CITY OF CHICO ANNOUNCES PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD FOR STATE FIRE MARSHAL FIRE HAZARD SEVERITY ZONE MAPS

CHICO, CA – March 13, 2025 – Under the guidance of the State Fire Marshal, the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) recently updated the Local Responsibility Area (LRA) Fire Hazard Severity Zone Maps. These maps are used for land use planning, enforcing building codes, and developing wildfire risk mitigation strategies. The City of Chico does not control the creation of fire hazard severity zone maps; however, we are responsible for facilitating public access to the proposed maps and hosting a public comment period to ensure the community has an opportunity to review and provide feedback, according to Government Code Section 51178.5.

Community input is important to address concerns and enhance understanding of how fire hazard severity zones affect residents, businesses, and emergency response planning. Following California Government Code Section 51179(a), local agencies must designate moderate, high, and very high fire severity zones within 120 days of receiving recommendations from the State Fire Marshal pursuant to Section 51178. Local governments are not permitted to adopt a map that lowers the fire hazard severity zone rating identified by the State Fire Marshal; we can only adopt a map as presented or modify it to increase the fire hazard severity zone level for a given area.

City of Chico residents are encouraged to review the proposed City of Chico LRA Fire Hazard Severity Zone Map before the 90-day window closes on **June 10, 2025**. Additional information is available on the <u>City of Chico Fire Department website</u>.
