


This in-drawer outlet is intended for charging technology only. This outlet WILL NOT power a hair dryer, curling iron, mixer or other types of high-powered devices.


CAUTION - READ CAREFULLY

How to Install the Outlet


Step 1 - Verify the drawer dimensions. Docking Drawer Blade and Blade Duo require at least 2" behind the drawer box and at least a 15" wide drawer box.







Step 2 - Remove the cutout template and flip to the side that corresponds with your product's part number.


Step 3 - Locate the proper location for the receptacle box cutout using our cutout template. You can locate the proper location from either the inside or backside of the drawer box, making sure that the arms will not interfere with the slides and that there is enough material surrounding the receptacle box to securely hold it in place.




Step 4 - With a 1/2" drill bit, drill a hole in each corner, being careful not to splinter the wood on the inside of the drawer box. Using one of the 1/2" holes, insert a jigsaw and then make the required cutouts in the drawer box.









Step 5 - Reinstall the drawer box and slide the Docking Drawer Blade or Blade Duo receptacle box through the cutout. Secure it with the 4 wood screws provided.





Step 6 - Align arms. With the drawer mostly closed, mark the position of the rear mounting bracket. It is important to make sure the drawer moves freely in and out and that the arms are square and even. Spend sufficient time at this step before fastening the bracket to the rear wall to make sure everything is square and the arms are in the correct position. Once that is done, secure with the screws provided.





Step 8 - Connect the Docking Drawer power cord to the in-cabinet electrical supply. For more details about locating an in-cabinet electrical supply for your Docking Drawer installation, please refer to the Electrical Planning Guide located in the Specification Library at www.dockingdrawer.com.






How to Operate the Outlet


Docking Drawer Blade and Blade Duo include a resettable circuit breaker that prevents high-powered devices from being used. The circuit breaker trip is indicated by the white button protruding approximately 3/8" out from the cover plate. To reset, correct the source of overcurrent and push the white button in.
