





XXXIst International Symposium of the ISSA Construction Section "How to reach Vision Zero in Construction" Berlin, 8 to 10 June 2022

Organized by the International Section of the ISSA on Prevention in the Construction Industry



Objectives

The symposium is aimed at international building contractors, architects, representatives of public authorities, international occupational safety and health organizations, research institutes, universities, training institutions as well as construction owners or clients. It pursues the goal of defining best practices in the field of occupational safety and health on construction sites as well as discussing and internationally disseminating experiences, new approaches and innovations, especially in the digital field, in order to achieve a reduction in the number of accidents and occupational diseases on construction sites on a global level and to come closer to the goal of Vision Zero.

Introduction

The International Section of the ISSA on Prevention in the Construction Industry (abbr. ISSA Construction/ISSA-C) was founded in 1968 and is one of the 14 international prevention sections of the International Social Security Association (ISSA) with the aim of preventing accidents and occupational diseases in the construction industry. It identifies and disseminates information on good practice in occupational safety and health and promotes the Vision Zero approach. The Section's activities include the organization of technical and thematic meetings, studies, expert discussions during ISSA Congresses and international symposia on the prevention of occupational accidents and diseases like the "XXXIst International Symposium of the ISSA Construction Section", which follows the international symposia in Brussels (2009) and Boston (2012) and which will focus on the question "How to reach Vision Zero in Construction?".

Vision Zero is based on the belief that all accidents, illnesses and harm at work are preventable. To implement the Vision Zero strategy, "7 Golden Rules" have been developed to create a culture of prevention at work:

- 1. Take leadership demonstrate commitment
- 2. Identify hazards control risks
- 3. Define targets develop programmes
- 4. Ensure a safe and healthy system be well-organized
- 5. Ensure safety and health in machines, equipment and workplaces
- 6. Improve qualifications develop competence
- 7. Invest in people motivate by participation

Programme information

The symposium offers the unique opportunity to discover many new approaches and solutions from the field of safety and health on construction sites.

The opening of the symposium will start on 8 June at 1:30 p.m. and will be followed by a keynote presentation and a plenary session. To welcome all participants, there will be a reception in the evening.

Breakout Sessions on the topics "Accident prevention", "Training and awareness building", "Hazardous substances and occupational health", "Innovation and new technologies" are planned for 9 June 2022. In the morning as well as in the afternoon, two Breakout Sessions will be held in parallel. In the evening, the participants will have the opportunity to expand their network with experts from all over the world during a dinner.

The results of the Breakout Sessions will be presented on the last day, 10 June, in the morning. The symposium will close with the "Declaration of Berlin" and end around 12:00 p.m.

In addition to the above programme items, there will be a poster exhibition, a start-up pitch battle and, for a limited number of participants, the possibility of technical visits to construction projects in Berlin.

Additional information

Start-up pitch battle:

Since many start-up companies can provide interesting and helpful digital innovations to protect against accidents and occupational diseases on construction sites but have problems bringing their products to companies without contacts or investors, the symposium offers the great opportunity to make OSH experts and companies aware of the start-ups' innovations.

The topic of the battle will be: How to improve safety and health on construction sites through digital innovations? Start-up companies with interesting digital innovations will have the opportunity to present their products. The whole pitch battle of the start-up companies will be in English.

After the pitches the audience will get the chance to vote for a winner of the start-up pitch battle, whose innovation will be published on the ISSA Construction website.

Poster exhibition:

A poster exhibition including further topics on safety and health on construction sites will be offered on all three days of the symposium.

Awards:

One speaker per Breakout Session and one poster exhibitor will have the chance to be awarded for their presentation or poster. The winners will be chosen by all participants of the symposium via a digital voting system. They will be honoured at the award ceremony on 10 June 2022.

Declaration of Berlin:

Following the example of the Brussels and Boston symposia, the "XXXIst International Symposium of the ISSA Construction Section" will conclude with the Declaration of Berlin in order to establish the contents and goals of the symposium and to implement them in the future.

Technical visits to construction projects of Berlin:

Technical visits to interesting construction projects in Berlin will be possible for a limited number of participants. Information on the Technical visits will be published in due course. A separate registration and an additional fee will be required.

Arrival from the Airport Berlin Brandenburg (BER) to the venue

Arrival by train:

From the stations "Flughafen BER-Terminal 1-2" or "Flughafen BER-Terminal 5" take a train to "Berlin Hauptbahnhof" (Berlin Central Station).

The following trains can be used from "Flughafen BER-Terminal 1-2"·

- Airport Express "FEX" in direction to Berlin Hauptbahnhof.

- **RE 17** in direction to Berlin Hauptbahnhof. The time of travel is approx. half an hour.
- RE 7 in direction to Dessau. The time of travel is approx. half an hour.
