The Greeting

We rejoice today with James and Charly, as they thank God for the gift of life and bring Elijah, Joshua and Hannah for baptism.

INTRODUCTION

When our Lord Jesus Christ had risen from the dead, he commanded his disciples to preach the gospel to all nations and to baptise those who believe. They obeyed his command and we read of the apostle Peter preaching in these words, 'Repent and be baptised every one of you in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to your children, and everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him.'

Jesus taught that none can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and the Spirit. 'Flesh gives birth to flesh,' he said, 'but the Spirit gives birth to spirit'. So let us pray to God the Father through our Lord Jesus Christ that he will grant to these children what they cannot have by nature, that they may be born again by the Holy Spirit and be made a living member of Christ's Church.

**All Heavenly Father,
we thank you that in your great love
you have called us to know you
and to trust you.
Increase this knowledge and strengthen our faith.
Grant that Elijah, Joshua and Hannah
may be born again by the Holy Spirit,
cleansed from all sin,
and inherit your eternal kingdom;

THE PRESENTATION FOR BAPTISM

James and Charly, do you present Elijah, Joshua and Hannah for baptism?

Parents of Elijah, Joshua and Hannah to answer

We present Elijah, Joshua and Hannah to be baptised as members of the Body of Christ, the Church.

God promises forgiveness and the gift of the Holy Spirit to all who turn to him in Christ. This promise also embraces the children of God's people, whom we bring to him in faith. Children must themselves express faith in Christ when they are able to do so. They must turn away from sin and put their trust in him. In due course, they should come to reaffirm these promises and receive prayer for strengthening in confirmation.

James and Charly, Elijah, Joshua and Hannah depend chiefly on you for the encouragement, teaching and example they need so that they may learn to put their trust in Christ and follow him. Today you are invited to make the baptismal promises on their behalf, as ones who already trust in Christ. Therefore I ask you:

Are you yourself a follower of Jesus Christ, trusting the gracious promises of God? **I am.**

Are you willing to sponsor Elijah, Joshua and Hannah, answering for them now and accepting responsibility for their Christian upbringing in the life of the Church?

I am willing.

As members of the church of Christ, we all have a duty to support parents by prayer, example and teaching. So I ask:

Will you, friends and family and members of the church of Christ, endeavour to support James and Charly so that Elijah, Joshua and Hannah might grow to fullness of faith in Christ?

All With the help of God, we will.

THE DECISION

Celebrant says to the parents

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

I now ask you to answer on behalf of Elijah, Joshua and Hannah.

Do you turn to Christ?

I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins?

I repent of my sins.

Do you reject selfish living, and all that is false and unjust?

I reject them all.

Do you renounce Satan and all evil?

I renounce Satan all that is evil.

Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light of Christ to his everlasting kingdom. **Amen.**

Elijah, Joshua and Hannah have been brought here for baptism. Let us all affirm the faith into which they are to be baptised:

All I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

**I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived of the Holy Spirit, born of the
virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was**

crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again from the dead;
he ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father;
from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

**I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen.**

James and Charly, I ask you to answer on behalf of Elijah, Joshua and Hannah.

Do you affirm this faith as yours? **I do.**

Will you follow Jesus faithfully, and obey his commands throughout your life?

With God's help, I intend to do so.

Do you ask for baptism in the faith you have affirmed? **I do.**

THE BAPTISM

Let us pray.

Merciful God, for Jesus Christ's sake, grant that Elijah, Joshua and Hannah whom we baptise in this water, may be saved through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. May they die to sin and rise again to righteousness. May your Spirit live and work in them, that they may be yours forever; through Jesus Christ our Lord who died and rose again for us. **Amen.**

Celebrant baptises Elijah, Joshua and Hannah in turn with water, saying

Elijah/Joshua/Hannah, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

God has called you into his church.

All We therefore receive and welcome you as a fellow member of the body of Christ, as children of the same heavenly Father, and as an inheritor with us of the kingdom of God.

AFTER BAPTISM

The Celebrant makes the sign of the cross, saying;

Elijah/Joshua/Hannah, I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are to be true to Christ crucified and that you are not to be ashamed to confess your faith in him.

All Fight bravely under his banner against sin, the world and the devil, and continue Christ's faithful soldier and servant to your life's end.

*Elijah, Joshua and Hannah are welcomed with acclamation.
Baptism Certificate and Godparent Cards are presented.*

Let us pray.

Gracious God, we thank you that through the death and resurrection of your Son, you have brought us from death to life. Enable us by your Spirit to resist the power of sin and give ourselves to you as a living sacrifice. May we not be conformed to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of our mind, so that we serve and please you in every way. **Amen.**

Heavenly Father, we pray for the parents of Elijah, Joshua and Hannah. Give them the spirit of wisdom and love, that they may teach their children by word and example to fulfil the promises made in their name. In our homes, give us the joy that comes from being faithful followers of the Lord Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

Accept our prayers through Jesus Christ our Lord, who taught us to pray,

**All Our Father in heaven,
 hallowed be your name,
 your kingdom come,
 your will be done,
 on earth as in heaven.
 Give us today our daily bread.
 Forgive us our sins
 as we forgive those who sin against us.
 Save us from the time of trial
 and deliver us from evil.
 For the kingdom, the power,
 and the glory are yours
 now and for ever. Amen.**

NEW TESTAMENT READING

A reading from the book of Acts 9:1-20

Meanwhile, Saul was still breathing out murderous threats against the Lord's disciples. He went to the high priest ² and asked him for letters to the synagogues in Damascus, so that if he found any there who belonged to the Way, whether men or women, he might take them as prisoners to Jerusalem. ³ As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. ⁴ He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?' ⁵ 'Who are you, Lord?' Saul asked. 'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting,' he replied. ⁶ 'Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do.' ⁷ The men travelling with Saul stood there speechless; they heard the sound but did not see anyone. ⁸ Saul got up from the ground, but when he opened his eyes he could see nothing. So

they led him by the hand into Damascus. ⁹ For three days he was blind, and did not eat or drink anything. ¹⁰ In Damascus there was a disciple named Ananias. The Lord called to him in a vision, 'Ananias!' 'Yes, Lord,' he answered. ¹¹ The Lord told him, 'Go to the house of Judas on Straight Street and ask for a man from Tarsus named Saul, for he is praying. ¹² In a vision he has seen a man named Ananias come and place his hands on him to restore his sight.' ¹³ 'Lord,' Ananias answered, 'I have heard many reports about this man and all the harm he has done to your holy people in Jerusalem. ¹⁴ And he has come here with authority from the chief priests to arrest all who call on your name.' ¹⁵ But the Lord said to Ananias, 'Go! This man is my chosen instrument to proclaim my name to the Gentiles and their kings and to the people of Israel. ¹⁶ I will show him how much he must suffer for my name.' ¹⁷ Then Ananias went to the house and entered it. Placing his hands on Saul, he said, 'Brother Saul, the Lord – Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you were coming here – has sent me so that you may see again and be filled with the Holy Spirit.' ¹⁸ Immediately, something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he could see again. He got up and was baptised, ¹⁹ and after taking some food, he regained his strength. Saul spent several days with the disciples in Damascus. ²⁰ At once he began to preach in the synagogues that Jesus is the Son of God.

This is the Word of the Lord, **thanks be to God.**

NEW TESTAMENT GOSPEL READING

A reading from the holy gospel according to John 21:1-19

✠ **Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ**

Afterwards Jesus appeared again to his disciples, by the Sea of Galilee. It happened this way: ² Simon Peter, Thomas (also known as Didymus) Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two other disciples were together. ³ 'I'm going out to fish,' Simon Peter told them, and they said, 'We'll go with you.' So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. ⁴ Early in the morning, Jesus stood on the shore, but the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. ⁵ He called out to them, 'Friends, haven't you any fish?' 'No,' they answered. ⁶ He said, 'Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some.' When they did, they were unable to haul the net in because of

the large number of fish. ⁷ Then the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord!' As soon as Simon Peter heard him say, 'It is the Lord,' he wrapped his outer garment round him (for he had taken it off) and jumped into the water. ⁸ The other disciples followed in the boat, towing the net full of fish, for they were not far from shore, about a hundred metres. ⁹ When they landed, they saw a fire of burning coals there with fish on it, and some bread. ¹⁰ Jesus said to them, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' ¹¹ So Simon Peter climbed back into the boat and dragged the net ashore. It was full of large fish, 153, but even with so many the net was not torn. ¹² Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples dared ask him, 'Who are you?' They knew it was the Lord. ¹³ Jesus came, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. ¹⁴ This was now the third time Jesus appeared to his disciples after he was raised from the dead. ¹⁵ When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' 'Yes, Lord,' he said, 'you know that I love you.' Jesus said, 'Feed my lambs.' ¹⁶ Again Jesus said, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He answered, 'Yes, Lord, you know that I love you.' Jesus said, 'Take care of my sheep.' ¹⁷ The third time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, 'Do you love me?' He said, 'Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you.' Jesus said, 'Feed my sheep. ¹⁸ Very truly I tell you, when you were younger you dressed yourself and went where you wanted; but when you are old you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go.' ¹⁹ Jesus said this to indicate the kind of death by which Peter would glorify God. Then he said to him, 'Follow me!'

This is the Gospel of the Lord, **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**
