, is amended by adding a new Section 11-9, "Managed Natural Landscapes" to allow residents to establish and maintain managed natural landscapes. Managed natural landscapes are beneficial to the Town's environment and its residents and serve to further adopted Town goals and promote public health, safety, and welfare by:

- (1) Promoting microhabitats in urban areas for the conservation of wildlife such as birds, pollinators, and other beneficial insects;
- (2) Creating larger, more connected plant populations, helping ensure the future of native plant species by increasing their ability to migrate in response to changes in climate;
- (3) Increasing biodiversity;
- (4) Meeting the goals of Carrboro's Bee City USA commitment to promote healthy, sustainable habitats and communities for bees and other pollinators.
- (5) Conserving water resources by promoting water-efficient landscaping through xeriscaping and the use of appropriate native plants which, once established, typically require less water than other species;
- (6) Reducing the volume of stormwater runoff by promoting infiltration, interception, and evapotransiration
- (7) Preventing erosion;
- (8) Further protecting water quality by reducing the use of fertilizers and other inputs used to maintain landscaping;
- (9) Reducing the negative impacts of landscape maintenance equipment on soil quality, local air quality, and climate change; and
- (10) Sequestering carbon.

AN ORDINANCE TO THE CARRBORO TOWN CODE TO ALLOW THE ESTABLISHMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF MANAGED NATURAL LANDSCAPES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CARRBORO TOWN COUNCIL THE FOLLOWING:

Section 1. Article 1, of Chapter 11, of the Town Code, Section 11-1, "Definitions," is amended by adding fourteen new definitions, as shown below, and by renumbering the entire section in alphabetical order.

Section 11-1 Definitions

Unless otherwise specifically provided, or unless otherwise clearly required by the context, the words and phrases defined in this section shall have the meaning indicated when used in this chapter.

- **(1)** Abandoned Motor Vehicle: A motor vehicle that: (i) is left upon a street or highway in violation of a statute or town ordinance prohibiting parking; (ii) is left on property owned or operated by the town (other than the farmers' market property) for longer than twenty-four hours; (iii) is left on private property without the consent of the owner, occupant, or lessee thereof for longer than two hours; (iv) is left on any public street or highway for longer than seven days; (v) is left on the premises leased by the town for the operation of the farmers' market contrary to Section 6-19(b) of the code; (vi) is left on any privately owned public vehicular area contrary to an ordinance adopted under authority of G.S. 160A-301(d); (vii) is left on private property in a properly designated fire lane; (viii) is left on public or private property in a space properly designated as reserved for handicapped or visually impaired persons or in a manner that obstructs a curb cut or curb ramp for handicapped persons; or (ix) is on town property in violation of Section 14-13 of this Code; or (x) may for any other reason lawfully be towed by a law enforcement officer (except that vehicles seized for evidence or pursuant to a levy under execution or otherwise seized or forfeited under any state statute shall not be considered abandoned vehicles under this chapter). (Amend. 10/11/83, 3/14/89)
- (2) <u>Drainage Swale</u>: A shallow open-channel drainageway stabilized with grass or other herbaceous vegetation that is designed to convey stormwater; including but not limited to roadside swales, bioswales, treatment swales, enhanced vegetative swales and other North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality accepted Stormwater Control Measures.
- (3) <u>Exotic species</u>: With respect to a particular ecosystem, any species, including its seeds, eggs, spores, or other biological material capable of propagating that species, that is not native to that ecosystem.

- (4) Extra Trash: Refuse such as yard waste, furniture, paint cans with tops removed and the paint dried, tires, and other discarded odds and ends that the town will pick up on a regularly scheduled basis but that are not stored within the mobile containers described in subsection 11-17(d). (Amend. 12/15/92, 12/2/08)
- (5) <u>Garbage</u>: All solid wastes capable of being rapidly decomposed by microorganisms, including but not limited to animal and vegetable wastes resulting from handling, preparation, cooking, and consumption of food, as well as animal offal and carcasses, but excluding sewage and human wastes.
- (6) <u>Invasive Species</u>: An exotic species whose introduction does or is likely to cause economic or environmental harm or harm to human health. This term shall also refer to exotic species which naturalize and may become a problem in North Carolina in the future as well as exotic plant species that cause problems in adjacent states but have not yet been reported to cause problems in North Carolina.
- (7) <u>Junked Motor Vehicles</u>: An abandoned motor vehicle that also: (i) is partially dismantled or wrecked, or (ii) cannot be self-propelled or moved in the manner in which it was originally intended to move, or (iii) is more than five years old and 11-3 appears to be worth less than one-hundred dollars (\$100.00), or (iv) does not display a current license plate when the motor vehicle is required by laws of this state to have such a license plate to operate on the public roads.
- (8) <u>Managed Natural Landscape</u>: A planned, intentional, and maintained planting of native or non-native wildflowers, shrubs, trees, graminoids, or other herbaceous species, including but not limited to meadows, rain gardens, pollinator gardens, native Piedmont vegetation, xeriscaping, and ornamental plantings.
- Meadow: An area of managed natural landscaping in which routine maintenance is limited to or primarily includes mowing at least once per year. and native plants are allowed to thrive. Such areas may contain grasses, groundcovers, wildflowers, and woody plants. Such areas generally are not regularly mulched, weeded, mowed, and pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizer are not used. Such areas generally do not have a deliberate or definable arrangement of plant material.
- (10) <u>Motor Vehicles</u>: Any machine designed or intended to travel over land or water by self-propulsion or while attached to a self-propelled vehicle.
- (11) <u>Native Piedmont Vegetation</u>: Plant species that, according to *The Flora of the Southeastern United States* by A.S. Weakley, are native to the Piedmont, are native to the Piedmont region of the state of North Carolina, occurring in natural communities which existed prior to anthropogenic impacts on the landscape.

- (12) <u>Noxious Growth</u>: Any growth of weeds, grasses, or other plants or shrubs that because of overgrowth, accumulation, or weather conditions, becomes or threatens to become a fire hazard or otherwise poses a danger to the public health or safety.
- (13) Noxious Weed: Any plant in any stage of development, including parasitic plants whose presence whether direct or indirect, is detrimental to crops or other desirable plants, livestock, land, or other property, or is injurious to the public health, as defined by North Carolina State Statutes.
- (14) <u>Ornamental Plantings</u>: Any plant species intentionally planted for aesthetic purposes.
- (15) <u>Planting Strip</u>: An unpaved area located between a sidewalk and a curb.
- (16) <u>Pollinator Garden</u>: A garden designed and planted with specific plant species to provide nectar, pollen, and habitat for pollinators.
- (17) <u>Public Works Director</u>: The Public Works Director or any other person designated by the Town Manager or Public Works Director to perform the functions and exercise the responsibilities assigned by this chapter.
- (18) Rain Garden: A garden of (native and non-native, but not invasive) plants designed as an infiltrative stormwater control and/or treatment measure not only to reduce the amount of stormwater runoff and accompanying pollutants from impervious surfaces from entering bodies of water, but also for aesthetic value.
- (19) <u>Refuse</u>: All solid wastes except (i) garbage, and (ii) solids that are dissolved or suspended in domestic, commercial, or industrial waste water effluent.
- Scrap Materials: Scrap materials are: (a) Pieces or fragments of metal, wood, glass, masonry, plastic, textiles, rope, leather, rubber, paper, or any substance, that formerly were part of the construction of some useful object or thing or that consist of the excess resulting from the creation of some useful object or thing; or (b) Objects or things, including but not limited to machines, tools, equipment, hardware, furniture, appliances, etc., or parts of the same that are no longer in serviceable condition or are valuable only as raw material for reprocessing; or (c) Motor vehicles or remnants thereof that (i) do not display current license plates, and (ii) cannot without substantial repairs, be made to operate in the manner originally intended, and (iv) are valuable only as raw materials for reprocessing but that do not constitute solid wastes as herein defined because they are or may be useful to or wanted by or have not been discarded by the person in control of the premises where they have been located.

- (21) <u>Solid Wastes</u>: Wastes that are nongaseous and non-liquid (except that liquid wastes resulting from the processing of food are deemed solid wastes for the purposes of this chapter).
- (22) <u>Turfgrass Lawn</u>: A lawn consisting of continuous grass coverage, intended to be regularly-mowed and maintained at an established height.
- (23) <u>Wastes</u>: All useless, unwanted, or discarded materials resulting from domestic, industrial, commercial or community activities.
- (24) <u>Weeds</u>: plants that are not valued where they are growing and are usually of vigorous growth, especially species that tend to overgrow more desirable plants.
- (25) White Goods: Refrigerators, ranges, water heaters, freezers, unit air conditioners, washing machines, dishwashers, clothes dryers, and other similar domestic and commercial large appliances. (Amend. 12/13/94)
- (26) <u>Xeriscaping</u>: The practice of designing a landscape or garden using appropriate native or water-efficient plant species in order to reduce or eliminate the need for supplemental water.
- Yard Waste: Organic materials commonly consisting of leaves, pine straw, wheat straw, grass, weeds, hedge clippings, dirt, rocks, yard and garden waste, branches, logs, twigs, and all vegetative matter resulting from landscaping or land clearing activities (e.g., stumps, trees, etc.) (Amend. 12/15/92)

Section 2. Article II of Chapter 11 of the Town Code, Section 11-8, "Noxious Growth," is rewritten to read as follows:

Section 11-8 Noxious Growth

No persons may cause, suffer, or permit on premises under their control noxious growth, as defined in Section 11-1 of this Chapter as any growth of weeds, grasses, or other plants or shrubs that, because of overgrowth, accumulation, or weather conditions, becomes or threatens to become a fire hazard or otherwise poses a danger to the public health or safety. Managed natural landscapes and meadows shall not be considered noxious growth.

Section 3. Article II of Chapter 11 of the Town Code, is amended by adding a new Section 11-9, "Managed Natural Landscapes," to read as follows:

Section 11-9 Managed Natural Landscapes

- (a) The Town Council finds that the establishment and maintenance of managed natural landscapes is beneficial to the Town's environment and its residents and serves to further adopted Town goals and promote public health, safety, and welfare by:
 - (1) Promoting microhabitats in urban areas for the conservation of wildlife such as birds, pollinators, and other beneficial insects;
 - (2) Creating larger, more connected plant populations, helping ensure the future of native plant species by increasing their ability to migrate in response to changes in climate;
 - (3) Increasing biodiversity;
 - (4) Meeting the goals of Carrboro's Bee City USA commitment to promote healthy, sustainable habitats and communities for bees and other pollinators.
 - (5) Conserving water resources by promoting water-efficient landscaping through xeriscaping and the use of appropriate native plants which, once established, typically require less water than other species;
 - (6) Reducing the volume of stormwater runoff by promoting infiltration, interception, and evapotransiration
 - (7) Preventing erosion;
 - (8) Further protecting water quality by reducing the use of fertilizers and other inputs used to maintain landscaping;
 - (9) Reducing the negative impacts of landscape maintenance equipment on soil quality, local air quality, and climate change; and
 - (10) Sequestering carbon.

(b) Standards

An owner, authorized agent, or authorized occupant of any privately owned lands or premises may, consistent with this section and all other applicable laws, statutes, rules and ordinances, establish and maintain a managed natural landscape.

(c) Requirements

- (1) Managed natural landscapes, as defined in Article 1 of this Chapter, may include plants and grasses which have gone to seed, but shall not include any invasive plant species identified by the North Carolina Native Plant Society or North Carolina Invasive Plant Council or noxious weeds as identified by the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and must be maintained so as to not include unintended vegetation.
 - (2) Managed natural landscapes must be designed and maintained such that all vegetation remains on private property and does not interfere with the use of the public right-of-way. Sidewalks, planting strips, road and wayfinding signage, and visual sight triangles must remain clear from obstruction, per current North Carolina Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration, and

- Town standards and specifications outlined in Town Code Chapter 7 and Land Use Ordinance Appendix C.
- (3) Managed natural landscapes shall not interfere with the maintenance of stormwater management features including drainage swales.
- (4) Meadow areas of managed natural landscapes shall be mowed to a height of 8-10 inches at least once per calendar year in the early spring (March-April). The entirety of a meadow should not be mown at one time; mowing should be spaced so that the mown area has a chance to re-grow before mowing the other section.
- (5) Plantings that are no longer maintained consistent with the provisions of this section for managed natural landscapes may be considered noxious growth and subject to the enforcement provisions under Article V of this chapter. Unattended turfgrass lawns are not examples of managed natural landscapes and may become noxious growth and subject to enforcement.
- (6) Plantings that encroach upon Town drainage or right-of-way easements shall obtain an Encroachment Agreement through the Public Works Department prior to planting.
- (d) Only properties containing homes, adjacent property owned by the same homeowner, or properties owned by homeowners' associations are covered by this ordinance.
- (e) All provisions of any Town ordinance or resolution in conflict with this ordinance are repealed, and this ordinance is effective upon adoption.

INFORMATION: Laura Van Sant, on behalf of East Main Square, LLC, has requested a two year extension of the date on which a previously issued Conditional Use Permit (CUP) will otherwise expire (Attachment B). When the request was taken to Town Council in March 2021, Council members voted to grant a six month extension during which the property should address specific requests from Town Council as reflected in the meeting minutes. The applicant's letter explains what they have and have not been able to do in the previous six months, and requests that the permit be extended for two years. If this item is approved, the new expiration date will be October 9, 2023. The permit still allows for construction of multiple new five-story buildings that have not yet been built. The CUP document is included for reference as Attachment D.

About item 3 in the minutes, regarding placing bicycle racks in the East Main Street public right-of-way, staff has consulted with NCDOT and determined it is not feasible at this time to do so. NCDOT requires six feet of clearance between a travel lane and where a physical structure such as a bicycle rack can be placed, and this location the right-of-way only extends approximately five feet from the edge of the travel lane.

Permit extensions are regulated by Section 15-62 of the LUO (Attachment E). Also attached is a permit extension worksheet (Attachment F). A resolution approving the request is provided as Attachment A, should Council choose to adopt it.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN EXTENSION OF THE DATE ON WHICH A CUP WOULD OTHERWISE EXPIRE FOR 300 EAST MAIN CUP

WHEREAS, the Carrboro Town Council approved a Conditional Use Permit for the 300 East Main project on September 30, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the Carrboro Town Council last granted a CUP Extension for a period of six months during which the property owner was asked to consider making certain improvements to the property, thereby extending the permit to October 9, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds, per Section 15-62(c) of the LUO, that: 1) the CUP has not yet expired, 2) the permit recipient has proceeded with due diligence and in good faith, and 3) conditions have not changed so substantially as to warrant a new application.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Carrboro Town Council that the permit is extended, with a new expiration date for the 300 East Main CUP of October 9, 2023.

This the 5th day of October, 2021

We ask that the 300 East Main/East Main Square CUP be extended for an additional two years. We understand the Town's desire to update certain aspects of the CUP approval to meet current standards, and we are generally amendable to that concept at the appropriate time.

The fact is that we will be required to get a CUP modification for almost anything we would feasibly want to do as next phase in the development of East Main Square, so there will be ample opportunity to update any standards as necessary before we can proceed with a next phase.

We have worked very hard to help many local people and their businesses through the pandemic, and dealing with the pandemic's effects has occupied most all our time and resources. We had hoped the pandemic would have eased more before now, but financial and other circumstances remain challenging for almost everyone at East Main Square. Further, because of the pandemic we have again had to table our plans to proceed with the Hilton Garden Inn on the Butler Lot and, similarly, we will not be able to move forward with seeking approval for an office building as a next phase at East Main Square as we had hoped. Potential anchor office tenants for that building have informed us that they do not anticipate needing larger space for the foreseeable future until it becomes clear how much remote working will continue beyond the pandemic.

This does not seem the time to lapse our CUP.

With respect to questions posed earlier this year concerning bike racks, potential charging stations, and other matters, we offer the following responses:

1. We inspected all bike racks and believe our team has successfully sturdied all but one. Attempts to solidify the bike rack near Womancraft did not work and we have ordered inverted U racks to replace that existing wave rack. We have also been researching and consulting local artists for ideas to add bike racks with more artistic designs that would still have all the functionality and sturdiness of the inverted U racks. We have also re-mulched (twice in some places) the areas around relevant bike racks.

Sidewalk areas for outdoor dining, walking and gathering space is at even more of a premium for safety during the pandemic, and we do not wish to add racks on sidewalks internal to our site at this time. We do remain willing to work with the town to identify potential bike-parking locations on public sidewalks adjacent to our property.

2. We do not believe the EV station in the basement of the parking deck (installed there by BuzzRides UNC for their use) will work as an effective charging station for members of the public with electric cars because we understand the voltage is different than needed for cars and the location in the back corner of the parking deck basement has low visibility and appeal. We have consulted with design professionals to better understand the additional electric circuits and other infrastructure needed to install electric vehicle charging stations going forward and to understand the logistics of such stations in commercial locations where the best results would have users moving their vehicles promptly after completing a charge rather than tying up the charging station for a whole workday or evening.

We do believe in adding some electric-vehicle charging to existing development (let alone new ones as required), and we are working to add at least some EV capacity once we're free of pandemic-related financial constraints.

- 3. A second, temporary connection to the Libba Cotten Bikeway has been made along with the preparations to permit the Town to use the "Butler Lot" as public parking and to permit the Cradle to host outdoor shows on that site, and all future redevelopment plans for East Main Square—and for the Butler Lot—shall include a commitment to make a paved connection to the bikeway as part of construction there.
- 4. With regard to the question of installing solar panels on canopies or other structures over the roof elevation of the parking deck, we have not had the funds to spend on engineers and others to fully assess the feasibility of such a project. We believe in the idea in general principle, as we always have, and we have looked at this issue repeatedly over the years. Recently again, we have researched and learned that continued technological progress appears to be increasing the likelihood that we will be able to add solar panels over the deck's roof-elevation parking in the future, but we cannot say when at this point given the continuing distressed economic environment caused by the pandemic. Even as the pandemic has hurt our revenues, and those of so many local businesses and individuals, many expenses and taxes continue to rise, heightening budget challenges that could persist for quite some time still it appears.

The cost of adding panels over the deck's roof elevation is much greater than the panels themselves and the associated electrical architecture. Perhaps the greatest cost is engineering the stout metal canopies that would cover the parking spaces and support the solar panels in the face of wind loads on the exposed roof elevation. There are limited connection points on the deck's precast elements, and even with prefabricated systems, we have been told that the cost is prohibitive, especially as we work to make it through the pandemic and hopefully being to recover whenever the pandemic is behind us at last.

WHEREAS, the Carrboro Town Council approved a Conditional Use Permit for the 300 East Main project on September 30, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the Carrboro Town Council last granted a CUP Minor Modification on April 9, 2019, thereby extending the permit to April 9, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds, per Section 15-62(c) of the LUO, that: 1) the CUP has not yet expired, 2) the permit recipient has proceeded with due diligence and in good faith, and 3) conditions have not changed so substantially as to warrant a new application; and

WHEREAS, the permit recipient has expressed willingness to act on the following 5 items during the permit extension period: 1) inspect all bike racks and be sure they are sturdily installed with adequate mulch, paving, or gravel to keep them out of the mud; 2) continue to use inverted-U bike racks (or other preferred rack styles, as described in the LUO) for all new bike rack installations and replacements; 3) evaluate (in consultation with the Town and NCDOT) possible locations for installing bike racks in the public right-of-way on East Main Street; 4) evaluate costs and possible locations for electric vehicle charging stations and discuss funding possibilities with the Town; and 5) evaluate the feasibility of solar panel installation on the parking deck roof and discuss potential funding sources with the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council reiterated its interest in the completion of an improved path providing pedestrian-bicycle access into the project from the Libba Cotten Bikeway at the southwest corner of the site;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Carrboro Town Council that the permit is extended, with a new expiration date for the 300 East Main CUP of October 9, 2021.



PROPOSED USE OF PROPERTY: To allow for construction of multiple five-story commercial buildings and associated infrastructure at and around 300 East Main Street.

CARRBORO LAND USE ORDINANCE USE CATEGORY: Building Site – 2.110, 2.111, 2.120, 2.150 (in B-1(c) portion only); Office. Service and similar uses: 3.110, 3.120, 3.130, 3.150 3.250; Educational, Cultural, Religious, etc: 5.110, 5.120, 5.130, 5.200, 5.310, 5.320, 5.400; Recreation, Amusement, Entertainment: 6.110, 6.121, 6.122, 6.130, 6.140, 6.221, 6.222; Restaurants, Bars, Nightclubs: 8.100, 8.200, 8.500, 8.600; Emergency Services: 13.100; Public and Semi-Public Facilities: 15.100, 15.700; Open Air Markets and Horticultural Sales: 19.100; Temporary structure or parking lot used in connection with construction project or other non-recurring purpose: 23.000; Combination Use: 27.000; Satellite Parking Lot: 10.100

MEETING DATES: August 26, September 16, September 30, 2008

Having heard all the evidence and arguments presented at the hearing, the Board finds that the application is complete, that the application complies with all of the applicable requirements of the Carrboro Land Use Ordinance for the development proposed, and that therefore the application to



make use of the above described property for the purpose indicated is hereby approved, subject to all applicable provisions of the Land Use Ordinance and the following conditions:

- 1. The applicant shall complete the development strictly in accordance with the plans submitted to and approved by this Board, a copy of which is filed in the Carrboro Town Hall. Any deviations from or changes in these plans must be submitted to the Development Review Administrator in writing and specific written approval obtained as provided in Section 15-64 of the Land Use Ordinance.
- 2. If any of the conditions affixed hereto or any part thereof shall be held invalid or void, then this permit shall be void and of no effect.
- 3. That both Phase A and Phase B construction plans must include a note referencing that the entire project is now regulated under one Conditional Use Permit.
- 4. That Use Classification 18.100 be removed from the list of permissible uses.
- 5. That the Board of Aldermen finds it acceptable to orient the parking deck either east-west or in the alternate north-south direction, along with related changes to the drive aisle area (i.e.: inclusion of a small traffic circle and drop-off area in front of the hotel).
- 6. That the applicant agrees to extend the east-west leg of Boyd Street to a new entrance / exit on Main Street, as shown on the CUP plans. In doing so, the applicant must coordinate filing a plat offering the necessary additional right-of-way to the Town of Carrboro, prior to construction plan approval. Final design details for both the existing leg and newly-proposed leg of Boyd Street are subject to approval by the Public Works Department during the construction plan review and shall incorporate necessary elements from Town plans and specifications. If the applicant is unable to coordinate the filing of a plat dedicating the necessary right-of-way to the Town prior to construction plan approval, then the applicant agrees to subject the project to an additional public hearing via the CUP Major Modification process, so that further consideration may be given to the associated changes to traffic patterns.
- 7. Prior to construction plan approval, the applicant shall replace the currently-shown handicap accessible ramp detail with a detail conforming to NCDOT roadway standard specifications for handicap ramp curb cut/sidewalk connections within public right-of-way (i.e.: two ramps per radius, 90-degrees from one another, instead of one ramp per radius).
- 8. That the applicant must obtain approval from Public Works for the final location for tree-containing grates and the tree species proposed along Main Street, prior to construction plan approval.
- 9. That the applicant must obtain approval from Public Works for the final details for brick-edged sidewalks to be included along both Main Street and Boyd Street, in accordance with Town specifications.
- 10. That the applicant must obtain a driveway permit from both Public Works (for Boyd Street) and NCDOT prior to construction plan approval. In granting the driveway permit, the Town encourages NCDOT to require the improvements mentioned in 'TIA recommendation #2,' consider requiring the improvements mentioned in 'TIA recommendation #1' (both reiterated in the '12/05/07 TIA Memorandum'), and to discuss their final list of requirements with the Town of Carrboro Transportation Planner to ensure compatibility with the Carrboro Downtown Traffic Circulation Study.
- 11. That the applicant must obtain approval for a construction traffic control plan from both Public Works and NCDOT prior to construction plan approval.
- 12. That the Board of Aldermen finds that 843 parking spaces are sufficient to serve the development. This finding is based on information provided by the applicant regarding the proposed mix of uses and expected shared use of spaces, which should result in the development having sufficient parking at all times except 6-9 PM Friday and Saturday evenings when a majority of the property is leased. This finding of a sufficient number of spaces also is subject to and dependent on the applicant's willingness to retain and utilize a valet parking company during times when a parking shortage exists. The valet



parking company is expected to utilize space within the parking deck in such a manner that an additional 47 parking spaces may be realized, as per the information submitted by the applicant stating that it is possible to gain this number of spaces. The obligation to utilize a valet parking company, in accordance with the terms explained herein, shall be a continuing, binding part of the CUP unless the Board of Aldermen agrees to modify this condition based on future circumstances.

- 13. Prior to issuance of each building permit, the applicant must present to the Town evidence showing that sufficient parking will be constructed concurrent with the proposed building, in accordance with the parking spreadsheet data included in the CUP plans. The certificate of occupancy for each building will not be issued until such parking is complete unless the applicant demonstrates that the parking deficit can be addressed by a parking valet company in the same manner described in CUP condition #12. In such a situation, the obligation to utilize a valet parking company shall be a continuing, binding part of the CUP until the necessary number of parking spaces are provided unless the Board of Aldermen agrees to modify this condition based on future circumstances.
- 14. That the applicant agrees to include at least 80 bicycle parking spaces. The spaces must be dispersed throughout the project with at least 25% located proximate to the front entrances of buildings, and with at least half of the spaces located in a covered location to shield bicycles from weather elements.
- 15. That except as required in the condition below relating to the residential property along Boyd Street on the southeast side of the site, the Board of Aldermen finds that no screening requirements are imposed on this project because the Board desires to foster a pedestrian-friendly atmosphere in the downtown area among other factors relative to the property lines and further finds that integration of this project with the neighboring property on the eastern side would be diminished were screening required between the two sites.
- 16. That the applicant shall consider suggestions made by the Environmental Planner prior to construction plan approval related to finding possible additional or alternate locations for shade trees.
- 17. That prior to construction plan approval for Phase A the applicant must fully analyze and survey the existing storm drain system all the way to the outlet and modify elements of the underground detention system if necessary based on associated findings.
- 18. That the applicant must incorporate an appropriate filter or similar type device into the proposed swirl-type vault system, upon such device being reasonably available, in order to increase the percentage of TSS removal associated with the stormwater device.
- 19. That the applicant shall provide to the Zoning Division, prior to issuance of the first Certificate of Occupancy for the project or before the release of a bond if some features are not yet in place at the time of the recording of the first Certificate of Occupancy for the project, Mylar and digital as-builts for the stormwater features of the project. Digital as-builts shall be in DXF format and shall include a base map of the whole project and all separate plan sheets. As-built DXF files shall include all layers or tables containing storm drainage features. Storm drainage features will be clearly delineated in a data table. The data will be tied to horizontal controls.
- 20. That the developer shall include a detailed stormwater system maintenance plan, specifying responsible entity and schedule. The plan shall be subject to approval by the Town Attorney and shall include scheduled maintenance activities for each unit in the development, (including cisterns, sand filters, swirl-systems, etc.), performance evaluation protocol, and frequency of self-reporting requirements (including a proposed self-reporting form) on maintenance and performance. The plan and supporting documentation shall be submitted to Town engineer and Environmental Planner for approval prior to construction plan approval. Upon approval, the plans shall become an ongoing obligation of the property owners.
- 21. That the applicant must obtain approval from OWASA for the final design related to water and sewer easements prior to construction plan approval, particularly related but not limited to including a 20-foot easement around the meter vault in Phase A, as



referenced on OWASA's May 16, 2007 letter, plus ensuring that OWASA easements are free from certain unallowable encroachments.

- 22. That the applicant shall present for approval the final architectural details for buildings D, E and F in accordance with the approval process established in the ordinance at the time such approval is sought. If the approval authority is the Appearance Commission, the architectural plans shall nevertheless be reviewed by the Board of Aldermen.
- 23. That the applicant must submit fire flow calculations and receive approval of the calculations from the Town Engineer and OWASA prior to construction plan approval.
- 24. That the applicant obtains all necessary temporary and permanent easements, encroachment agreements, or similar legal instruments prior to construction plan approval.
- 25. That prior to construction plan approval, the applicant must receive a 'transportation facility' permit from NCDENR.
- 26. That prior to construction plan approval, the applicant must provide to the Town evidence that the ArtsCenter retains perpetual access rights, parking rights, solid waste facilities rights, etc, consistent with the existing reciprocal operating agreement with Main Street Properties governing access and parking. If, subsequent to the issuance of the CUP, both parties agree to a new reciprocal operating agreement, then such agreement shall supersede the existing agreement with respect to this condition.
- 27. That the construction plans show a catch basin including the phrase 'dump no waste, drains to Jordan Lake.
- 28. That a covered bus shelter be required with a custom design.
- 29. That lighting be allowed to spill over onto the railroad in order to increase safety in this area to the extent permitted under the Land Use Ordinance.
- 30. The Board asked that the developer provide an 8-foot wide sidewalk between the railroad right-of-way and Roberson Street if possible.
- 31. That the hotel shall include the following water conservation measures: the use of Sloan Flushmate IV high efficiency toilets 1.0gal / 3.8 Liter per flush (or equivalent device) in all guest rooms and public restrooms; use of low consumption urinals in public restrooms; use of low consumption faucets in all guest rooms and public restrooms delivering 0.5 gallons per minute as opposed to 2.5 gallons per minute; use of low consumption shower heads in all guest rooms; and use of circulation pumps in main hot water line to make hot water available quickly at all faucets. The building permit application for the hotel building must include evidence sufficient to show that the building design adheres to this CUP condition.
- 32. That the applicant agrees to include on the construction plans a vegetative and/or fence screen in the southeast corner of the site (adjacent to the residences on Boyd Street) sufficient to meet the LUO's Type A description.
- 33. That the applicant must regularly water Boyd Street during construction, using OWASA reclaimed water, to reduce dust, erosion, etc potentially caused by heavy vehicles.
- 34. That the applicant agrees to place bollards at all entrances to the pedestrian plaza where vehicles travel adjacent to the area so as to create a physical barrier between the plaza and vehicle travel lanes. A detail drawing and spacing for the bollards shall be shown on the construction plans.
- 35. That prior to construction plan approval, the applicant, Town staff, and NCDOT will agree to a construction traffic management plan to include adequate signage to address pedestrian and bicycle flow along Main Street as well as vehicular traffic.
- 36. That during construction the applicant shall keep posted, on site in a conspicuous location, contact information including a phone number that citizens may call at any time with concerns about construction of the project.



- 37. That the applicant agrees to identify on the construction plans an at-grade pedestrian connection to the south, at 105/107 Padgette Lane, that is handicap accessible.
- 38. That the applicant is encouraged to lease to locally-owned businesses and businesses receiving funds from the Town's revolving loan fund.
- 39. That the applicant must maintain, at a minimum, an amount of vegetation on site consistent with the planting plan on Sheet L100 of the CUP plans. It is recognized that the species and types of plantings may change over time due to availability, but at no time may the amount of plantings fall below what is represented in the planting table.
- 40. That the Appearance Commission approves an alternative design for buildings B and C in accordance with the designs and details included in the CUP plans. Per the plans, the glazing shall not be reduced below 64% on ground floor and 28.3% for upper floors for Building B and 69% on ground floor and 26.8% for upper floors for Building C.
- 41. That the Appearance Commission shall conduct a courtesy-level review of the final architectural details and materials choices for buildings B and C prior to issuance of a building permit.
- 42. That the applicant shall strive to reduce heat-island effects by including plantings on a minimum of 10% of the pedestrian plaza area with a minimum of 20% canopy, as well as including shade trees and cool paving materials.
- 43. That the applicant also shall strive to reduce heat-island effects by using high-reflectance paving materials in lieu of dark brick or asphalt. In addition, the applicant shall strive to provide shading devices to reduce heat on building surfaces and pavements and use solar-reflective roofing materials.
- 44. That the applicant shall involve a LEED accredited professional with the ongoing design of the project and will use as many green building techniques as possible in their plans (for example: low impact design and development, resource efficiency, energy efficiency, water conservation and reuse, indoor environmental quality, homeowner education, etc.) and that the applicant shall utilize the LEED Green and Sustainable Buildings Checklist as a means of quantifying its contribution to sustainability.
- 45. That the applicant shall include at least one shower in multi-tenant office buildings for office tenant use. Accordingly, the building permit plans for each building containing multi-tenant office space must include at least one shower facility before the building permit may be issued.
- 46. That the applicant shall incorporate passive solar space heating and cooling principals into building design as consistent with the site plan.
- 47. That the applicant agrees to continue to explore solar power options, especially for hot water.
- 48. That the applicant agrees to provide some bicycle racks on the sidewalk in the public right-of-way along East Main Street as long as the Town of Carrboro and NCDOT agree with the request, and that the applicant agrees to phase in the installation of bike racks as construction progresses rather than waiting until all construction is complete.
- 49. That the applicant agrees that the central pedestrian walkway is closed to non-emergency vehicular traffic.
- 50. That distinctive paving material shall be used in pedestrian areas of the 300 E. Main project and these materials shall continue south and lead into The Butler condominium project.
- 51. That where pedestrian links from 300 E. Main to The Butler condominiums cross vehicular ways the crosswalks shall be distinctively marked and raised.



This permit shall automatically expire within two years of the date of issuance if the use has not commenced or less than 10 percent (10%) of total cost of construction has been completed or there has been non-compliance with any other requirements of Section 15-62 of the Carrboro Land Use Ordinance.

All street construction on those streets proposed for acceptance by the Town of Carrboro shall be certified by an engineer. Engineering certification is the inspection by the developer's engineer of the street's subgrade, base material, asphalt paving, sidewalks and curb and gutter, when used. The developer's engineer shall be responsible for reviewing all compaction tests that are required for streets to be dedicated to the town. The developer's engineer shall certify that all work has been constructed to the town's construction specifications.

If this permit authorizes development on a tract of land in excess of one acre, nothing authorized by the permit may be done until the property owner properly executes and returns to the Town of Carrboro the attached acknowledgment of the issuance of this permit so that the town may have it recorded in the Orange County Registry.

With respect to phased development (see Section 15-61), this requirement shall apply only to the first phase.
- (b) If, after some physical alteration to land or structures begins to take place, such work is discontinued for a period (i) of one year if the date of discontinuance occurs more than one year after the issuance of the permit, or (ii) equal to two years less the time between the issuance of the permit and the time work is discontinued if the date of discontinuance occurs less than one year after the issuance of the permit, then the permit authorizing such work shall immediately expire. However, expiration of the permit shall not affect the provisions of Section 15-63.
- (c) The permit-issuing authority may extend for a period up to two years the date when a permit would otherwise expire pursuant to subsections (a) and (b) if it concludes that (i) the permit has not yet expired, (ii) the permit recipient has proceeded with due diligence and in good faith, and (iii) conditions have not changed so substantially as to warrant a new application. Successive extensions may be granted for periods of up to two years upon the same findings. All such extensions may be granted without resort to the formal processes and fees required for a new permit. (AMENDED 06/23/15)
- (d) For purposes of this section, a permit within the jurisdiction of the Board of Aldermen or the board of adjustment is issued when such board votes to approve the application and issue the permit. A permit within the jurisdiction of the zoning administrator is issued when the earlier of the following takes place: (AMENDED 11/10/81)
 - (1) A copy of the fully executed permit is delivered to the permit recipient, and delivery is accomplished when the permit is hand delivered or mailed to the permit applicant; or
 - (2) The zoning administrator notifies the permit applicant that the application has been approved and that all that remains before a fully executed permit can be delivered is for the applicant to take certain specified actions, such as having the permit executed by the property owner so it can be recorded if required under G.S. 15-46(c).
- (e) Notwithstanding any of the provisions of Article VIII (Nonconforming Situations), this section shall be applicable to permits issued prior to the date this section becomes effective.

TOWN OF CARRBORO TOWN COUNCIL Recruitment and Appointment Policy

Adoption: 11/21/2017, Amended 12-4-2018, 4-13-21

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish a policy and procedures whereby the Town Council will make appointments to public advisory boards, committees, commissions, councils, and taskforces (hereinafter "boards"). The Board shall also establish a policy and procedures whereby the Board makes appointments to public authorities that have Carrboro representatives or are Town of Carrboro Authorities.

Composition

The Town of Carrboro Town Council shall appoint all voting and non-voting members to boards. The Town Council shall endeavor to appoint members who represent the ethnic, cultural, demographic, and geographic diversity of the community. The Town Council has a goal of promoting racial and ethnic diversity on advisory boards. To the extent possible, the Town Clerk will bring forth applications that will expand the racial and ethnic composition of the existing advisory board. If no applications exist that will expand the racial and ethnic diversity of the advisory board, the Town Clerk shall notify the Town Council of the lack of racially or ethnically diverse applicants and at such time request that the Town Council work to recruit additional applicants. If the advisory board must have appointments due to membership numbers resulting in a lack of quorum, the Town Clerk shall bring forth applications regardless of the racial and ethnic diversity of applicants and request that the Town Council make the appointments. The Town Council should consider the following when making appointments:

Authority

The North Carolina General Statutes, the Town of Carrboro Charter, the Town of Carrboro Town Code and the Town of Carrboro Land Use Ordinance provide the enabling legislation for the Town's Boards.

Periodic Review

This policy may be changed or adjusted as deemed necessary by the Board. The Town Clerk shall review the policy and make sure the policy is up-to-date.

Recruitment and Appointment Process

- a. Prior to the annual February term expirations, and when midterm vacancies occur, the Town Clerk will advertise that the town is accepting applications for upcoming openings on advisory boards and commissions.
- b. Applications will be taken until all seats are filled. Applications received after the seat(s) have been filled will be placed on file by the Town Clerk and held for future vacancies for a period of 12 months. If vacancies exist on other boards, the Town Clerk will let the applicant know of those vacancies. If interested, applicants will be encouraged to apply. Midterm vacancies shall be filled from applications on file without special advertising efforts unless requested by the Town Council.
- c. All new candidates must complete an application to be considered for appointment.
- d. Currently serving advisory board members, whose first full terms are expiring in February, will be contacted by the Town Clerk and asked if they would like to be considered for reappointment. If so, no new application is needed from the member. The Town Clerk shall report to the Board Chair that the member wishes to be reappointed. The Chair shall provide the recommendation/review form for the current member to the Town Council, just as with new applicants.
- e. The Town Clerk will notify all applicants of receipt of his/her application.
- f. The Town Clerk shall forward copies of applications to the advisory board chairs as soon as possible after receiving an application.
- g. Each chair shall contact each applicant and invite them to at least one meeting of their board so they may understand the responsibilities of the board and the necessary time commitment. (Chairs should contact Town staff in the event of a language barrier.) The chairs shall also talk with the applicants about their interest in serving on the

advisory board. Board chairs may meet personally with applicants if a meeting of their board is not anticipated within 30 days following receipt of the applicant's request for appointment. This would be in lieu of having the applicant attend a meeting of that board or commission. If applicants do not attend a meeting after two phone calls or emails, then the Chair shall notify the Town Clerk of that fact and said application will be removed from further consideration.

- h. The chair of each board shall submit a Review Form to the Town Clerk within one week of the applicant's attendance at a meeting. If a meeting is not planned, the chair shall provide a Review Form to the Town Clerk within one week of a conversation with the applicant.
- i. Copies of all applications and recommendation forms received shall be forwarded to the Mayor and Town Council pursuant to the goals expressed in the Composition section above.
- j. If there are no applicants for the Board in question, the Chair may contact applicants that have applied for other boards. Board chairs should contact the Town Clerk to obtain these applications.
- k. If a Chair Form has not been received from board chairs within three weeks after being forwarded from the Town Clerk, the Town Clerk shall contact the chair and request a status report.
- I. By March 1, the Mayor and Town Council shall endeavor to make appointments to boards and commissions to fill annual expired terms.
- m. The Mayor and Town Council shall endeavor to make appointments to unexpired terms with vacant seats within one month of the Town Clerk receiving application(s).
- n. Appointments to unexpired terms of 12 or fewer months will be simultaneously appointed to the following 3-year term.
- o. As a presumptive policy, the Town Council will not appoint a person to serve on multiple advisory boards or commissions at the same time. However, the Council retains the discretion to make exceptions to this policy. (Amended 4-10-18)

APPOINTMENTS TO AUTHORITIES

The OWASA Board of Directors and Tourism Development Authority are considered "Authorities" under NC General Statutes. The Town Council will consider applications for those authorities and be responsible for making appointments as they are directed per law. The Council may at times choose to interview applicants for the representative seats by any method that they choose. All appointments will be made in open session by the ballot procedures established in the policy.

Advisory Board Appointment Method

The Town Clerk shall provide an information matrix, related to composition information as shown above, for the Town Council to consider when there are more applications than open seats available. The Town Council may also request further information from the Town Clerk as it desires.

Unless the Town Council agrees by majority vote or consensus to follow another procedure, the Council shall use the following procedure to appoint individuals to various subordinate boards and offices:

Voting Method

- a. The Town Clerk will provide a ballot listing the names of all applicants presented in the agenda packet to each Council Member.
- b. Prior to voting, the Council shall open the floor for discussion of the applications.
- c. Each Council Member shall sign their name to the ballot and indicate their choice in candidate(s) by marking next to the candidate(s) name.
- d. Each Council Member will vote only for the number of candidates that there are vacant seats to fill.
- e. The Clerk shall collect the ballots and announce the candidate(s) receiving the highest number of votes and indicate the position that each candidate has been appointed to fill.
- f. The Town Clerk shall then read into the record the names of the candidates receiving the highest number of votes. The Town Council shall then make appointments per motion and second. The minutes shall indicate fully the written and verbal voting record of each Council Member.

Terms (Amended 12-4-18)

- a. Members are appointed to staggering three-year terms on all advisory boards that expire annually in February. The Carrboro Tourism Development Authority members are appointed to one-year terms that expire annually in January.
- b. Members are limited to two full terms. After completing two full terms, a member must take off one year before applying for re-appointment to the advisory board. However, a board member may apply to serve on another advisory board if he/she desires. The Town Council may make exceptions to this rule under the following circumstances:
 - 1. To retain diversity on an advisory board;
 - 2. A lack of applicants.

Attendance

- a. The chair or staff liaison of each board or commission shall notify the Town Clerk on an as needed basis if there are members that are presenting attendance problems.
- b. Unless the chair waives the requirement, members shall be removed if they are absent from three consecutive meetings or if they miss more than 30% of the meetings during a 12-month period. The Town Clerk shall notify the chair in writing as soon as a member becomes subject to removal under this section. The chair will have 10 days after receipt of such notice to waive the removal. If the chair fails to notify the Town Clerk in writing within ten days after receipt of such notice that the automatic removal requirement should be waived, the Town Clerk will send a removal notice to the member. This removal shall be effective on the date of such notice.

Resignations

a. Resignations must be submitted in writing via email to the chair, the staff liaison, or the Town Clerk. If the resignation is submitted to the chair or the staff liaison they should forward the resignation to the Town Clerk as soon as possible.

Section 3-24.16 Climate Action Team

- (a) There shall be a Climate Action Team (CAT) consisting of nine members appointed by the Town Council. Members shall be residents, business owners, or employees in the Town or extraterritorial planning jurisdiction or the Town's joint planning transition area. All such members shall be interested in or have expertise relevant to the duties of the CAT. At least one member should have experience related to community organizing or environmental justice. One seat should be reserved for a Carrboro resident currently enrolled in public, private, or home school at the high school level.
- (b) Members may be removed as follows:
- (1) The chairperson shall file or cause to be filed with the Town Clerk an attendance report after each meeting identifying those members who were present or absent.
- (2) Unless the chairperson waives the requirement, members shall be removed if they are absent from two consecutive meetings or events, if they miss more than three meetings during a twelve-month period, or for failure to participate in at least one outreach event during the calendar year. The Town Clerk shall notify the chairperson in writing as soon as a member becomes subject to removal under this section. The chairperson will have ten days after receipt of such notice to waive the removal. If the chairperson fails to notify the Town Clerk in writing within ten days after receipt of such notice that the automatic removal requirement should be waived, the Town Clerk will send a removal notice to the member. This removal shall be effective on the date of such notice.
- (3) Members may also be removed by the appointing authority after a hearing for any good cause related to performance of duty.
- (c) One liaison shall be appointed by the Council every year at, or shortly after, the Town Council's organizational meeting when other appointments to advisory boards, commissions, or committees are made.

(d) CAT members shall be appointed for three-year staggered terms, but members may

continue to serve until their successors have been appointed. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired terms only.

Section 3-24.17 Meetings and Officers of CAT

- (a) The CAT shall establish a yearly meeting schedule of the following meetings:
- (1) Up to four in-person meetings
- (2) Up to four virtual meetings, as determined by staff to plan outreach events
- (3) At least two community outreach events
- (4) Special meetings as necessary

All meetings shall be open to the public and notification of such meetings shall conform to the requirements of the Open Meetings Law.

- (b) A quorum shall be present for the CAT to take official action and all actions shall be taken by majority vote. A quorum shall consist of five members if all seats on the CAT are filled and four members if there are one or more vacancies on the board.
- (c) The CAT shall select one of its members to serve as chair and one member to serve as vice-chair. These officers will be chosen annually at the CAT's first meeting in January and shall serve for terms of one year unless their terms of appointment to the CAT sooner expire. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term only. A member may be selected to serve as chair for not more than two consecutive full one-year terms. The chair and vice-chair may take part in all deliberations and vote on all issues.

Section 3-24.18 Powers and Duties of CAT

The Climate Action Team may:

- (a) Provide expertise and input on implementation of the Community Climate Action
 Plan and municipal Energy and Climate Protection Plan. CAT members will have the
 opportunity to provide feedback on the yearly environmental sustainability work plan and
 ongoing climate action initiatives as requested by staff. CAT members will analyze
 climate action initiatives with particular attention to race and equity, building on the
 recommendation for considering social justice and equity in the Community Climate
 Action Plan.
- (b) Actively participate in the design, organization, and implementation of community

outreach events. At these events, CAT members will educate and engage Carrboro residents in Town climate action initiatives.

- (c) One of the most important duties for CAT members will be participation in the community outreach events. CAT members shall participate in at least one outreach event each calendar year.

In my background as a PhD student and now PhD Candidate in public health (health behavior specialty), I believe that I have been trained in many of the skills that would be helpful to the Town's Climate Action Team and Climate Action Plan agenda and implementation. I have five years of training in both quantitative and qualitative data collection and analysis, which means that I am familiar with a variety of methods for collecting and analyzing data - including when evaluating the impact of a particular program or intervention, like those proposed in the Climate Action Plan. Reasons You Wish to be Appointed*

Climate change is the most urgent world problem that we face today - everyday it goes unaddressed, the problem not only remains but it actually worsens as carbon emissions continue to increase. The consequences of climate change will impact every community, including Carrboro. Both our community culture and infrastructure need to improve so that our actions are not further contributing to the climate crisis and we are prepared to best serve our citizens through any of climate change's severe effects (flooding, droughts, etc). As a scientist who has strived to educate myself on multiple aspects of climate change and climate change solutions, I feel that it is my moral obligation to share my knowledge with others who have the power to make change. Though Carrboro is only one town, it is already an example to many other places of what a walkable, diverse, community-oriented town can be. As such, Carrboro should also be an environmentally-conscious leader and continuously strive towards zero fossil fuel emissions and no environmental pollution. I know that my experience and academic expertise on climate change and environmental actions can provide the Town Council with creative idea proposals for how to continuously improve the environmental and climate actions that we take.

We believe as a Town and as a Town Council that racial equity and diversity and inclusion are important. Please tell us your thoughts about this and why they are important not only in advisory board/commission work but also in all facets of local government and community work.*

Diversity is the key for well-thought-out policy solutions that truly are innovative and consider community culture. As a white upper-middle-class woman from a metropolitan area (Raleigh), it is important for me to understand the challenges facing poorer minority communities by listening to and working with individuals from these communities. Without working with diverse individuals who are different than me, I would not know whether my policy proposals would be accepted and well-liked by ALL residents, especially people who are different than myself. I recognize that not everyone has the same upbringing and life experience as myself, and that some climate solutions that may work for me might not work for everyone. I saw this firsthand when working with the Navajo Nation community as part of my EPA research on novel heating stoves for communities with high rates of asthma. When I first learned that indoor wood-burning stoves that heated Navajo homes were responsible for damaging lung effects, my first thought was to electrify each home's heating system so that there would be no indoor emissions. However, after discussing this possible solution with members of the Navajo Nation, the Navajo told my team that electricity is considered potentially dangerous in their Native culture and "to be used with caution" because it is derived from lightning. Had my team attempted to electrify all Navajo homes without first discussing the feasibility and public response that we could expect from this solution, we would not have understood why members of the community might be reluctant to use their new emission-free electric heating systems. This type of insider knowledge from diverse communities is invaluable to assessing the feasibility of community projects and policy ideas and creating solutions that work for ALL members of our communities. Everyone in our community has a different lived experience, and diversity in decision-making is crucial to creating successful policies. Also, as individuals in a position of power, it is not only our duty to provide opportunity for all, but to actively empower minorities to participate in government and community work. By utilizing racial equity tools and ensuring diversity in our work, Town Council can better serve its people.

INFORMATION: A nine-member Board of Directors governs OWASA. The Chapel Hill Town Council appoints five, the Carrboro Town Council appoints two, and the Orange County Board of Commissioners appoints two Board Members. The OWASA Board adopts the annual budget; sets rates, fees and charges based on cost-of-service principles; approves bond issues to fund capital projects; makes policy decisions; and appoints the Executive Director, General Counsel and independent auditor.

The Town of Carrboro has two seats on the Orange Water and Sewer Authority Board of Directors. Currently, Yinka Ayankoya is Carrboro's representative and there is one vacant seat. Robert Morgan's second and last term expired on June 30, 2021 and was ineligible for reappointment. Appointments to full terms are for three years.

Applications were received from Melody Kramer, Emily Oglesby, and Katherine Baer, and Joe Brown.

Ballots will be emailed to the Town Council.

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A COMMUNITY SAFETY TASK FORCE

WHEREAS, on June 18, 2020, the Town Council approved "A Resolution on Next Steps in Advancing Racial Equity in Law Enforcement and Public Safety in Carrboro"; and

WHEREAS, Section 5 of that resolution expressed the Town Council's intent "to establish a task force on public safety, in the interest of developing new approaches to public safety beyond policing"; and recognized that "investments in public safety and in programs and services that keep communities healthy and safe must advance racial equity, be grounded in community demands, and be informed by authentic engagement with grassroots and community organizations"; and

WHEREAS, Council Members Seils, Haven-O'Donnell, and Slade worked together to draft a charge for the task force;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council hereby establishes a "Community Safety Task Force" with the following charge:

Section 1. Background: In a resolution on June 18, 2020, the Town Council expressed its intent to establish a task force on public safety, "in the interest of developing new approaches to public safety beyond policing." The Town Council recognized that "investments in public safety and in programs and services that keep communities healthy and safe must advance racial equity, be grounded in community demands, and be informed by authentic engagement with grassroots and community organizations."

Section 2. Purpose: The Community Safety Task Force will consider a range of issues related to the safety and well-being of Carrboro residents, including but not limited to law enforcement and court diversion and deflection programs; alternatives to relying on the Town's public safety professionals for human service and wellness needs; and coordination with the County and other jurisdictions to enhance programs and services that keep communities safe. Through a series of shared learning sessions, the task force will review and educate the public about existing institutional and community-based public safety and wellness resources; and learn from residents and experts about immediate and long-term safety needs and interests that can be

more substantially addressed and met through alternative resources. The task force will provide recommendations to the Town Council for additional services to enhance community safety and well-being that rely on prevention and intervention strategies as alternatives to policing and the criminal legal system—including but not limited to community nonviolence and de-escalation training programs; domestic violence intervention and prevention; youth-oriented programs; on-call crisis response that would allow certain calls for police assistance to be handled by other trained professionals, such as social workers or crisis counselors; and other related approaches.

Section 3. Structure: The membership of the task force shall consist of 5 to 7 residents of Carrboro, appointed by the Town Council, who have professional expertise and/or lived experience in the criminal legal system, human services delivery, social work, public health and harm reduction, community building in marginalized populations, or related content areas. The membership of the task force shall also include 2 to 3 council members designated by the Town Council. A staff resource team will assist in the work of the task force. This team will consist of staff liaisons, designated by the town manager, from the Housing and Community Development Department, the Police Department, the Recreation, Parks & Cultural Resources Department, and/or other staff as determined by the manager.

Section 4. Timeline: Within 12 months after the initial appointment of its members, the task force shall submit its recommendations to the Town Council. Alternatively, if the task force determines that it needs more time to complete its work, the task force may extend its timeline up to six months and shall notify the Town Council of the extension.

I have years of involvement in public health research, focusing on social determinants of health. I have worked as a counselor in clinic with individuals seeking outpatient care for HIV treatment. For the past year, I have worked on a helpdesk to link pregnant and parenting individuals to social services for a number of issues related to COVID (employment, legal, and physical and mental health concerns). I have been active with NAMI NC and NAMI Family-to-Family groups to navigate mental health services, legal involvement, law enforcement interaction, and compassionate communication with a sibling with mental illness. In April, my brother was pursued by law enforcement for issuing a threat on my father, a pursuit that ultimately ended in the death of my family and two unrelated/unwitting officers called for a welfare check on my parents.

We need law enforcement to be proactive to prevent harm, to protect individuals' and communities' safety. This must involve taking community members seriously, communicating effectively within and between departments, and de-escalating whenever possible, through crisis negotiation (which could involve family members) and non-lethal force. My brother's worst fears became reality when he was pursued by police openly, given the opportunity to flee, and then surrounded the following day with military vehicles. Law enforcement being seen as an aggressor and a threat for so many (myself included at times, and I'm a white girl), has been an issue on my mind for years now. But since my brother became ill, and I realized there was no real way to get him into care as an adult without law enforcement involvement, it seemed an impossible situation. Something waiting to go wrong. I don't believe it has to be that way. I don't know if CIT training is enough. But the trainings that exist at least need to be taken seriously. I don't know what a solution looks like, frankly. But I will be working to find a better solution, probably for the rest of my life.

As I wrote above, one of the major requirements for public safety, to me, is that those with the most power must listen to the people who are affected. Listening to "civilians" and taking us seriously when we voice their needs is the only way to understand our needs. With respect to racial equity and inclusion, we cannot expect decisions developed through a power disparity to promote respect and concern with the needs of marginalized people. Actively lifting the voices of those historically and presently disregarded in our society is the only way to even begin to close that power gap and attend to holistic community safety and welfare that benefits everyone.

In importance, my personal life experiences are most relevant, and my professional experiences come second. I have 3 sons and have been a single mother for the last 7 years living in Carolina Apartments in Carrboro. I have been a repeated victim of domestic violence and have extensive experience with the NC family legal system, Orange County Social Services, and Compass Center for Women and Families. My son's have special needs and I have been taking care of the children of lowincome single parents in the Community since I was 17 years old, and am still close with them today. This includes many mothers in recovery from addiction. I have had the unusual experience of being part of many subgroups and cultures within our area. As a young adult, I was involved in a group formed to practice the traditions of our ancestors. We had traditional sweat lodges, I learned to make beaded jewelry, honor women's moon time, and I went to Pow Wows throughout NC. From 1997-2002, I was an active member of the Chapel Hill Zen Center. I grew up in a family of civil rights activists and was raised to fight against racism and work for racial equity. In 2003, my African dance teacher asked me to perform with her at a Kwanzaa celebration in Cary, NC. I have provided a home for the homeless, including recovering addicts getting back on their feet, my son's friend who is a refugee from Liberia for 6 months, and my son's friend from Oakland, CA who is Latino for 3 months. My current neighbors are from all over the world, and I have developed very close relationships with many of the families. Immigrant families and refugees from Syria, Burma, Kenya, Vietnam, Mexico, El Salvador, Guatemala, Rwanda, the list goes on. In May 2021, I completed the APTP (Anti Police Terror Project) First Responders training. In June, I participated in the APTP regional virtual summit: We Take Care Of Us: A Deep Dive Into The Movement to Decriminalize Mental Health & Skin Color. I regularly attend their online meetings and demonstrations. Since April 2021, I have virtually attended all the Oakland, CA City Council meetings, including special sessions, to specifically address police violence targeting black and brown people, and the responsibility of local government to stop funding the police, ask POC in the Community what they need to feel safe, and provide the funds and resources to community-led organizations that provide effective alternatives to policing. I volunteered 3 times a week in a Head Start classroom in Chapel Hill during my junior and senior years of high school. I was a teacher assistant at Glenwood Elementary School in 1991 with a diverse class of students, from Korea, Yugoslavia, Napal, Pakistan, Poland, white students from The Oaks, and black students from low-income housing and the homeless shelter. I helped open one of the first Early Head Start child care centers in Orange County in 1997. I have over 15 years of experience working with OC EHS/HS. I was involved in helping active addicts and supporting those in recovery for 20 years, and still provide support when presented with the opportunity. My last teaching position was as a CHCCS Head Start Pre-K EC Teacher Assistant and participated in all the CHCCS equity training during 2020-21. Through my experiences, I have a deep and wide perspective of the needs of underrepresented people in Carrboro, and the negative effects of policing. Having been a student, mother of students, and teacher in CHCCS, along with the personal and professional relationships I have with so many different people in our community, I see how racism is embedded in the system and the many issues that need reform. I have many long-term trusting relationships with POC throughout Carrboro, and those connections will continue to inform me as I learn how best to make their voices heard and lift them up. I believe the words of Fannie Lou Hamer, "Until I'm free, you are not free either."

Reasons You Wish to be Appointed*

On April 19th, 2021, my oldest son's best friend's older brother was killed by police officers in Alameda, CA. My son's friend is named Jerry and he lived with us through the summer in 2020. Jerry is part of our family. His brother's name was Mario Gonzalez, and he was murdered by police as seen in the bodycam footage. I can't put into words my feelings about it. I have always been active in racial equity issues, but my focus is now centered around developing local community alternatives to police. The more I have learned, the more imperative it is to reform law enforcement practices and invest in alternatives to policing that actually keep our communities safe. I don't ever want any family to lose a loved one like Mario Gonzalez's family did. I want to prevent that from happening in my community. I have so many loved ones who are black and brown, people that are family to me, family to my children. I am terrified for them every day because I see the dangers they face, and the way the system of law enforcement in this country traumatizes them every single day. So often, good intentions do not end up with the intended results. I want to be sure the voices of those most negatively affected by police violence, lead the discussion.


One of my favorite children's books is called, "A Rainbow of Friends." The majority of my teaching career, I have worked with very diverse families and colleagues. In early childhood education, we understand the value of diversity and teaching cultural awareness and acceptance. All family cultures are represented in the classroom, so that every child and their family feels that they belong. I taught at Kidscope Early Learning Center in Chapel Hill, and one year none of the children in my class were white (African American, from Mexico, Egypt, and Burma). The majority of my teaching colleagues have been African American, Latina, or Asian. Being in the role as the minority in these situations has taught me so much more about the value of diversity and valuing different perspectives. Overrepresentation by any one group of people is not the best way to serve the entire community which is the role of local government.

Summary

The purpose of this memo is to provide the Council with a progress report on implementation of the Energy and Climate Protection Plan (ECPP), adopted May 28, 2014, and the Community Climate Action Plan (CCAP), adopted January 24, 2017. Both plans were updated in 2020 with an 80% reduction goal in per capita greenhouse emissions by 2030. Town staff are examining and pursuing several initiatives to reach the emissions reductions goals.

Staff have continued to implement the ECPP through the Facilities Rehabilitation and Renovation Project and greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions inventories.

Recent CCAP implementation measures include progress on the installation of two electric vehicle (EV) charging stations on Town property and the submission of two proposals to the Orange County Community Climate Action Grant Program. The proposals requested funding for solar photovoltaic panels and a green roof for the 203 Project as well as funding for a part-time staff member to monitor organics collection at the Carrboro Farmers' Market.

Additionally, staff are working to implement the green neighborhoods grant program and a transportation demand management project as well as finalizing guidelines and protocols for an independent invasive species removal volunteer program. Staff have also completed an update to the Town Code to allow for Managed Natural Landscapes and will perform outreach for this initiative.

Energy and Climate Protection Plan

Facilities Rehabilitation and Renovation

• Policy Connections: ECPP Section 2.B.i: Building Assessments and Ratings

Jim Spencer Architects, PA and Sud Associates, PA provided reports to the Town Council in spring 2021 with information regarding proposed conditions for Town Hall, the Century Center, and Public Works facilities, as well as the energy analysis and preliminary recommendations

regarding moving these facilities toward net zero. After incorporating feedback from the Town Council and staff, they will revise and present the final report to the Council.

Municipal and Community Greenhouse Gas Inventories

• *Policy Connections*: ECPP Section 4 (Measurement, Inventory, Assessment, and Reporting).

University of North Carolina graduate student Jacob Becker recently worked to update Carrboro's municipal and community greenhouse gas inventories for his Master's Project. To ensure consistency, he utilized the software program used by students to complete the 2012 inventory. The software program, ClearPath, employs the Global Protocol for Community-Scale Greenhouse Gas Emission Inventories (GPC), developed by ICLEI along with the World Resources Institute and the C40 Cities Climate Leadership Group.

The results from Mr. Becker's analysis comparing municipal and community emissions from 2009, 2012, and 2019 are shown in Table 1 below. Greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions were measured in metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent (CO2eq).



Total community emissions have decreased 4% since 2012. There has been a 11% decrease in per capita emissions since 2012 and municipal emissions have decreased 23% in this time period. Vehicle emissions increased 23% due to an increase in miles driven in Carrboro. Emissions from electricity and natural gas decreased by 14% due to changes in the electric grid, however, overall energy usage increased by 6% due to an increase in natural gas usage.

In each of the three inventoried years, residential and commercial electricity use are responsible for most GHG emissions, followed by transportation and gas heat. At the municipal level,

emissions from electricity usage and gas heat produce the most emissions, followed by transit and vehicle use. Emissions from solid waste account for ~1% total GHG emissions.



In addition, Mr. Becker performed an analysis to account for fugitive methane emissions created from the entire lifecycle of natural gas production, transmission, storage, and downstream distribution. Methane (CH₄) is a more potent greenhouse gas than carbon dioxide. Using research by Dr. Robert Howarth on estimated methane leak rates, Mr. Becker found that the additional methane emissions for 2019 are equal to 8,650 metric tons CO₂eq.


These emissions are classified as Scope 3 emissions using the GPC. The GPC distinguishes between emissions that physically occur within the city (scope 1), from those that occur outside the city but are driven by activities taking place within the city's boundaries (scope 3), from those that occur from the use of electricity, steam, and/or heating/cooling supplied by grids which may or may not cross city boundaries (scope 2). Staff are also working to finalize a report which quantifies additional scope 3 emissions related to dietary habits of Carrboro residents.

Staff utilized Mr. Becker's analysis to further explore emissions in Carrboro.

After the streetlight change out to LED lights was completed in late 2019, average monthly energy usage dropped from 65,000 kWh/month to 30,000 kWh/month, resulting in approximately 54% reduction in streetlight emissions.

Town Fleet Alternative Fuels Exploration

• Policy Connections: ECPP Section 2.C (Fleet Replacement and Efficiency)

Town staff will work to utilize \$100,000 in the FY21-22 budget on a study to evaluate alternatives and options to convert the Town fleet to a new fuel source to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Staff have planned an initial meeting with a small group of employees and will move to a larger group as scoping continues. Staff will review examples from other communities and create a preliminary draft Request for Proposals (RFP). Staff will bring the draft RFP to the Council for scoping this winter.

Community Integration

Climate Action Team (CAT)

• *Policy Connections:* CCAP Community Integration Recommendation #5: Expand Capacity

The Town Council adopted a Town Code Amendment to create the Climate Action Team on October 20, 2020. The Town Clerk is promoting open seats and collecting applications for this advisory board. Per direction from Town Council members, the Town Clerk will bring applications to the Council for consideration when diversity among applicants is addressed.

Green Neighborhoods Grant Program

 Policy Connections: CCAP Community Integration Recommendation #3: Create Participatory Green Neighborhood Budgeting Program to Reduce Carbon Emissions, Build Community, Save Money, and Reallocate Savings to New Green Project Initiatives

Staff have incorporated comments from the Town Council into the program and are currently planning to move forward with an outreach campaign this fall. Environmental Advisory Board members discussed the program during summer meetings and provided input on outreach strategies. Staff plan to utilize approaches employed by the Town during the development of the Comprehensive Plan. Staff are also working to finalize financial documents for the program.

Modules Project

 Policy Connections: CCAP Community Integration Recommendation #5: Expand Capacity

Staff have been working with members of the community to create a library of modules to share with the public and local partners. Four modules have been reviewed by the Environmental Advisory Board and edited by volunteers and staff. These modules discuss transportation, ecosystems, composting, and food choices.

Orange County Community Climate Action Grant Program

• *Policy Connections:* CCAP Buildings Recommendation #1: 80% Challenge; Ecosystem Recommendation #3: Accelerate/Expand Organic Waste Collection/Composting; ECPP Recommendation 3.C: Renewable Portfolio

Staff submitted two proposals to this program in July 2021 to fund several projects, involving solar photovoltaic panels and a green roof for the 203 Project, as well as staffing the Carrboro Farmers' Market organics collection/composting. Staff expect notification of proposal status this fall.

Building Energy Efficiency Measures

Energy Efficiency Revolving Loan Fund (EERLF)

 Policy Connections: Buildings Recommendation #1: Reduce Emissions Attributed to Carrboro Buildings by 80% by 2030, #2: Energy Audit/Performance Rating; Community Integration Recommendation #4: Integrate Climate Action with Local Living Economy, #6: Facilitate Low Cost Financing for Energy Efficiency & Renewable Energy Projects

Staff have held meetings and discussions regarding the planned updates to this program. Staff are now working to draft new program guidelines and will also examine opportunities to leverage this funding with larger-scale Federal programs.

Housing and Community Services

Policy Connections: Buildings Recommendation #1: Reduce Emissions Attributed to Carrboro Buildings by 80% by 2030

Last year, the Town supported five new projects, homes owned by low-income seniors in Carrboro. The repairs were emergent in scope. They addressed: non- or poorly-operating HVAC systems, severe plumbing and electrical issues, poorly fitting doors, and critical modifications to allow the homeowner to age in place.

The Town also supported the rehab of 12 apartment units owned by Empowerment, Inc. The majority of the work was focused on renovating kitchens and bathrooms, including replacing older plumbing fixtures with low-flow fixtures, installing shower and toilet shut off valves, and installing water efficient toilets.

Finally, the Town supported the rehab of 1700 North Greensboro St. This house will provide 7 units of permanent supported housing in Carrboro. Energy efficient features include:

- LED lighting and occupancy sensors in each room.
- Replace windows with low-E windows.
- Update insulation from R-30 to R-38.
- Energy star appliances in the kitchen and laundry room.
- Low flow plumbing fixtures.

Transportation

Volkswagen (VW) Settlement Phase 1 – Level 2 Charging Station

• *Policy Connections*: ECPP Goals; CCAP Transportation Recommendation #1: Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions from Motor Vehicle Use by 80% by 2030.

The North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality has offered all applicants an extension on agreements for electric vehicle (EV) charging stations. Staff are working to finalize station installation and ensure all grant requirements are met. Stations will be operating by spring 2022.

EV Charging Stations Priority Analysis

• *Policy Connections*: ECPP Goals; CCAP Transportation Recommendation #1: Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions from Motor Vehicle Use by 50% by 2025.

Staff are working with employees from other local jurisdictions to discuss a county-wide Geographic Information Systems (GIS) analysis to prioritize locations of EV charging stations in order to ensure a well-planned network of stations around Orange County. This analysis will allow staff to be prepared for future funding opportunities. Town staff have discussed performing a Carrboro-specific analysis as well.

Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Grant – Fresh Starts Project

• *Policy Connections:* CCAP Transportation Recommendation #4: Further Promote Walking, Biking, Transit

Project partners held a kickoff meeting for this project in July 2021. The Center for Advanced Hindsight (CAH) created surveys for all partners to assist with alignment on project goals, timeline, and data. CAH has initiated their ethics process by providing a description of the project to their Institutional Review Board (IRB). The IRB will ensure the research is well-thought-out from an ethics perspective and that any data is secured and participants are aware of the process. The project will proceed in six stages; welcome boxes will be delivered in February 2022 and field data will be collected March-May.

Contribution to Piedmont Electric Membership Corporation (PEMC) for Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging Station at Carrboro Plaza

• *Policy Connections*: ECPP Goals; CCAP Transportation Recommendation #1: Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions from Motor Vehicle Use by 50% by 2025.

The Town finalized a payment contributing towards PEMC's match for the grant in June 2021.

Walking School Bus

• *Policy Connections:* CCAP Transportation Recommendation #4: Further Promote Walking, Biking, Transit

Planning Department staff are working to organize a walking school bus for local students. Staff held an initial meeting with parents on September 23, 2021. The first Walking School Bus is planned for October 6th in conjunction with National Walk to School Day.

Land Use Ordinance Text Amendments

On June 8, 2021, the Town Council approved an ordinance to amend the existing parking standards in Article XVIII of the Land Use Ordinance to establish requirements for EV charging stations and EV-capable infrastructure.

Ecosystem Protection and Enhancement

NC Urban Forest Council Grant

 Policy Connections: Ecosystem Recommendation #4: Tree Preservation, Protection and Conservation; Ecosystem Recommendation #6: Pursue Watershed Restoration Actions to Protect Local Streams from Changes in Rainfall Due to Climate Change

Staff submitted the final project report in April 2021 and are currently finalizing related outreach materials. Staff will continue to monitor the health and condition of the trees and other plantings and replace and maintain vegetation as necessary.

Bee City USA, Mayors' Monarch Pledge

Staff held an outreach event at the Carrboro Farmers' Market over the summer to promote National Pollinator Week. Staff distributed educational materials related to pollinators and native plants and held a milkweed seed giveaway for residents in conjunction with the Mayors' Monarch Pledge.

In addition, staff organized a virtual movie showing of the film, *A Ghost in the Making:* Searching for the Rusty-Patched Bumble Bee. The rusty-patched bumble bee (Bombus affinis) pollinates wildflowers and crops such as apples and cranberries and is one of more than 4,000 bee species native to North America.

Rusty-patched bumble bees once ranged in grasslands throughout the east and upper midwestern U.S., but have declined by 87% in the last 20 years as a result of habitat loss, disease, intensive farming, pesticide use, and climate change. Due to this decline, the rusty-patched bumble bee was the first bee species in the continental U.S. to be listed on the Endangered Species List.

In March 2021, Mayor Lavelle joined the Mayors' Monarch Pledge. Staff are working to implement the program's monarch habitat and education commitments. In September 2021, Mayor Lavelle proclaimed October 2, 2021 as Mayors' Monarch Pledge Day and encouraged all residents to learn about and celebrate monarch conservation.

Invasive Species Volunteer Events

• *Policy Connections:* Ecosystem Recommendation #5: Improve Regulations and Community Capacity to Discourage Invasive Plants and Encourage Native Plants

The Town's Environmental Sustainability Coordinator has continued to supervise small monthly meet-ups at Wilson Park to control invasive species. Public Works staff have also worked to coordinate pickups to remove the vegetation.

Staff have developed a new volunteer program for independent volunteer work. This program will require volunteers to submit an application and hold an initial meeting with staff to discuss

project work area(s), plant identification, safety requirements, and communication procedures. Each instance of unsupervised project work will be approved by staff in several departments before volunteers can proceed. Volunteers will be required to purchase insurance in order to participate in the program and will need to submit reporting forms to staff after completing project work. Guidelines and requirements will be posted on the Town website for volunteers this fall.

On September 25th, the Carrboro High School Football Team volunteered to remove invasive species in Henry "Hank" Anderson III Community Park. Staff and additional resident volunteers worked with the team to successfully removed privet (*Ligustrum sinense*) and tree-of-heaven (*Ailanthus altissima*) from behind fields 1 and 2, piling the vegetation near the parking lot for Public Works staff. Staff wish to extend a thank you to all participants!

Composting Bin Sales

Town staff have launched composting bin sales and are working with the Town's Communications Director to promote the sales and perform additional outreach with a composting how-to video.

Managed Natural Landscape Ordinance

Town staff incorporated comments from the North Carolina Botanical Garden and New Hope Audubon Society as requested by the Town Council in October 2020. A new draft ordinance can be found as a consent item in the October 5th, 2021 agenda. Staff will perform outreach about the ordinance to Carrboro residents as part of Bee City USA and Mayors' Monarch Challenge implementation.

Food Choice Measures

Vegan Retirement Gathering

Town Human Resources staff held a farewell gathering for former Town Manager David Andrews. The menu at the event consisted entirely of vegan options, reducing the emissions associated with the meal. Approximately 80-90 employees and guests attended the event.

Build Dietary Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Emissions Profile

Using the 2019 CCAP survey's annual self-reported meat and dairy consumption among Carrboro residents, the Town's Environmental Sustainability Coordinator worked with Doctoral Candidate and Environmental Advisory Board (EAB) member Chrissie Schalkoff to perform an analysis of associated greenhouse gas emissions. Staff are currently working to discuss and finalize the report.
