# INTRODUCTION

In commemoration of our **100th Situation Report**, the Caribbean Public Health Agency is pleased to present this special publication that chronicles the Agency's ongoing response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

CARPHA has been leading the regional public health response to COVID-19, in keeping with its Inter-Governmental Agreement (IGA) mandate. We are managing this as a health security issue, working closely with CARPHA Member States (CMS), CARICOM, and regional and international coordinating partners. CARPHA activated its Incident Management Team-Emergency Response (IMT-ER) on January 21st, 2020 and convened the Regional Coordinating Mechanism for Health Security (RCM-HS) to help prepare for and respond to the threat. The RCM-HS has also supported CMS in the prevention of further transmission of cases. CARPHA continues to work with its partners and CMS, towards a harmonised regional response.

The first Situation Report was produced on 21st January, and was initially developed as a tool to monitor the COVID-19 pandemic globally and assess the risk of its arrival to the Caribbean region and CARPHA Member States. Since then, the Situation Report has evolved to serve as a means of providing Member States and other stakeholders with reliable epidemiological updates on COVID-19, updates from the CARPHA Medical Microbiology Laboratory and a summary of CARPHA's stakeholder engagement. The report also serves as a platform to disseminate news and information on CARPHA's response to COVID-19 and to share technical documents, such as guidelines and associated infographics, and other communication tools which have been developed by CARPHA's staff.

The first case confirmed within CARICOM was reported on 10th March 2020. As of October 12th 2020, there are **243,600 confirmed cases in 33 countries** in the Caribbean region. CARICOM Member States (CMS) are within the first wave of the pandemic. There is a potential for subsequent waves of unknown duration. The risk of further importation of cases to the tourism dependent Caribbean region remains Very High. The overarching goal is for all countries to control the pandemic by slowing down the transmission and reducing mortality associated with COVID-19. In this regard, we urge countries to continue ramping up their surveillance capacity to rapidly screen, identify, test, isolate and trace contacts of new cases supported by public health prevention and control measures of social distancing, wearing of masks, and hand hygiene.


CARPHA remains committed to providing technical support to our Member States, and to continue "holding your hands" as we forge ahead together to mitigate this pandemic in order to achieve a safe economic recovery.

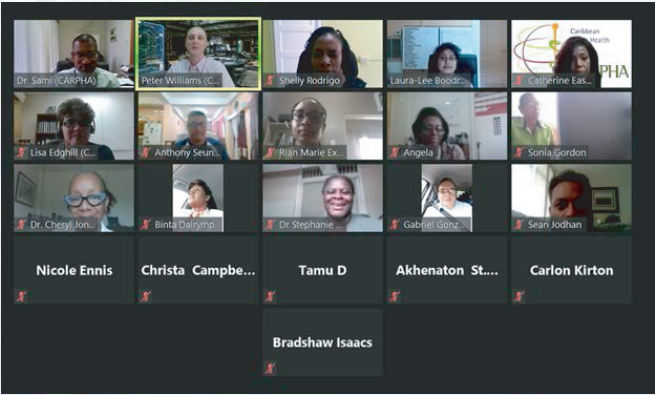
Regional Guidelines for Reopening



Core coordination: CARICOM, Caribbean Disaster Emergency Management Agency (CDEMA), University of the West Indies (UWI), Pan American Health Organization (PAHO), Expert Advisory Group and COVID-19 Tourism Task Force

CARICOM TRAVEL BUBBLE

- Countries within the CARICOM bubble should be in the low-risk category (no new cases or less than 20 cases/100,000 in past 14 days)
- No testing and no quarantine
- \* Each country that moves out of the 'low-risk' category should be assessed on a case by case basis

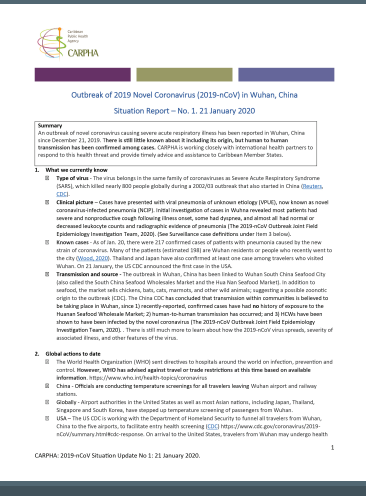

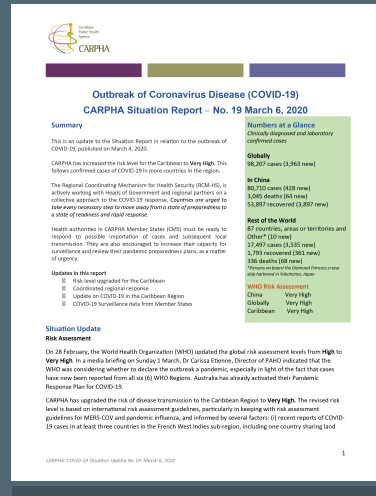

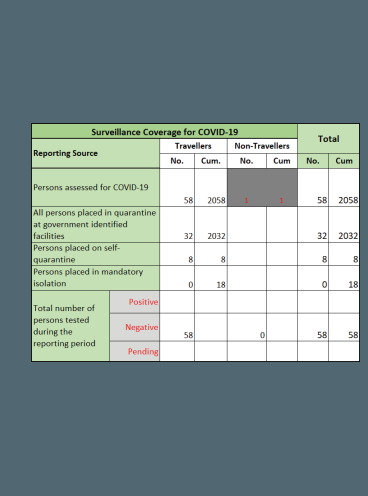
Weekly Country Reopening Measures and Requirements



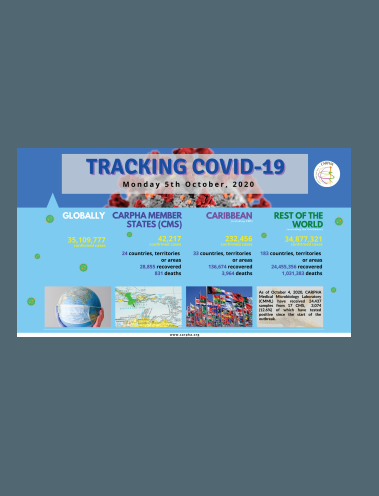
Weekly COVID-19 tracking on CARPHA website



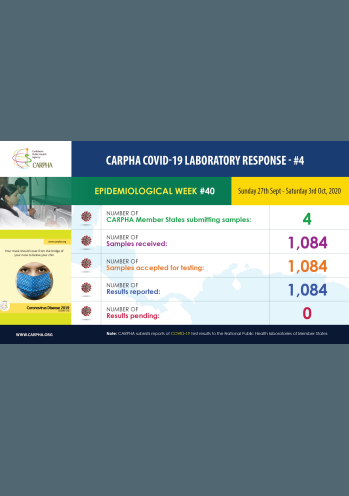
Enhanced syndromic surveillance form to capture COVID-19 cases

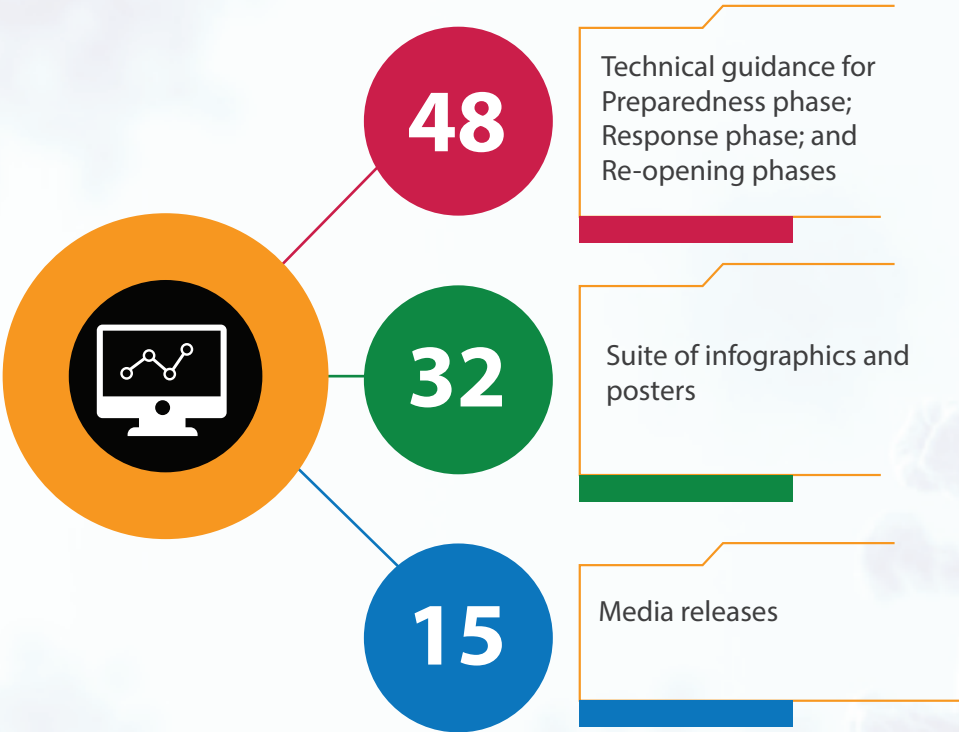

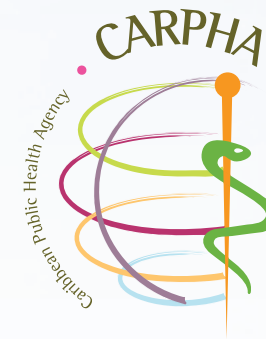

## VACCINES, MEDICINES, RESOURCE MOBILISATION AND PROCUREMENT

- COVID-19 Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) grant and Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) grant to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic
- Re-purposed European Union, Agence Française de Développement (AFD) and World Bank grants to facilitate COVID-19 procurement, rapid response, and vaccine
- Individual procurement and working with US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) for regional procurement
- Regional needs lists (PPEs, media, test kits)
- In collaboration with CDEMA: to distribute 125,000 N95 and 4 million surgical masks to Member States
- In collaboration with the Regional Security System (RSS), facilitated the distribution of 30,000 Medical face masks and 15,000 swabs donated by the Government of the People's Republic of China
- Weekly updates of COVID-19 Treatments
- Product recommendations based on verification review of COVID-19 products with emergency use authorisation for COVID-19 (Medicines, Vaccines, Test kits): 2 new kits recommended by CARPHA.
- Alerts for falsified COVID-19 products
- Participate in COVAX Facility to facilitate equitable distribution of vaccines to Caribbean countries.
