The Work of the Pathways For Tomorrow Initiative Continues...

In 2022, HTS received a \$1 million five-year grant from The Lilly Endowment, Inc., to address critical challenges in preparing pastoral leaders for the future.

As the 2025-26 academic year begins, the PFT team remains focused on its four focus areas:

- · Expanding academic programs
- · Offering didactics on anti-racism and contested issues
- · Provide training in personal and organizational finance
- · Launch a Student Debt Reduction and Alumni Ambassador Program

The initial grant period concludes in 2027; therefore, HTS is launching two new centers as part of the program's long-term sustainability efforts. The Center for Financial Empowerment, led by Dr. Kevin Griffin, will focus on empowering clergy and churches to thrive through financial literacy education and practical tools. The Center for Justice, Love, and Belonging, led by Dr. Karen Owens, will serve as a hub for community engagement and pastoral formation around social justice. These Centers, that align with the core values of HTS, will also carry forward the grant's mission and extend its impact well beyond its original timeline. Other members of the HTS PFT team include: Dr. Clay Barrow, Dr. Regina Dancy, and Rev. Thomas Grinter. Dr. John Everett and Dr. Obery Hendricks serve in advisory capacities.

Rev. Angellica S. Sweat-Carrying Hood's Legacy Forward

At Hood Theological Seminary, we love to celebrate the ways our graduates are making a difference in the world. This month, we shine the spotlight on Rev. Angellica S. Sweat (MDiv '20), whose ministry, scholarship, and service reflect

the heart of Hood's mission.

During her time at Hood, Rev. Sweat distinguished herself not only as a dedicated student but also as a leader among her peers. She was awarded the **President's Award**, the highest honor given to a graduating student, and was recognized with several scholarships for her outstanding commitment to ministry and learning. Since graduating, Rev. Sweat's journey has taken her far and wide. She earned a **Master of Theology** with concentrations in **Homiletics** from Duke Divinity School and is now pursuing her **Doctor of Ministry focused in first Womanist Discourse Cohort** at Emory University Candler School of Theology. Along the way, she has been honored with fellowships and recognitions across the country, including induction into the **World Methodist Council's Order of the Flame** and selection as a **Preaching Exemplar** with Christian Theological Seminary's Compelling Preaching Initiative. Today, Rev. Sweat serves as **Program Coordinator for the Institute for Youth Ministry at Princeton Theological Seminary**, where she leads a \$1.25 million initiative to equip Christian ministry leaders for faithful and transformative ministry alongside young people. Her research and ministry focus on trauma, healing, and sacred proclamation, womanist traditions of liberation, and restorative liturgy for all people.

We celebrate Rev. Angellica Sweat not only for her impressive accomplishments, but also for the way she carries the spirit of Hood with her into every space she enters. She reminds us that the seeds planted here continue to bear fruit in communities near and far.


Dr. Vergel Lattimore, President and Professor, of Hood Theological Seminary
