New Taiwan Dollar (TWD)


Major credit cards are accepted in hotels, restaurants and shopping malls. Smaller restaurants, night markets and street vendors accept cash only





## The Pingxi Sky Lantern Festival

The Pingxi Sky Lantern Festival is one of Taiwan's most famous festivals and one that attracts people from all over. Each year during Lantern Festival people head for the small village of Pingxi to release sky lanterns with messages for the gods into the night sky. The paper lanterns glow in the sky in the mountains of Taiwan during the Lantern Festival and Moon Festival in the fall and is deemed to be a once-in-a-lifetime experience in Taiwan.
