While BRADLEY has attended karate classes and has in the past been in a leadership capacity in the FOI and has apparently demonstrated a potential for violence as reported under the caption "Miscellaneous" in this report, he is now a rank and file member of the organization and is, therefore, not being considered for inclusion at this time on the Security Index.

Synopsis:

WILLIAM BRADLEY, born 10/28/38, in Thomaston, Ga., lives at 49 Mapes Ave., Newark, N.J., and is employed as a laborer by the Essex Co. Highway Department, Livingston, N.J. Informants advised subject in attendance at numerous meetings of NOI, FOI, MGT, and MM #25, Newark, and various N.J. and N.Y. locations, between December, 1963, and August, 1965. Subject held position of Lieutenant in FOI for awhile but is now a rank and file member. Teaching given at NOI meetings attended by the subject set out. Subject is unknown to informants of the NYO.

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DETAILS:

I. BACKGROUNDA. BIRTH~~CONFIDENTIAL~~

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On July 28, 1964, IC NOEL L. BAKER, Military Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, advised from a review of the subject's military record that WILLIAM BRADLEY was born October 28, 1938, in Thomaston, Georgia.

On July 10, 1964, Miss ESTELLE TURNIPSEED, Bureau of Vital Records, Department of Public Health, Atlanta, Georgia, advised IC W. JOHN BENTON that a search of the records of her department from 1935 through 1940 and delayed birth records failed to reflect a birth certificate on file for subject.

B. EDUCATION:

IC BAKER, previously mentioned, advised on July 28, 1964, subject attended four years of high school.

C. MARITAL STATUS:

On June 29, 1964, CECILIA M. BULGER, Secretary-Clerk, Essex County Highway Department, advised SA GUY RANDOLPH BECK the subject's marital status is listed as single in an application on file with that agency.

D. PREVIOUS EMPLOYMENT:

On June 25, 1964, KARL MARX, Personnel Department, New Jersey State Hospital, Greystone Park, New Jersey, advised that the subject was employed there from March of 1963, to September, 1963, as an attendant. He was arrested on July 5, 1963, by the Newark, New Jersey Police Department and when the record was sent to the New Jersey State Hospital, the subject quit.

Records of the State Hospital reflect he had been employed formerly by John Englehorn and Sons, 18 Avenue L, Newark, New Jersey.

On July 21, 1964, A. WALSKY, Personnel Department, John Englehorn and Sons, meat packer, 18 Avenue L, Newark, New Jersey, advised from the records and from personal recollection that the subject was employed as a packing house plant worker in October of 1951 to May 25, 1962. He was discharged for excessive absenteeism and is not subject to rehire. His residence at the time of employment was 138 Monmouth Street, Newark, New Jersey. His marital status was

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single. WALSKY advised that he was not interested in working and he did not know enough about the individual to recommend his character.

E. CREDIT:

The records of the Garden State Credit Bureau, Clifton, New Jersey, were examined on June 24, 1964, by AUDREY GRUNSTRA, Receptionist, for IC GEORGE H. STURM, JR.

It was determined from this record check that WILLIAM BRADLEY, date of birth 1939, marital status, single, resides at 130 14th Street, East Orange, New Jersey, as of April, 1964.

It was further determined that he resided at 139 Monmouth Street, Newark, for 14 years as of September 12, 1961. His employer was listed as the Essex County Highway Department, Livingston, New Jersey, and former employments as follows:

A record reflects that he has been involved in a litigation which was reported as a skip by Universal CIT on September 12, 1963, in the amount of \$1200.00.

On May 17, 1965, SA AUGUST J. MICEK caused the records
of the Bureau of Special Services (BSS) and the Bureau of
Criminal Identification (BCI) to be searched for any identifiable
information concerning the subject. The result of this search
was negative, at New York City Police Department.

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G. RESIDENCE:

On September 15, 1965, WILLARD BARRY, employee, Essex County Highway Department, Livingston, New Jersey, advised that the subject resided at 49 Maples Avenue, Newark, New Jersey.

H. PREVIOUS RESIDENCE:

On June 29, 1964, CECELIA BULGER, previously mentioned, advised SA BECK that the subject resided at 130 North 14th Street, East Orange, New Jersey, when he began employment with the highway department.

I. SELECTIVE SERVICE STATUS:

On April 27, 1964, NK T-1 advised that from information available to him, WILLIAM BRADLEY was then classified 4A, by Local Board 16, Newark, New Jersey, following a period of service in the United States Marine Corps.

NK T-1 advised that the subject had Selective Service Number 28 1638 701.

J. EMPLOYMENT:

On June 29, 1964, CECELIA BULGER, previously mentioned, advised WILLIAM BRADLEY began work as a laborer on October 8, 1963, in Essex County Highway Department, 49 West Mount Pleasant Avenue, Livingston, New Jersey.

On September 15, 1965, WILLARD BARRY FOREMAN, Essex County Highway Department, Livingston, New Jersey, advised that the subject is still employed as a laborer at that location.

K. MILITARY SERVICE:

A review of military service records on file at the Military Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, on July 28, 1964, by IC NOEL L. BAKER, indicated that WILLIAM BRADLEY, Serial Number 162 68 42, enlisted in the United States Marine

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Corps on September 14, 1956, and entered on active duty on the same date at New York, New York. He was honorably discharged from active duty on September 11, 1959, as a Private First Class at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, and transferred to the United States Marine Corps Reserve for completion of his military obligation. He served in the United States Marine Corps Reserve, inactive status, from September 12, 1959, to September 13, 1982, at which time, he was honorably discharged.

He had foreign service in Puerto Rico, and was awarded the Good Conduct Medal.

His character and efficiency ratings ranged from good to very good, and there is no record of courts-martial or absence without official leave.

II. CONNECTIONS WITH THE NATION OF ISLAM (NOI), FRUIT OF ISLAM (FOI), MUSLIM GIRLS TRAINING (MGT), AND MUHAMMADS MOSQUE (MM) #25, NEWARK, NEW JERSEY:

A. MEMBERSHIP AND POSITION:

On December 24, 1963, NK T-2 advised that WILLIAM BRADLEY, also known as William 25X, was in attendance at MM 25, Newark, New Jersey, as a registered member of the NOI, on December 13, 1963.

On August 26, 1965, NK T-2 advised that WILLIAM 25X BRADLEY was still a member of MM 25, and attended a meeting at MM 25, on August 22, 1965.

On April 22, 1964, NK T-3 advised that a meeting of the FOI was held at MM 25, on April 19, 1964, with Lieutenant WILLIAM BRADLEY in attendance.

On April 30, 1965, NK T-2 advised that as of that date, WILLIAM BRADLEY was an officer at MM 25 and serving as a Lieutenant of the FOI at that mosque.

On April 29, 1965, NK T-2 advised that WILLIAM BRADLEY, also known as William 25X, is a registered member of the NOI and FOI at MM 25, and NK T-2 further advised that he was recently demoted from Lieutenant to rank and file member of MM 25

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for taking part in and allowing the beating of another member of MM 25 because this other member rode one of the sisters of the temple in his car.

A characterization of NOI, FOI, MGT, and MM #25, are contained in the appendix hereto.

III. ATTENDANCE AT FUNCTIONS:

NK T-2 advised on various occasions between December 24, 1963, and August 26, 1965, that the subject attended at least 107 functions of the NOI, FOI, MGT, including social events held at MM 25 and at various locations in New Jersey and New York City, which functions were held between December 12, 1963, and August 22, 1965.

NK T-3 advised on various occasions between February 5, 1964, and September 1, 1964, that the subject attended at least 21 functions of the NOI and FOI including social events held at MM 25 and at various locations in New Jersey and New York City, between February 2, 1964 and August 24, 1964.

IV. STATEMENTS MADE IN SUBJECT'S PRESENCE INDICATING KNOWLEDGE OF THE TENETS OF THE NOI AND FOI:

On August 19, 1965, NK T-2 advised that at the NOI meeting held on August 12, 1964, at MM 25, and attended by the subject, the following teaching was given to those present by Minister HENRY X, of New York City:

"Minister HENRY X said it was time for black and white to separate. The so-called Negro does not know who he is. The white man has kept the truth away from us for fear that he would return to his native land. Their babies were killed if they would speak their mother tongue. Our slave master killed our babies until there wasn't anyone to speak our language. We who are followers of ELIJAH MUHAMMAD do not believe as MARTIN L. KING, which is, 'If there be any blood shed in the street let it be the black man's blood.' We say for 400 years of blood shedding is enough. Let it be someone else's. We do not believe fighting in the street cannot and will not solve the black people's problem. We need to get behind a man who speaks with authority."

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On August 26, 1965, NK T-2 advised that at one of the total of meetings previously mentioned, which was held on August 22, 1965, at MM 25, and attended by the subject, the following was the teaching by Minister JAMES MC GREGORY:

"Messenger MUHAMMAD is a modern-day MOSES doing the work of all the prophets in one. Allah is punishing America for its evil inflicted upon the so-called Negro. There is nothing the white man can do about it. The white man wants to carry out down with him. You brothers and sisters should unite behind the Messenger and tell the white man if he don't get what he is asking for then hell should be turned upside down. All praises is due to Allah for raising up among us a man who knows our condition, who knows what we want the Honorable ELIJAH MUHAMMAD. All praises is due to Allah."

VII MISCELLANEOUS:

Informants of the New York Office, who are generally familiar with NOI and related activities were contacted during May and June, 1965, and a photo of subject was shown to them. Each informant advised the name and/or physical description of subject was not familiar to him.

NK T-3 advised on July 15, 1964, that at one of the meetings of the NOI held at MM 25, Newark, New Jersey, and included in the total of meetings previously mentioned by NK T-3, Minister JAMES MC GREGOR had about 20 brothers (members) stand who had signed a petition against him. MC GREGOR then dismissed these brothers from membership in the temple. He then asked if there were any sisters who did not like what was done and wanted to go with these brothers. At this point, one of the sisters stood up and stated that it was right for those brothers to pay their paper bill, but that no brother had the right to hit another brother.

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MC GREGOR then stated that he had heard of this incident, but as of yet, he had not received a report on it. At this point, a report was handed to MC GREGOR and he began reading of this incident, of how Lieutenant WILLIAM BRADLEY of MM 25, and another brother recently chased in their auto another brother who was trying to escape them in his auto. MC GREGOR went on to read when the brother stopped at a toll booth, BRADLEY's car stopped behind him, BRADLEY got out, walked to the brother's car at the toll booth, opened the car door, at which point the brother started to drive away. BRADLEY then dragged the brother out of the car.

At this point, MC GREGOR stopped reading the report, and then pointing to WILLIAM BRADLEY, he stated that BRADLEY was wrong in doing that. MC GREGOR never finished reading the report or the discussion of this matter. He never mentioned the name of the brother who was dragged out of the car.

FRUIT OF ISLAM

On May 7, 1965, a source advised the Fruit of Islam (FOI) is a group within the Nation of Islam (NOI) composed of male members of the NOI. The purpose of the FOI is to protect officials and property of the NOI, assure compliance of members with NOI teachings, and to prepare for the "War of Armageddon". Members of the FOI are required to participate in military drill and afforded the opportunity to engage in judo training. The FOI is governed by a military system wherein the members are controlled by general orders similar to those issued by regular military organizations.

APPENDIX

1MUSLIM GIRLS TRAINING

On May 19, 1960, a source advised that the MUSLIM GIRLS TRAINING (MGT) is a group within the NATION OF ISLAM (NOI) and is composed of all female members of the NOI. The MGT is similar in structure to the FRUIT OF ISLAM (FOI), which is composed of male members of the NOI, in that the MGT has officers similar to military organizations to whom other female members are accountable. MGT members receive instructions in homemaking, hygiene, calisthenics and other subjects such as Muslim history and the English language. There also exists a Junior MGT which is composed of female members of the NOI who are between the ages of 15 and 19 and who are afforded military-type drill.

Since 1957 various officers and "sisters" of the MGT have at meetings of the MGT used the term MGT so that it also means General Civilization Class. General Civilization Class refers to classes conducted within the MGT.

The above refers to activities of the MGT at Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood, Chicago, Illinois.

On May 7, 1964, another source advised that the MGT is a group within the NOI which is composed of all female members of the NOI. The MGT is similar in structure to the FOI which is composed of male members of the NOI. In theory, the MGT exists in all Temples of the NOI and is patterned after the MGT at Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, Chicago. General Civilization Class refers to the collective group of classes held within the MGT.

APPENDIX

NATION OF ISLAM

In January, 1957, a source advised Elijah Muhammad has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam".

On May 7, 1965, a second source advised Elijah Muhammad is the national leader of the Nation of Islam (NOI); Muhammad's Temple of Islam Number 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960 Muhammad and other NOI officials, when referring to Muhammad's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam".

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. Muhammad claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of slavery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following Muhammad's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils"; in the United States; and the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon".

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including Muhammad, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On May 5, 1958, the first source advised Muhammad had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government; however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

On May 3, 1965, a third source advised Muhammad had, early in July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change, according to Muhammad, would help him acquire additional followers and create more interest in his programs.

On November 7, 1961, a source advised that MTI held meetings in Newark as early as April, 1958, and became MTI #25 on December 14, 1958. During October, 1961, MTI #25 moved into a building they purchased at 257 South Orange Avenue, Newark.

On November 25, 1961, records of the Secretary of the State of New Jersey, State House, Trenton, New Jersey, reflected under Corporation File #S18611, that a Certificate of Incorporation had been filed and recorded on April 3, 1961, for "Muhammad's Mosque #25", a religious corporation of the City of Newark. These records reflected Muhammad's Mosque #25 is affiliated with Muhammad's Mosques of Islam, Inc., Chicago, Illinois.

On April 2, 1965, a second source advised that MM #25 was then located at 257 South Orange Avenue, Newark. This source advised that MM #25 is directed and controlled by ELIJAH MUHAMMAD, national leader of the NATION OF ISLAM (NOI), and its aims and principles are the same as the NOI.
