PLAYOFF PERFORMER

Mackenzie Hughes, perennially a highly ranked putter on the PGA Tour, rolled in a birdie putt on the second hole of sudden death Sunday to win the Sanderson Farms Championship, his second title on tour.

He put himself in prime position for a weekend run with a sparkling 9-under 63 on Friday, the low round of the week. Hughes pocketed a check for more than \$1.4 million, and he climbed 31 spots to 51st in the world ranking.
