- I. The first complaint: My own people don't know me (I-3)
- 2. The second complaint: You are uncorrectable (5-9)
- 3. The third complaint contains some divine <u>name calling</u> (10-17)
- 4. The prescription: quit doing wrong, start doing right (16)
- 5. God's call to repentance is a gift (18-20)
- 6. The risk of continued rebellion (21-31)

Sinners are called to repent and walk in the light of the Lord!
