RULES

Section 1 – A representative item from each House

- A musical item of own choice but approved by Housemaster.
- Minimum of two performers and recommended approx. max. 15 performers each House.
- Distorted amplification of guitars is not allowed.
- Pre-recorded music is not allowed and singers must not use microphones.

Section 2 – House Song – Theme "The 60's"

- A House's choice of song must be approved by Director of Music and Housemaster.
- The House Song must involve the whole House either on stage or behind-the-scenes.
- This is essentially a song with choreography, costumes and some staging. Remember that 80% of the marks are for quality of singing.
- There are to be no skits so the music is to start as soon as the item is introduced.
- Distorted amplification of guitars is not allowed.
- Pre-recorded music is not allowed, and singers must not use microphones.
- No other performance of any kind is permitted, e.g. Haka.
- Dress: no distasteful or provocative dress or choreographed moves which may be deemed offensive by a majority your Housemaster or Director of Music's decision on this point is final.
- Students may portray each other's gender, but not in a sexually provocative manner
- One House Captain will be named in the programme, but they may have a core team.

Technical Proficiency	Lighting, Sound, Overall Proficiency	10%

Rehearsal Rules

- Parents and staff are not allowed to help with developing the creative ideas or rehearsing House items it must be entirely student led and student directed.
- Music staff may help in rehearsals but must show equity across all Houses.

Technical Support

Up to 2 students per House can be in the Lighting Box.

Judges

The judges' decision will be provisional on the day. The Director of Music will publish the official results on Facebook after Saturday's performances and no further discussion will be entered into once they are posted.

Richard Littlejohn

Richard grew up in a musical family singing three-part harmonies, playing ukelele and guitar.

He played in hotels and bars with a band from the age of eighteen and also played solo and duo gigs with acoustic guitar, harmonica and mandolin, and started to perform a few original songs amongst a repertoire of mostly covers.

Richard's recording interest started when he borrowed a friends four track and recorded a number of original compositions. In 1988 he studied audio engineering at SAE in London with a close friend and did cheap all-night sessions in the studio where they recorded their first album. They performed in the London hotel circuit and their songs were also performed in an outdoor double bill concert in London with well know group The Dance Exponents.

On his return to New Zealand in 1990 Richard continued to perform as a solo, Band, and duo artist. He played a series of support gigs with Paul Ubana Jones and played the Mountain Rock Festival which gave him a stage for original music.

Richard built Quarter Moon Studio where he has recorded and produced albums for local musicians as well as his own music and he expects to have a new release out soon!

Roz Armstrong

Roz has been interested in music from a very young age singing in church and playing guitar and piano. She went on to study bass and singing at secondary school. On leaving school Roz has sung all over Australia and New Zealand. She taught singing and piano in Melbourne before returning to New Zealand to attain her Teaching Degree. Roz has been an educator in Whanganui for 16 years. Apart from singing she has a passion for theatre having directed such shows as Mamma Mia, The Importance of being Ernest, The Little Mermaid, Beauty and the Beast, Hairspray, The Wiz and all-time favourite, Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat.

Roz is currently in the process of writing a play set to the music of Stevie Wonder.
