### Chamber hosts roundtable on workforce issues

No matter the industry, it seems as if everyone is having a challenge hiring and retaining the talent they need.

Recent data shows that if the 6 million unemployed workers in the United States found work today, there would still be more than 5 million job vacancies. Employers are asking: Where have all the workers gone and what do they need to do to fill all their vacancies?

These are key questions, and the Overland Park Chamber is seeking the answers The Chamber recently hosted a roundtable more than 20 business leaders from diverse industries to discuss their challenges and potential solutions.

"We're still processing what we learned, but one thing was clear from the start... it's an employee's market and employers are having to be creative to win the battle for talent, said Kevin Walker, SVP of Public Policy for the Chamber. "Many of our roundtable participants said the issue is not all about money although the current worker shortage has typically increased wages and benefits across the board." Workers are looking for flexible work environments and a work culture that supports the values many younger workers seek such as DEI (diversity, equity, and inclusion).

Roundtable participants also talked about the importance of supporting robust educational opportunities including

traditional two and four-year post-graduate and career/technical certification programs. Additionally, they cited access to childcare and lack of access to foreign workers through legal immigration as hurdles that need to be addressed.

The roundtable, and similar sessions will provide valuable information that shape the Chamber's policy agendas and strategic plan. "Not every solution will be a government-based solution," said Walker, "but there's no doubt the state and federal governments can support changes to assist employers in finding the workers they need to keep our economy running."






