I have written this מכירת חמץ on the topic of מכירת חמץ primarily to help clarify many of the issues surrounding it as well as to discuss many of the common questions associated with it.

While it is possible to go to your Rav to sell your חמץ not too long after שושן פורים the fact remains that most people go only in the last few days before Yom Tov. At that time the Rav is generally swamped with a great rush of people coming to arrange מכירת חמץ and it is at times difficult to get clear answers to important questions relating to the מכירה. Because of this many times misunderstandings occur. By clarifying and gathering the answers to these all-too-common questions in a clear and easy to use format I hope that I have helped people gain a better understanding of this nearly universal מנהג and resolve many of these common questions.

(Note: this קונטרס is generally limited to issues involving the arranging of the *Mechirah* between the owner of the חמץ and the Rav who is going to be מסדר the actual *Mechirah* with the גוי, as well as issues related to filling out the שטר מכירה. It does not, however, discuss how the actual מכירה between the Rav and the is transacted.)

It should be noted that over the past few years I have researched and gathered the information presented here from numerous קונטרסי הלכה מפרי הלכה ושו"ת, but primarily from the following Seforim – מכירת חמץ כהלכתו, הלכות חג בחג, הלכה של פסח, הלכות חג בריאל was published and was a tremendous help to me on all that's involved on this topic. 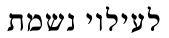

1. The Torah Prohibition to Own מסח on חמץ

There are three prohibitions in the Torah concerning מסח חמץ. The first one is the prohibition of eating מסח חמץ (the punishment for which is kares). Another prohibition is not to have any benefit from something which is ממן (or derived from ממן during חמץ. The third is the prohibition of owning חמץ all the days of מסח. This is known as the prohibition of our מסח (lit. 'it should not be seen and it should not be found').

If you [legally] own any מסח during מסח, even if you don't use it or even see it, you violate the Torah law of בל יראה ובל ימצא. You are guilty of transgressing בל יראה ובל ימצא even if it's not in your possession and even if you were unaware that this pun belonged to you. In addition, any חמץ that you owned over מסח [even בשוגג or נוד (גזירה מדרבנן), forbidden after פסח שו"ע), for you or anyone else to ever have any benefit from (שי"ע) (אסור בהנאה) שי"ע). For this reason much time and effort is spent cleaning and removing, from our homes and places of business (as well as any other place it may be found), any and all places to us.

2. The Various Ways to Dispose of מסח before מסח before

Generally when preparing (cleaning) for מסח, the מסח will be disposed of in one of two ways, either by consuming (eating) it or by discarding it. However eating all of the מסח before מסח is not always practical and throwing away [large quantities of] חמץ can be costly.

In addition, sometimes a person may be far away from where his nay is located and it is difficult for him to go to that location before Yom Tov to dispose of the חמץ and make a bedikah there. Also, due to the very seriousness of the prohibition of אמיסור של חמץ) people are concerned perhaps there may still be some וחמץ in their possession that they do not know about and did not find (and are thereby inadvertently transgressing בל יראה ובל ימצא 2).

In any of the above cases (large amount of חמץ, far away location, unknown חמץ), a person might find himself in a position of possibly violating the Torah prohibition of בל יראה ובל ימצא. Therefore, primarily for these reasons, over the years our Sages and Poskim developed the מכירת חמץ of מכירת חמץ as another method to be used to remove your your.

3. The מכירת חמץ of מכירת

In order to transgress the איסור of בל יראה ובל ימצא it is necessary for you to be the owner of the חמץ at the time that חמץ

becomes forbidden (which is after the 5^{th} hour of the day on ערב - the 14^{th} of Nissan). Therefore, if **before** that time it would be arranged for the ממח to be given to a non-Jew either through a sale or as a gift, there would be no איסור, since after the transfer to the non-Jew the ממן becomes his and you are no longer the owner of the מבח. This then would be another valid method for someone to dispose of their מבח before מבח.

While according to the early פוסקים this was a legitimate method, nevertheless there were numerous concerns on how this sale was being done. Since these transactions were usually being conducted on a one-to-one basis (i.e. the Jewish "seller" dealt directly with the non-Jewish "buyer") many times the necessary קנין was not being done properly. Also, while a straightforward sale would not be a problem, the פוסקים understood that this was not always the case. Sometimes certain conditions were being added which would thereby cause it to no longer be a proper sale (according to הלכה) and consequently not a valid method for "removing" מכירת חמץ of תקנה strongly encouraged that מכירת חמץ should be arranged either by a Rav or a Bais Din who would know the halachically correct way for it to be done.

4. How to Make a Valid מכירת חמץ

The **essential** requirement for a proper מכירת חמץ is for ownership of the חמץ to be transferred from the Jewish seller to the non-Jewish buyer. According to *Halacha*, this is accomplished through something known as a *kinyan*, which is a method of acquiring legal ownership as explained in the שלחן and in the ממרא and in the שלחן and קנינים There are a number of different types of בלי שום and to make sure that the sale is effective without question (פקפוק the Rav making the sale attempts to implement all of them. In addition we also try to have the sale be valid even according to secular law. ⁵

5. The Importance of Having "Full Intent" (גמירת דעת)

Anyone wanting to make מכירת חמץ must also be aware and fully understand that in essence this is a sale. What we are attempting to do here is a business transaction, not some sort of religious ceremony. It is not a symbolic sale. It is a business transaction that is legal according to הלכה as well as secular law. Additionally, the פוסקים state, in order for the sale to be acceptable a person must have complete and absolute intent (be גומר דעת), without any conditions or reservations, that he truly wishes to sell his pan to the non-Jew.

(According to some opinions without this clear understanding the sale is not valid and you remain the actual owner of the חמץ. Others however hold that בדיעבד (post facto) it remains a good sale even if in fact you did not have any real intent (גמירת דעת) that you are actually selling it.) 6

6. When is מכירת חמץ Not to be Considered a הערמה (deception) and When it is Called a הערמה

Besides making the proper קנין it is also of great importance that as much as possible the sale should not look like a הערמה, a "trick sale." According to the פוסקים you are permitted to sell your to the non-Jew before מפח though at the time of the sale it is understood that you intend to buy it back from him after מפח This is because there is no obligation explicitly written in the contract that the non-Jew must sell it back to you and in fact if he wishes he can keep the משח that was sold to him and use it any way that he desires. Therefore the חכמים said the sale is not מסח and is absolutely valid. The fact that you intend to buy it back after מסח the fact that you do the same "sale" every year) does not make it a "false" sale.

However if, for example, you were to sell your ממץ to the non-Jew before *Pesach*, and *make an explicit condition in the sale* that

obligates the non-Jew to sell it back to you after פסח, it is viewed as הערמה and would generally **not** be considered a proper sale, because this condition makes it abundantly clear that you did not seriously intend to sell your חמץ to him at all. Your sole intent was to avoid the prohibition of ממח by having it look like you are not the owner for the duration of פסח but your condition shows you still have an "interest" in it and that prevents it from being considered a genuine sale. 9

7. Type of מטר מכירה Being Sold in the שטר מכירה

תמץ גמור is generally categorized in one of two¹⁰ ways. חמץ אחר חמץ mixed ומץ mixed ומץ mixed יחמץ "mixed חמץ" which is food that has חמץ mixed into it. Since through the various methods of acquisition (קנינים) that are done it is a complete and halachically valid מכירה therefore the פוסקים hold that one is permitted to sell anything, even actual Chametz (חמץ גמור).

מכירת of מקנה disagree and hold that the מכירת of מכירת of חמץ was made primarily for those who own a large amount of ממן and for whom it would be a big loss (הפסד מרובה) for them to throw out. Therefore, according to these פוסקים, those who do not have this problem of הפסד מרובה should get rid of any actual מון ממץ they

have before מסי and make use of the מכירה only for items which are not considered חמץ i.e. חמץ. (See **Number 22** for a list of some items that are not considered חמץ.)

(It should be noted that even those who do not sell חמץ גמור certainly wish to **include** all unknown חמץ in their שטר מכירה. This way should they have inadvertently forgotten to dispose of something which is they will not transgress בל יראה ובל ימצא.) (See Number 9.)

8. Who is Required to Sell חמץ 12

The תקנה אמץ was instituted in order to assist people in making sure that no ממץ remains in their possession. According to most פּוסקים, since anyone who owns חמץ is subject to the איסור of איסור איסור is subject to the חמץ of תקנת חכמים בל יראה ובל ימצא the תקנת חכמים to sell the שמי would be available to them as well. This means that not only the head of the household sells the חמץ but in fact if any other members of the house (e.g. your children) own any pan and do not want to throw it out, they would be required to arrange a מכירה for their personal as well. (See Number 34.) (Note: a wife is automatically included in the husband's מכירה and similarly those who jointly share an apartment and go away for Yom Tov need to see that a מכירה is taken care of as well.

Note: מכירת חמץ does not only apply to men. It also applies to adult single women as well as someone who is divorced or

widowed, ר"ל. If it is difficult for them to arrange to go to the Rav they can ask someone else (neighbor or relative etc.) going to the Rav to arrange it for them or they can personally speak to the Rav themselves over the phone if necessary. As mentioned, the purpose of making מכירת חמץ is in order to assist those with difficulty in disposing of their (by arranging for ownership of the חמץ to be transferred to the non-Jew via a halachically valid method of doing so). Therefore those who have gotten rid of all their אמור (both ממור חמץ and מטר מכירה and שטר מכירה to sell their שטר מכירה to sell. Nevertheless some פוסקים hold that they should endeavor to write a שטר מכירה in any case because of חמץ שאינו ידוע להם i.e. that was not found while cleaning the house and was therefore not removed.

10. The Role of the Rav in מכירת חמץ

As mentioned previously (above **Number 3**), originally each individual person who wanted to make מכירת חמץ would arrange the selling of their *Chametz* to the non-Jew on their own. However, due to the many complexities in properly arranging the מכירה to the non-Jew, it is important that a Rav (or his designee) be the one to arrange it along with all the details that it involves.

It is important to note that the Rav who arranges the selling of your *Chametz* is only acting as your "agent" (שלית). ¹⁵ He is not buying, nor in any way becoming the legal owner of, the *Chametz* items that are written in the שטר הרשאה. His **only** function is to see to it that the transaction (sale) between you and the non-Jew is valid according to ...

Many people also have the custom (מנהג) of making the מכירה with an ערב קבלן. The meaning of ערב קבלן is as follows. Since the non-Jew (the buyer) only gives a small "deposit" on the actual value of the *Chametz*, the rest of the money (the balance) is considered a loan. Therefore in order for it to be a *halachically* valid מכירה, some פוסקים require someone (another Jew) to be an ערב קבלן (a

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This is the general מנהג nowadays, though in some communities the מנהג is indeed that the Rav buys the חמץ from everyone and then the Rav (as the owner) sells everything to the non-Jew.

guarantor) on this debt. Other פוסקים disagree and hold that an ערב disagree and hold that an פוסקים is not necessary (and some in fact hold it is better¹⁶ if there is no ספר מכירת חמץ ע״י ערב קבלן). (See מפר מכירת חמץ ע״י ערב קבלן).

11. Method of Appointing the Rav as Your "Agent" (שליח)

In order for the Rav to represent you in the transaction it is necessary to appoint him as your agent (שליח). The Rav is appointed as your חמץ for two functions: 1) to sell your משליח to the non-Jew and 2) to rent (or sell) to the non-Jew all the locations where the will be stored over *Yom Tov* (see Number 25). The two methods used for appointing the Rav are known as a) מידר and b) שטר הרשאה These will be explained below.

12. Appointing the Rav as Your שליח with a קנין סודר

The Rav is appointed as your agent,¹⁷ through a procedure known as מינוי שליחות. The first method we use for doing this is with a קנין סודר – "acquisition with a handkerchief." The Rav gives an object **of his** (e.g. a handkerchief or a pen, etc.) to the person selling his מפחים and the seller picks it up 3 טפחים (approx. 12 inches) and

thereby acquires the object. (Afterwards the seller gives the item back to the Rav as a present – מתנה.) Due to the seller receiving the handkerchief (סודר) from the Rav, he therefore transfers to him the right to represent him (the seller) for these two specific functions (שכירת חמץ) and the renting of the storage areas of the מכירת המקומות – שכירת המקומות –).

NOTE: Ordinarily a קנין סודר is used for a commercial transaction, מקח וממכר, made directly between a buyer and a seller, and which authorizes a transfer of ownership from one person to another. However our case of appointing the Rav to be your שליח is not a case of "buying and selling" (since the Rav is not buying anything from you). In fact appointing someone as a שליח is usually done verbally and nothing more.¹⁸ The question therefore is why are we making a קנין סודר, since it is not at all required.

The *Rambam* (הל' מכירה הל' י"ב וי"ג) explains that in the case of מכירת חמץ is **meant to strengthen the authorization of the Rav becoming your** שליח and it shows that you truly want him to arrange it for you. It has therefore become a universal custom to make a מכירת חמץ by מכירת חמץ of signifying your **full** intent to appoint the Rav as your שליח and should be done if possible. 19 (See **footnote 17**.)

Also, it is preferable that the קנין סודר be done **before** signing the שטר, though it is valid if done after as well. כן נ"ל דכיון דלמעשה אין מינוי שליחות ע"י סודר והמינוי בעצם

(When someone requests another person to go to the Rav to arrange מכירת חמץ on their behalf it is preferable that he also make a שליח with that person and thereby appoint him to be his שליח will then make his own קנין סודר with the Rav through which he will transfer his designation as a שליח on their behalf to the Rav. See **Number 33**.)

13. The שטר הרשאה: "Power-of-Attorney" Document

Additionally we appoint the Rav as our שליח through the use of what is known as a שטר הרשאה, a "power of attorney" document. The general practice is to use a "communal" שטר הרשאה whereby someone (i.e. the Rav) is designated to act as your שליח (agent) for these two purposes: מכירת חמץ and renting all the places that the nay is located (שכירות המקומות). This document is usually quite large and customarily many people sign their name on it. laso states in this document, in a general sense, the various types of ממץ being sold. Some people also add (next to their signatures) specific information concerning the locations where the מוו וומץ items will be stored over Pesach, as well as the approximate value of the מוו מון and then just put their signature to this document. Then, after the Rav finalizes the transaction, all his מוו is now considered as legally belonging to the non-Jew.

(In places where many people are signing the שטר הרשאה sometimes there is no room on the bottom to sign and therefore the back of the שטר, **as well as additional pages**, is used for signatures. Some say that it is necessary for the actual wording of the שטר הרשאה to be on the document that is being signed, 'עי' מועדים וזמנים ח"ג סי" עי' אועדים וזמנים ח"ג סי". However if the pages are attached (e.g. bound in a book or stapled together) then it is fine.)²²

In recent years it has become the custom by many *Rabbanim* to also use an additional **separate** שטר **for each individual** where more information is given about the specific items being sold and the specific location of the *Chametz*, as well as the name and address of the person selling the *Chametz*. In order to coordinate the two, each individual שטר is signed and given a number and this number is then written on the "large" שטר הרשאה next to where their signature appears. One of the reasons for the use of this second שטר is to strengthen the understanding that this is a real

14. שטר הרשאה Purchased After Signing the שטר הרשאה

If after arranging the sale of your *Chametz* through the Rav (by signing the שטר הרשאה etc.) you purchased additional *Chametz* and you wish to include it in the sale, it is **not necessary** to go back and add it to the שטר. It is also **not necessary** to contact the Rav to redesignate him again as your שליח for the new *Chametz*. As long as the sale to the non-Jew has not yet taken place the new *Chametz* that you acquired is included. ²⁵

(There are some Rabbonim who write in the שטר specifically that the sale <u>includes</u> any חמץ acquired after the signing of the שטר and ח"ד, י"ב: י"ז) דאז בודאי חל מינוי שליחות וכתוב בדברי מלכיאל (ח"ד, י"ב: י"ז) המכירה על החמץ החדש לכל הדיעות)

15. The Need to Specify the Type of מאָד Being Sold

When filling out the מכירת מירת מכירת שלירת להער להא document some people write that they are selling "any מיר that I own" without specifying exactly what type of משנה ברורה they possess. However the משנה ברורה writes²⁶ that משנה מירה one should specify the different types of לכתחילה that he is selling²⁷ (though in fact it is a good מכירה even if he just writes "all the that I own"). 28

Those *Rabbanim* who use an individual שטר for each person (see above **Number 13**, third paragraph) generally have a list of mittems in that מטר to be checked off. לכתחילה you should check off **only** the appropriate items.²⁹ For example, if you do not have pets do **not** check off "pet food." (Also, if it turns out that you left "unchecked" something that you actually do have, it is fine and is still included in the sale.)

(There is a common mistake of those filling out the individual שטר to check off **everything** "just in case." This is **incorrect** since by this section of the שטר we want to know the חמץ that you wish to put away and sell. The חמץ that you may have "somewhere unknown" is mentioned later in another part of the שטר, not here.) (See pg. 135.)

16. Writing the Value of the המץ Being Sold

The שטר should also state the **approximate value** of the חמץ.

The *Mishna Brurah* (שם) writes that according to some פוסקים stating an overly exaggerated amount may invalidate the sale. Similarly **one cannot write that the value is "zero."** That would make the sale look like a joke and the מכירה would be invalid.³⁰

When calculating the ממי value of an item that is a מערובות "mixture" (תערובות חמץ) one calculates the value of just the ממי part of it. For example, in the case of a box of instant pudding one would estimate the cost of the part that is 'Note: This applies to an item that is dry (יבש ביבש). However if the item is a liquid (לבלח), for example: ketchup, and the מותן מעם) one would calculate the מונותן מעם according to the value of the entire item.)

In a case where a person has gotten rid of all his חמץ "mixtures" (תערובות חמץ), or if he feels that what he is selling has **no** value, the עצה would be to include any non חמץ item of value in the sale. For example, you should write in the that you are selling a plastic washing cup worth \$1 (or more). Then the sale of even your "valueless" חמץ has what to be on since there is for sure some item of value being sold. (כן נ"ל ע"פ מש"כ באות חיים ושלום אות תקע"ה).

In general one should make a "reasonable" estimate of the value of **all** his חמץ. The estimate does not need to be exact, since the שטר states that if necessary the exact evaluation will be done by experts after *Yom Tov*. (Keep in mind, the point is to write the שטר in a way that it looks like a legitimate sale, which it is). ³²

17. Writing the Location where the אמן is being Stored

It is also important that the locations of the ממח be specified. If cabinets in the kitchen and/or dining room and/or basement are being used, they should be written in the שטר. If only part of a cabinet is being used for ממץ storage, it should be written as such. If items at different locations are being sold then each address should be specified. לכתחילה one should not just write "all my מטר wherever it may be." However, in a case where someone is going away for all of מסח and including his entire house/apt. in the שטר, then he can write "all my מין located at this address (apt.)."

In a case where someone has חמץ in a location and does not know the exact address, it is enough if he writes a description of the place i.e. "my desk in Yeshiva ABC located in the town of XYZ." (Or "bungalow #13 in XYZ colony in Woodridge, NY.") [To save time, it would be a good idea to write down the location(s) **prior** to coming to the Ray to fill out the "שטר.]

Sometimes when going to the Rav to arrange the מכירה we have not yet decided where the חמץ items will be stored (in which cabinet or closet etc.). Rav Elyashiv זצ"ל said that in such a case you should write "the location of the חמץ is in all the marked off places."³³ (See "Frequently Asked Questions" number 5 and 6.)

18. Including חמץ Utensils in the שטר מכירה

There is a disagreement amongst the פוסקים concerning the inclusion of utensils which are חמץ in the שטר מכירה. According to many שטר מכירה we don't sell the actual חמץ utensils ad but we do sell what is known as the "absorbed" (בליעות). (The definition of is the "taste" of the (חמץ) food that is absorbed in the walls of the utensils and which would then be transferred to the food when the utensil is used next.) According to the opinion of HaRav Elyashiv נוסח ti זצ"ל in utensils. The Steipler בליעות of his שטר מכירה did write that he was selling the שטר מכירה (Some

say that the Chazon Ish also sold the בליעות, though in his Sefer he says it is not necessary.³⁶)

HaRav Elyashiv זצ"ל held that when it says in the שטר מכירה that we are selling the utensils which are חמץ we are talking about actual ממץ בעין) that might still be attached to the utensils.

Because of this question, there are some *Rabbonim* who write in the שטר מכירה that they are "renting" all the מכי utensils to the non-Jew.³⁷ Accordingly, no פסח.

19. Including in the שטר Items That you are Unsure if They are אמץ

20. The Need to Fill Out the שטר Clearly

It is very important to note that, since we are making an actual sale, the document that we fill out with our information **needs to be written clearly**. (This is especially true when filling out the individual שטר.) For example, if the person will be away for then, besides his full name and address, the location of the keys to his apartment (and/or person to contact in order to gain entrance to the location) must be written in a way that the non-Jew can know how to get to the ממץ. If someone lives in an apartment then he must also write the apartment <u>number</u>, and if he lives in a **basement apartment** he should write that clearly as well.

If a person will be out-of-town for <u>part</u> of *Yom Tov* and the keys will be with him, he must write exactly where he will be staying over *Yom Tov*³⁹ so that the non-Jew can theoretically go to him, get the keys, and gain entrance to the places where the מתץ is located. (If he will be in multiple locations, these should all be written. At the very least a contact phone number should be given.) See Number 24.

21. Shares (stocks) in a Company That Deals With אמן

If someone owns shares in a company or companies that own or deal in מנהג items, the custom (מנהג) is to include it in the שטר

מכירה.⁴¹ This is true even though you do not own a controlling interest in the company. Since it is difficult to figure out the "value" of the ממי included in these shares you do not need to put that in the שטר as the Rav makes up with the non-Jew that if necessary an evaluation will be made "by three experts" after *Yom Tov*. (If you wish you can write the approximate value of all your other ממץ items and then next to it write "plus the value of the מירה included in my investments (stocks).")

22. Items Not Considered חמץ גמור

As mentioned before (**Number 7**, second paragraph) some פוסקים hold that one should not sell items which are חמץ גמור. The following is a list of some items which are sometimes thought to be חמץ גמור but are in fact <u>not</u> אמור.

[non-מסח] Flour is questionable if it is חמץ at all (no difference if it is bleached or unbleached) and may be sold even by those who don't sell חמץ גמור.

Yeast – Yeast is **not** חמץ גמור as it is generally made from molasses (which is made from sugar cane or sugar beets).⁴³

Rice cakes, Corn Flakes - may be sold.41

Cosmetics, perfumes, and medicines – may be sold.41

Whiskey – Many פוסקים hold that it is permissible to sell whiskey, even according to those who don't sell חמץ גמור (because it has the halachic status of "sweat" (זיעה) and is not considered חמץ גמור.) Others disagree and hold it is חמץ גמור but sell it anyway (either because that is the custom in their family to sell liquor even though they don't sell ממץ גמור or because it would be a significant loss (הפסד) to throw it out).

Vinegar (specifically that which is sold in the US) is not considered ממץ גמור even if it says on the label "grain" vinegar. (Note: The great majority of U.S. vinegar is made from corn.)

Ketchup, Mayonnaise, Mustard, Pickles and Salad Dressing may be sold even though they contain vinegar. It is not considered ממור

Barley (if pearled, raw and packaged), Cake mixes (dry), Food extracts, vanillin, or medicines/vitamins containing חמץ, are all not and may be sold.

Vanilla extract, Soy sauce may be sold.

Baking Soda, Baking Powder though used to make flour rise are not ממץ at all, but if it's an open container that was used during the year it should be sold. (Baking <u>Powder</u> generally contains corn starch which is קטניות. The ones which are Kosher for Pesach substitute potato starch instead. There are no מקטניות ingredients in pure Baking Soda.)

Play Dough is allowed to be sold even by those who don't sell ממי גמור. **Note**: Some פיסקים hold that Play Dough does not need to be sold at all. It should not be used but instead be put away until after פסח.

23. Including Items which are שטר in the שטר מכירה

Items which are קטניות do not need to be sold (for example: cans of corn or cans or bottles of soda containing corn fructose). They should just be put aside in a place where they will not mistakenly be used (eaten) during מסח.

IV. Additional Requirements for a Valid מכירה

- 24. Access to the ממץ (keys, combination, etc.)
- 25. The Requirement to Rent to the non-Jew the Place Where the אמץ is Being Stored
- 26. מכירת חמץ and Burning the מכירת (and saying כל חמירא): Which Comes First ?

24. Access to the המץ (Keys, Combination, etc.)

As mentioned before (Number 20) those who do not leave a key with the Rav and will be going away for Yom Tov (even if only for some days), need to leave <u>clear</u> written instructions in the שטר how the non-Jew can enter the location that the חמץ is in. If a landlord or neighbor has the key they can write that in the שטר. The same applies for those selling אות in their business, office, school or dormitory. There needs to be information written clearly in the how they can get to the אים that is being stored at those locations. 44 (Leaving a cell phone number is sufficient.)

While not *halachically*⁴⁵ required, it is considered praiseworthy to leave the keys⁴⁶ with the Rav,⁴⁷ allowing the buyer access to the at any time. If one has a combination lock (Shabbos lock) he

should write the combination in the שטר. (If one is concerned about revealing this information openly in the שטר, it can be written in Hebrew and the Rav will assist and tell the non-Jew how to get in on פסח if necessary.)

25. The Requirement to Rent to the Non-Jew the Place(s) Where the אמן is Stored

In addition to arranging the sale of the חמץ to the non-Jew it is also necessary to arrange to sell or rent to the non-Jew the location where the חמץ will be stored. 48 There are primarily **three** reasons given for this. (1) To effect the sale of the חמץ through a method known as קנין אגב, (2) to effect the sale of the חמץ through a method known as קנין חצר, (3) so that the חמץ (now belonging to the non-Jew) be considered as not remaining in our possession over *Yom Tov*.

(Since in this קנינים we do not discuss or explain the various קנינים utilized by the Rav to legally transfer ownership to the non-Jew, we will only explain **reason number 3** for the need to rent the location of the ממץ to the non-Jew i.e. so that it should be considered as if it is not in our possession.)

Ordinarily, under certain circumstances, a Jew would be permitted to store חמץ items belonging to a non-Jew in his house over מסח. In our case as well since "legally" he is no longer the

owner of the אמי it should perhaps be permitted. However since these items were once owned by the Jew, and since the Jew knows he will be getting them back after Yom Tov, the פּוֹסקִים were concerned that one might forget and accidentally eat from it on the while ideally the ממח items should be completely removed from one's possessions (house, warehouse, etc.) and moved and stored in a completely different location, however in most cases this is not feasible.

Therefore it is necessary to set aside an area for the storage of all the אח items and חמץ utensils⁴⁹ that one is selling. The designated area(s) need to be **clearly marked** so that one does not take anything from there accidentally. Ideally this would be a cabinet or closet or some such closed in area. However sometimes people use a corner in a garage or basement and in such a case (i.e. an open location) it is necessary to surround the area with a מחיצה, a solid sturdy partition, which needs to be at least 10 *tefachim* high (approx. 30 inches). ⁵⁰ ⁵¹

Those who are tenants by someone are still able to write in the שטר מכירה that they are renting the storage area to the non-Jew, even though in their lease it states that they do not have the right to sub-lease their apartment. This is because the rental is just for the storing of the ממיר items. It is not being rented to them (the

non-Jew) to be able to live in the apartment and therefore it is **not** a violation of the lease. ⁵² (See **Number 29** regarding if you have a place that you live rent-free.)

(**Note:** The renting of the storage area is לכתחילה. However, it still remains a valid sale even if the place where the חמץ is stored is not rented to the non-Jew. [מ"ב סי' תמ"ח ס"ק י"ב])

26. מכירת חמץ and Burning the כל (and saying): Which Comes First ?

On the morning of ערב פסח it is a universal מנהג to burn any and all מריד ניסן found when doing the בדיקה on the night of י"ד, followed by the saying of כל חמירא. There are some (Chasam Sofer, among others) who say that the burning and ביטול etc. should be done after the completion of the מכירת חמץ transaction with the non-Jew. Nevertheless, the opinion of many כל and the prevailing custom (מנהג) is to first burn the מנירא (and say מכירת חמץ) and then do the חמירא

27. חמץ Delivered to you on Pesach (or which was in Transit over Pesach)

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- 28. חמץ at work or at School or in a Dormitory
- 29. חמץ of yours in a house/apt. that you do not own or rent
- 30. Including a car/vehicle in the שטר מכירה
- 31. Keeping אמץ items over *Pesach* in a Refrigerator or Freezer that will also be used for *Pesach* items
- 32. חמץ Items Belonging to Someone else and Stored in your Home, or items of yours Stored in Someone else's Home

27. חמץ Delivered to You on חסף (or אחל Which Was in Transit Over ססף 55

If a ממץ item was shipped to someone before מסח and delivered on [or after] פסח, there is a question if this item would be forbidden after פסח (due to the Rabbinic Law of חמץ שעבר עליו הפסח) or not. If the person sending it was a non-Jew and the Jew was aware that this item was being sent to him (but was expecting to receive it before then it would be permitted to be used after פסח. This is because the Jew certainly does not wish to acquire it on מסח and it therefore remains the property of the non-Jew who sent it. (Upon arrival, the item should be put away in a חמץ cabinet (or closet etc.) until after פסח, see below in third par.) If the one sending it was a Jew, then if the **sender** made a שטר מכירה it would be permitted. If he did not make a שטר מכירה, but the one receiving made a שטר, it would also be permitted after מסח (since the שטר states that all חמץ is included wherever it may be found). However if both the sender and the recipient did not make a שטר מכירה then the המץ item would **not** be allowed to be used after פסח. ⁵⁶

This refers to an unscheduled delivery. One should certainly not arrange for דמץ to be shipped to him to arrive during מפחד or even to have it arrive after מפחד.

All this concerns חמץ that he is expecting, he just does not know when it will arrive. However, חמץ that unexpectedly appears at his door (e.g. a gift which is שטר. ⁵⁷

b. What to do with the אמן Item when it is Delivered on ספו

When the חמץ חמץ arrives then, if it is Yom Tov (either the first or last days) or Shabbos Chol Hamo'ed, it is מוקצה and cannot be moved. You would be required to cover it with a כלי (e.g. a box). If it is דול המועד then many פוסקים say you cannot save it or put it away but need to destroy it, (either by burning it or some other method). However there are other פוסקים who hold that you do not need to get rid of it (since they hold that it was considered to have been included in your מכירה and therefore does not belong to you as you sold it to the non-Jew). (They also state that לכתחילה you should verbally declare that you do not wish to be זוכה (acquire ownership) of this item.)

Additionally, the item cannot be left out in the open. Some say that, if it is חול המועד, you need to make a מחיצה של עשרה טפחים around it. If this cannot be done then it should be placed where you stored the other חמץ items that you sold. (If the חמץ is not packed or wrapped up then some hold that you may not pick it up with your hand as we are concerned that you may accidentally come to eat it. In that case they say you should ask a non-Jew to put it away and if that is not possible then the only option is to move it into the storage area with a stick or your foot.) (See Number 43.)

28. המץ at Work or at School or in a Dormitory

A Rebbe or teacher who has a locker in Yeshiva/school should clean it and inspect the area before leaving school for מסח.

Afterwards, if they wish they may also include this place in their שטר.

The same applies to students in a dormitory or Yeshiva.

In the case of someone who has an office or a desk at work or a vehicle given to him by his employer, where at times during the year he has ממץ, he should make sure to remove all ממץ items and make a thorough inspection of the area before Yom Tov. Afterwards he can write in the שטר that any pan of his at this location that may have been overlooked should be included in the sale to the non-Jew along with their other pan items. (Note: Ordinarily we require that the location of the מבירה be rented to the buyer (Number 25). However, in this case, since he is not the owner and therefore cannot rent the place to the non-Jew, it is still a valid a valid.)

29. חמץ of Yours Located in a Home that you do not Own or Rent – can it be rented to the גוי?

As mentioned, when selling the חמץ it is generally required for the place that the ממץ is stored to be rented to the non-Jew. If someone lives in an apartment that does not belong to him and he is

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Even though they do not actually own or rent the locker from the school, nevertheless the מכירת ממץ is valid for any that they may have at this location. This is because the (Jewish) school gives them certain privileges in the use of these locations, which would also include the right to be rent it out it in order to make מכירת חמץ.

also not paying rent (i.e. the owner lets him live there for free),⁵⁹ it is his obligation to remove and dispose of all חמץ that he owns in that location and to make a בדיקה. He can also make a שטר מכירה and arrange for the **rental of the locations** of the חמץ in the apartment (even though he is not the owner or the renter) since the (Jewish) owner would certainly agree and allow for him to do so.

30. Including a Car / Vehicle in the שטר מכירה

If someone has a car and wants to use it during *Chol Hamo'ed*, if it is a car that he has eaten מקום שמכניסין in during the year (בו חמץ apin), which it usually is, he is required to clean it well from any and then make a thorough בדיקה in the car on the night of the 14th (using a flashlight). If the trunk is a place where during the year pin is sometimes put, he must make sure to clean and check that as well. If he wishes to use the car but cleaning the trunk is difficult, he can clean just the car interior and keep the trunk locked the whole *Yom Tov* and not use it. He should write in the שטר that he is selling any מכירה that he is selling any pin that may be in the trunk and is also renting the location (the trunk) to the non-Jew. (He should make

⁵⁹ This is a common case where a child lives in a house or apartment owned by their parents.

some type of **noticeable** indication (סימן) by the trunk (to remind him that it is rented) and not to accidentally open it during פסח. Since he "rented" the trunk (to the גוי it is not his and he is therefore not allowed to use the trunk **at all** during פסח.)

In addition, it's important that he include his phone number (cell phone) in the שטר so that the buyer (non-Jew) can contact him to know where the car (trunk) is located. He should also write the general location where the car will be parked on *Yom Tov* (and Shabbos *Chol Hamo'ed*) itself.

The requirement of a בדיקה is for **all vehicles** that a person owns,⁶³ **including those belonging to his business**. If someone is not planning on using his vehicle(s) **at all** over *Yom Tov*, he can park the car and arrange an "early" מכירה of the vehicle to the non-Jew **before** the night of 14 Nissan (see **Number 38**) and not have to make a בדיקה.

31. Keeping אמן items in a Refrigerator or Freezer that will also be used for המס items

If someone has חמץ items which they are including in the שטר and which require refrigeration and they have only one

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However there are some *Rabbonim* who disagree and hold that this is not allowed. According to them if someone wishes to use his car on חול המועד פסח then he must clean the car and **also** clean the trunk of the car. If he is unable to do so then he must sell the חמץ in the trunk and rent out the trunk (the place that the nay and he is not permitted to use the car at all.

 $^{^{63}}$ The same applies to a car given to someone to use on a steady basis, even if they are not the owner.

refrigerator (which they intend to use for מסח), they may store it in their מסח refrigerator but need to keep the מסח item in a separate section that is clearly marked that it belongs to the non-Jew. (לכתחילה a piece of cardboard should surround the item to block it off and separate it from the rest of the מסח refrigerator.) The item(s) should also be well sealed in a thick bag and marked so that it isn't accidentally used on Yom Tov. (עי' ספר הליכות שלמה, ניסן עמ' קלז)

32. המץ Items Belonging to Someone Else and Stored in Your Home, or אמן Items of Yours Stored in Someone Else's Home

In case someone stored their חמץ items in your home (e.g. grocery items or frozen food) and you are unable to contact them before פסח (so that they should remember to sell it) you can **specify** and include it in **your** מכירה שטר מכירה the items would be

This is only valid if you specify in your שטר that you are selling the חמץ for them. Similarly if you store your חמץ in your neighbor's storage area (i.e. the place where they will be storing their own) but you don't inform them about it, even though they are writing in the שטר מכירה that "all חמץ in this storage area" is being sold, your או in not included in their שטר unless they are aware of it and it is written explicitly. Otherwise that חמץ (as well as where it's located) needs to be written in your own שטר for it to be considered sold.

permitted for use. Similarly if you have items that you stored by someone else, you can include it in your שטר (even without notifying the owners of the property that it is located at).⁶⁷

It sometimes happens that guests arrive at your home before Pesach (before the זמן of ביעור חמץ) and have with them items that are and which they would prefer not to throw out. These can be put away into your חמץ storage areas and would automatically be included in the שטר מכירה that they arranged by their Rav. It would not be necessary for them to notify their Rav to add this location to their שטר and simply putting it into your מכילום closet would be enough.

Another way would be for them to give the item(s) to you as a "gift" which would then automatically be included in your שטר. A transfer of ownership (קנין) would then be required. This can be done by you picking up the item, or by virtue of the item being placed into your closet/storage area (חצר). You also need to have intent (כוונה) to acquire the item for the transfer to take effect.

33. Arranging מכירת המץ on Behalf of Someone Else

If someone is unable to go personally to the Rav he can still have the Rav sell the ממץ for him but, as mentioned earlier (Numbers 10-12), would לכתחילה need to appoint him to be his one option would be to find someone else going to the Rav and designate them as their שליח to arrange the מכירה הפין סודר. 68 This designation should preferably (לכתחילה) be done with a קנין סודר קנין סודר arriving at the Rav this person will then make a קנין סודר however there still remains the Rav your שליחות be with a קנין סודר transferring the שליח שליח שליח. However there still remains the problem of how to arrange the מינוי שליחות of the Rav through the use of a שטר הרשאה Optimally the person who wishes to sell his nad sign and the one going should bring it to the Rav. If he is unable to fill out and sign the שטר then the person going should fill out and sign the שטר on his behalf when he is by the Rav.

⁶⁸ If someone is acting as a שליח for someone else he should see to it to have with him all the details necessary to fill out the שטר properly (type of חמץ, location of אח, storage areas, etc.). It is also important to know if the person will be going away for any part of Yom Tov (and if in a different time zone etc.) and those details should all be given over to the Rav when filling out the שטר.

When signing (either the שטר הרשאה or the individual שליח should sign his own name "on behalf of" that person i.e. he should sign "so-and-so on behalf of so-and-so." For example, if Mr. Reuven Gold asks Mr. Shimon Silver to make the מכירת חמץ for him by the Rav, then Mr. Silver fills everything out with all the details and by the signature (on both the collective שטר הרשאה and on the individual שטר הרשאה) he signs "Shimon Silver on behalf of Reuven Gold."

(It should be understood that the person who is the שליח should fill out a separate שטר and not combine this with the שטר that he himself is going to make by the Rav for his own חמץ.)

34. אמץ belonging to a son or daughter living at home

If someone has a son(s) or daughter(s) above *Bar Mitzvah* or *Bas Mitzvah* ⁶⁹ living at home, their son/daughter is responsible for any purchased for themselves with their own money.⁷⁰

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⁶⁹ It would seem that the same would apply even to children under Bar Mitzvah or Bas Mitzvah (**age six and above**). If they earn their own money (e.g. from a job) or receive a present of money (e.g. a birthday gift) it would seem to be theirs without their father having any rights over

(Money which they either earned or they received as an allowance or as a gift.)⁷¹ If they have any חמץ at school or at work, it is their responsibility to dispose of it before פסח. If they have their own car,⁷² it is their obligation to clean it from חמץ. They should also arrange a מכירת חמץ that may belong to them. However, if they wish they may appoint their father⁷³ as their שליח to include them in the מכירת חמץ that he makes for himself.⁷⁴ In

it (i.e. it is not his money to take) and therefore anything bought with this money by them would belong to them exclusively and not be considered to be owned by the father in any way. If the item purchased way דמי then this חמץ belongs completely to the child and would not be included in the father's שטר מכירה מכירה (וכן שמעתי הוראה מאת הרה"ג ר' הערשל שכטר שליט"א).

For children living at home the "best" option would be for them to be מקנה their agen to their father. Since ownership has been transferred to their father, his own to their father. Since ownership has been transferred to their father, his own actrom is sufficient. This transfer (הקנאה) can be done by them writing on a piece of paper that they are transferring ownership of any מון (and also be signed). This can occur even after he has arranged his שטר (see above, Number 14), (but before the sale to the יו goes into effect).

Please note, the same would apply to any gift of חמץ that they would receive, for example משלוח מנות from a friend etc.. It would be considered owned **by them** and would need to be sold **by them**.

such a case, the father should **specify** in the שטר that he is selling "all ממן belonging to my son(s)/daughter(s)" (he should write their first name, for example, my son Ya'akov or my daughter Leah etc.), and the exact addresses where their ממץ is located (home, school, work, dormitory, apartment, car, etc.).

When signing the שטר, if he is using one שטר for both himself and his children he does **not** need to specify that he is signing "on behalf of" his children. If he is making a separate שטר for them then he would sign his name "on behalf of."

He should also have his children say כל חמירא (see Number 57).

VII. אמץ Belonging to More Than One Person

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- 35. מכירת חמץ in the case of a Partnership
- 36. בדיקת חמץ and בדיקת in Shared Places (apt., Dormitory, etc.)
- 37. בדיקת חמץ and בדיקת חמץ for "Common Areas" Belonging to a Group of Residents as well as for Shuls, Yeshivos, and Other Institutions (camps etc.)

35. מכירת חמץ in the Case of a Partnership

If two (or more) people (Jews) are partners in a business involving חמץ, or they own or rent a place where חמץ is located, they should arrange a מכירת חמץ. The proper way would be for one partner to designate the other to be his שליח to arrange it. In the partner to designate the other to be his שטר הרשאה, the one filling it out should write that he is doing it for himself and also on behalf of his partner (he should write in the partner's name). In case they were not in touch with each other then the partner that remembers should write the מיטר and the location in the שטר on behalf of both partners.

If a Jew is a partner with a non-Jew in a business dealing in חמץ, or they own or rent a place where ממץ is located, the Jew should write this in his שטר and write that he is selling his "part" (חלק) of the ממץ. This sale would be *halachically* valid even though he is arranging to sell his share to a non-Jew who is not his partner (and even though he does not inform his partner of the sale).

36. בדיקת חמץ and בדיקת in Shared Locations (Apartments, Dormitories, etc.)

Similar to a partnership (see **Number 35**), if two (or more) people are renting a place (house, apt. etc.) where ממירת is located, they need to arrange between them a מכירת חמץ. Also, a business

that shares space with another Jewish business, if ממירה is sometimes brought there בדיקת חמץ as well as a מכירה needs to be arranged on behalf of both of them (as well as for the ממירה utensils that are there). In these cases there is no "partnership" in the may itself, but since they share the place it is their obligation to individually make a מכירה and jointly arrange a מכירה. The is also quite common for children in Yeshiva or Seminary in ארץ ישראל to share an apartment. Before going home for Yom Tov, a מכירת חמץ for things that are left there over Pesach (including pots, utensils etc.) are not automatically included in their father's sale. (See Number 34.)

37. בדיקת חמץ and בדיקת המץ for "Common Areas" Belonging to a Group of Residents, as Well as for Shuls, Yeshivos, and Other Institutions (Camps etc.)

Apartment buildings and residential developments where the residents own their own apartment and share a "common area" such as a playground, parking lot, meeting room etc., the removal of ממץ from this common area is the responsibility of each of the residents. One person can arrange the sale of the ממץ that was not found after the place was searched properly) even

⁷⁵ In their "personal" area, i.e. the area that is considered theirs.

⁷⁶ The מכירה is done for their ממץ and חמץ utensils that they share and any מכירה that they are "unaware of" that is in the "common area" (hallway, storage etc.) that they both make use of. without being appointed but it would be better if they got together and designate someone specifically to take care of it. When signing on the שטר he should write his name "on behalf of all the residents of..."

In the case of a Shul, Yeshiva, etc. the person in charge (the director, administrator, manager, *Shamash/Gabbai* etc.) should make a שטר and arrange a שטר מכירה. When signing the שטר he should sign his name along with his title. ('עי' משפט המכירה שער ב').

If the Shul, Yeshiva, organization, etc. is owned by an individual then he should take care of the מכירה or appoint someone to arrange it on his behalf.

⁷⁷ The מטר מכירה is for any אים חמץ or תערובות חמץ items (utensils, etc.) that belongs to the Shul and that the Shul wants to keep to use after שטר . The שטר is <u>not</u> for any מכירה ומקיבוה is <u>not</u> for any ממירה.

38. Making an "Early" מכירה

Usually the מכירת חמץ is scheduled by the Rav to take effect right at the end of the time for ביעור חמץ (i.e. the end of the 5th hour on ערב פסח). It is done this way in order to allow people the maximum amount of time to have benefit from their חמץ. At the same time the Rav arranges the rental of the various location(s) that the pan will be stored over Yom Tov (שכירות מקומות), see above Number 25). It goes into effect also at the same time as the מכירת מכירת חמץ and the "מכירת מקומות" are arranged to go into effect before the night of the 14th of Nissan, and this would thereby create a change in the way the pan would be conducted.

 non-Jew, there longer is any obligation on him to do a בדיקה. (See Number 55.)

The same arrangement can be done for any properties that are too difficult for someone to arrange for a בדיקה on the night of "י"ד on the night of בדיקה on the night of "י"ד. This would include an office or factory or vacation home or investment property, etc., since the rental period with the non-Jew in those locations begins **before** it becomes nightfall, he is no longer required to make a בדיקה. (This also applies if a person has locations in his home that he does not want to check. For example: attic, basement, garage, etc.. But it needs to be understood that those places are off limits all the days of מסח, see **Number 43**.)

Based on this opinion there is a question how someone who is going away for *Yom Tov* and selling his entire apartment at the regular time can make a בדיקה on the חתם סופר on the איל מ"ד. Since according to this opinion (ליל י"ד and others) it is **not** necessary to make a בדיקה then even if you wish to make a בדיקה anyway it remains a מצוה if you really are fulfilling a מצוה and therefore a מטעם ספק ברכות להקל).

Because of this some will write in their שטר that they are leaving out from the rental to the גוי one specific room. This way they can start the בדיקה and make a in that room according to all opinions, and from there continue to the other areas. (The same applies to someone making a בדיקה before ליל י"ד before. ליל י"ד at least some part needs to be excluded from the rental.)

⁷⁸ There are many *Rabbanim* who do not make an early מכירה in such a case and nevertheless hold if you are including your entire apartment in the שטר מכירה then you would not have to make a ליל י"ד חס בדיקה. Similarly, in a case where the owner and the מבירה are in different time zones, it is sometimes necessary to arrange an early מבירה. For example, those who have an apartment in ארץ ישראל (for example a bochur in a דירה or a girl in a seminary dorm room) and go away for must make sure to get rid of all their pan before they leave. They should throw out what they don't want and anything they wish to keep (whether pan or מבירה חמץ or מבירה or utensils) should be sold through a שטר מבירה (If the pan items or utensils are "shared" with others then one of them should be appointed to take care of it. However if no one was appointed then the last one there should arrange the מבירה on behalf of all of them.) If they will be going away overseas (to the "west" e.g. the U.S.), then it would be best if the מבירה was arranged through a Rav in א"י (see Number 41). If they are unable to do so, they should arrange an "early" by a Rav in the country that they will be in for Pesach.

In addition, if they are leaving within 30 days of Pesach they are required to make a בדיקה the night before they leave. If they forgot to do so, they should get a שליח to make the בדיקה. If this too cannot be done then they should לכתחילה arrange that the שכירות goes into effect before it is שקיעה on י"ג ניסן neretz Yisrael. 39. If You Made an Early מכירה, Are You Permitted to Use the House (or Rooms) as of (י"ד ניסן of י"ג ניסן (i.e. the night of י"ג ניסן).

Since in the case of an "early" מכירה the rental period with the non-Jew begins right before sunset of י"ג ניסן, therefore from sundown and on one should **no longer use** those parts of the house that were included in the שטר מכירה. If one wishes to stay after sundown (for example, until the morning of ערב פסח) then one should <u>exclude</u> from the early מכירה all the rooms that one would need to use that night (e.g. the hallway, bathroom, bedroom(s), etc.). One would then be **required** to make a בדיקה on the night of ""r in those rooms that were excluded.

40. a) How to write the שטר מכירת חמץ when someone will be using your apartment over Yom Tov, and b) who is obligated in the בדיקה?

Someone who plans on being away for the entire Pesach will generally not spend as much time cleaning and removing than than if they would be staying home. Instead they do a minimal cleanup etc. and in the שטר מכירה they write that they are "renting" the entire apartment sto the גוי (beginning ערב יו"ט) along with all the that is there. Because of this "rental" agreement with the apartment is now "off limits" over Yom Tov (except if he needs to enter for a short time to get an item, see Number 43, and Number 44) and accordingly no one would be permitted to enter and stay in this place during the entire Yom Tov. 84

If someone asks to use the apartment over Yom Tov then the proper way would be to have the מטר מכירה state that the "rental" to

the גוי is only for the places where the ממץ items are being stored (like you would do if you yourself were staying for Yom Tov). Therefore all ממץ items would need to be stored away and the apartment cleaned and a regular בדיקה made. While the obligation for the cleaning and בדיקה would logically be on the apartment owner (since it is his מושט ווא usually the ones asking to use it will arrange to clean it and to make the בדיקה in the proper time (on the night of מושל).

41. Where to Arrange the שטר מכירה When the אמן When the is in a Different Location Than the Seller (Owner)

When people travel out-of-town for מסח they seemingly have a choice of arranging the מכירת חמץ before they leave, through a local Rav, or selling it through a Rav from the area they are going to. However, some פוסקים hold that it is important to specifically use a Rav from your own town (who will then sell the חמץ is located). The

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This also applies to a tenant who goes away and the landlord wants to use the apartment for his guests (e.g. his married children, etc.). The tenant should write in the שטר מכירה that he is renting to the גוי only the places the שטר ומני is being stored, not the entire apartment. The owner would then be responsible to take care of the necessary cleaning and בדיקה of the apartment. [This also applies to a dormitory apartment (דירה) where the students generally go away for Yom Tov and the landlord wishes to use it.

reason for this, they say, is that selling to a non-Jew in a far away city makes it look like less of a "real" sale since why would the non-Jew who lives so far away buy something (i.e. the מומץ in the town that you are from) that is very inconvenient and a bother for him to get to? Therefore, according to these פוסקים, the preferred way would be to have the מומץ sold through a Ray from your hometown.

42. When the אמה is in a Different Time Zone Than the Seller (Owner)*

There is a disagreement in *Halacha* if the prohibition (איסור) of may goes according to the location of the owner (as it generally should according to *Halacha*) or does it <u>also</u> go according to the location of the אמים. Because of the stringency of "ממים that belonged to a Jew over ממים" (חמץ שעבר עליו הפסח) we are stringent in either circumstance. Therefore if someone is on the East Coast of the US and he has חמץ on the West Coast, i.e. California, he has to make sure to sell the ממין before the איסור חמץ starts in the location that he is at (the location of the seller). However if he has in Israel and he is in the US, he needs to have the sale of the may go into effect before the juit in Israel (the location of the pan).

In a case where his ממץ is in Israel and he is in America, due to the time zone difference with Israel, the Rav will have to meet on his behalf with the non-Jew at least seven hours before סוף זמן ביעור in Israel to sell any המץ he may have over there. Also, if he has a place in Israel where he is required to make a בדיקה then the would need to be arranged seven hours before sunset of שכירות המקומות in Israel. The same holds true for any case where the time ממירה is located in a place where the time ממירה begins is earlier than in the location where the מכירה than the regular case of "early מכירה "מכירה mentioned in Number 38, where both the מכירה and the מכירה are in the same time zone. In that case everything occurs at sunset 90 of of the current time zone.)

Note: Sometimes the Rav will make two "early" sales (מכירות), one for those with חמץ in Israel (or Europe etc.) and one for those who have חמץ in a place (in the same time zone) that they do not want to have to clean and check. Therefore, depending on the circumstance, the Rav will ask that you write or indicate on the שטר if it should be sold "early" or "earliest" (for Israel) in order to schedule everything with the non-Jew at the proper time.

When ממח ends the Rav usually buys back the מחח from the non-Jew right after the time that *Yom Tov* is over (see **Number 48**). However if the ממח was located in a place where מפח is over (e.g.

Israel) but he is in a place where it is still מסה (e.g. America),⁹¹ then when filling out the שטר he should mention this to the Rav and tell him **specifically** that he should buy back the מסח for him only after the the time that מסח is over in the location that he is in. If he did not do so, he should have in mind that he does not want to re-acquire the מסח until after מסי ends in the location that he is in. (עי' אג"מ אר"ח ח"ד סי' צ"ד). Similarly, if he is in a place that מסח has ended but his מסח is in a place where it is still מסח, he should mention this to the Rav and have in mind not to re-acquire his מסח until after it is no longer מסח in the place that the מסח is located. (אג"מ שם סי' צ"ה).

There is another case of concern, where someone is in ישראל for חמץ and arranges to sell his חמץ by a Rav over there. When מיז is over in א"ז it is still considered פסח for him because of יו"ט שני. Therefore the Rav should be made aware of this when he arranges the שטר. Then when מסח is over for the Rav, when he buys back the חמץ he has in mind that the חמץ should not yet be reacquired by the one still keeping יום טוב. (The מסר is in the meantime considered to be "owned" by the Rav until מוץ לארץ (חוץ לארץ). See Number 48.

The Place Where the ממן is Stored Over

- 43. Entering the Storage area Where the אמץ is Being kept (on Pesach)

43. Entering on אסף the Storage Area Where the אמץ is Being Kept

During *Yom Tov* one should not enter or open the place(s) where the ממץ is being kept (e.g. to get something non-ממץ from there). However, if it is necessary one is permitted to do so. When doing so some פוסקים recommend that one take along another person to act as a "watchman" (שומר) so that he not use or touch any מון items.

44. If your House was Rented to the Non-Jew, are you Allowed to Enter it over Yom Tov?

If someone goes away for *Yom Tov* and rents all or part ⁹² of his house or apartment to the non-Jew and then wants to enter those areas during *Yom Tov*, he should ask his Rav if he is allowed to do so. ⁹³ In certain circumstances it may be allowed and **sometimes it is**

This refers to rooms in the house which were rented to the non-Jew (so as to not have to do בדיקה in those rooms), not cabinets or closets being used for storing of the תמץ. In a case where he locked up the חמץ in specific locations, then only those places are off limits and obviously he would be allowed to come in during $Yom\ Tov$ to use the rooms (since they were not rented to the non-Jew).

not. If he is allowed he should make sure not to spend his time there as if he was the (current) owner (בעל הבית). Since the place is actually rented to the non-Jew for the entire מסח his entry in those areas should only be for a short period, (דרך עראי).

XI. Other People's חמץ on Your Property

- 45. חמץ Brought to work on חול המועד by non-Jewish Employees
- 46. אמץ left by a Tenant who Moved out
- 47. ממץ in the room / apartment of a live-in maid

45. אמץ Brought to work on Chol Hamo'ed by Non-Jewish Employees

If someone's place of business (office, etc.) is open on חול המועד and he has non-Jewish employees (or Jewish employees who are non-religious) he should tell them that they should be careful with any food that they bring in and clean up any leftovers, etc. You do not need to be concerned with any crumbs (פירורין). (Concerning any leftovers that they throw into the garbage can, one should consult a Rav to see if he is obligated to remove it right away.)

46. אמץ Left by a Tenant who Moved out

If someone's tenant moved out **before** ממח and possibly left over חמץ, the owner is required to make a בדיקה in that apartment etc. on ליל י"ד and get rid of any חמץ that he finds there. If one is unable to take care of this he should arrange an "early" מכירה for this location (i.e. the rental of the place to the non-Jew (שכירת) begins at sunset of the 13th). (See above **Number 38**.) If the tenant moved out **during** סחe should consult a Rav if he is required to check for any par etc..

(Note: One should not enter the empty apartment during חול nor have any workers go there either. Doing work in the apartment is forbidden on חול המועד and even to just go and look what needs to be done after Yom Tov is over is also prohibited.) If the owner already has a new tenant for this apartment who is only planning to move in <u>after</u> *Yom Tov*, if the new tenant is a Jew there is a question who is obligated in making a בדיקה. If the key to the apartment was already given over by the owner to the tenant then <u>the tenant</u> is obligated even if he doesn't plan on moving in any of his belongings until after *Yom Tov*. However in any case where the key was **not** given over yet, one should ask a Rav.

47. אמץ in the Room or Apartment of a Live-in Maid⁹⁴

If someone has a live-in (non-Jewish) maid, any חמץ they may have in their room or apartment belongs to them and you are not required to get rid of it. However, some פוסקים hold that, since you do not rent them the place they are in, therefore it is considered your place and there is an obligation for you to make a בדיקה in their room or apartment on the night of the 14th.

If you wish, you may make an "early מכירה" for that place so that a בדיקה would not be required. If the maid will not be there over סטר, then the entire room can be sold to the non-Jew (in the מסר מכירה) and you should therefore not enter it on פסר wish to use the room over מסר for yourself, however, then a proper on the night of the 14th would be required.

(It should be explained very clearly to the maid that during מסח any any that they possess, whether food or toiletries etc., should be kept and used solely in their room.)

48. How soon after Yom Tov is over is the המץ that was sold to the גוי Permitted to be used?

Generally the Rav meets with the non-Jew immediately after the time of nightfall (צאת הכוכבים) on מוצאי מסח מוצאי and buys back⁹⁵ the rom him. Therefore you should estimate approximately how long this may take⁹⁶ and then you may use the חמץ. It is not necessary to call the Rav to confirm that he bought it back. (Even if you are generally מקפיד on a later מון than the Rav, e.g. the Rav waits 60 minutes after שקיעה to make הבדלה and do אלאכה and your custom (מנהג) is to wait until after 72 minutes, nevertheless it is not considered that you owned the חמץ שעבר עליו) פסח no חמץ is permitted to be used.) ⁹⁷

(See also **Number 42** paragraph 4, concerning if you and the ממץ are in different time zones.)

49. Buying אמץ שעבר עליו הפסח – after Pesach

After Pesach is over people generally go to their stores to purchase and restock with ממח items. However, if the מטר מכירה being bought was owned by a Jew who did not arrange a שטר מכירה, then the that it may not be bought or used by a Jew after Pesach is over. This is a decree from the Sages that was instituted so that people would not be lax in getting rid of their חמץ. The ממן item(s) is forbidden to everyone from ever having any benefit from it.

It should be noted that this הלכה applies in general to items considered חמץ גמור. For example, cakes, cookies, pasta, oatmeal, etc. ⁹⁸ It also applies to תערובות חמץ if there is enough יו in it that you would eat a כזית בכדי אכילת פרס, and also in cases where the gives a noticeable taste to the item (even if less than a מנית בכא"ם). It does not apply to the kind of תעורובות חמץ which has some mixed into it but which is not a כזית בכדי אכילת פרס. For example, soup mixes, etc. (as well as items manufactured on equipment that was previously used with אסניות. ⁹⁹ It also does not apply to any items which are קטניות, for example, ketchup, mustard, vinegar (produced in the US), etc..

Additionaly, many פוסקים hold that this does not apply in the case of a religious Jew who owns a store dealing with מטר ממידה and who certainly made a proper שטר מכירה. Even though there are those that may personally refrain from selling חמץ גמור however the store owner is permitted מכירה that he made with a Rav is considered completely valid and all חמץ in his store may be

bought by **anyone** without any concern. **Even ועי'** קובץ בית. (ועי' קובץ בית. (אהרן וישראל חוברת נח עמ' קכו).

(**Note**: Many Rabbonim are of the opinion that it is improper after מסח to avoid shopping for מסח in stores owned by religious Jews. Doing so hurts the livelihood of a fellow Jew (ויש מצוה דאורייתא), and one should not be overly stringent (מחמיר) in this regard.) 100

Some people buy their חמץ after Pesach in a non-Jewish store assuming that this way the חמץ they are buying was not owned by a Jew over Pesach, but they may be mistaken. The stores buy their items from a distributor and very many of these are owned by Jews who do not sell their ממירה. By avoiding the Jewish stores that did in fact sell their חמץ בהלכה you are more likely to be buying שעבר עליו הפסח because "maybe" there is a problem with the חמץ שעבר עליו הפסח.

50. Finding אמץ during or after Pesach – what should be done with it?

The סיי ממ"ו סעי' א' מחבר writes that if Chometz was found on Pesach, if it was חול המועד then it should be immediately burned, and if it was on יו"ט then it should be covered with a כלי and then burned on מירה. However, in the case where the person had made a שטר Some hold that the ביסקים that was found belongs to the מכירה that was found belongs to the חמץ and therefore should not be burned or destroyed since that would be stealing from the

should be put¹⁰¹ in the place where you put all the other חמץ that you sold. Others hold that you can and must burn it or destroy it and it would not be stealing from the גוי. A third opinion holds that it depends. If the person is someone who sells חמץ גמור then he does not burn it since he intended the שטר מכירה for all his יחמץ including this. If he does not sell חמץ גמור then he should burn it.

There is also the case of finding מסח after פסח. The question is, what should be done with it? Should you throw it out, should you burn it, or are you allowed to keep it and use (eat) it?

As before with מסח המח, the הלכה is that you need to get rid of it, preferably by burning it. However, if you arranged a שטר מכירה, then you do not need to throw it out and you are permitted to use it. This is because the שטר מכירה states that it includes all חמץ that you own whether you remember that you have it and whether it is put away in a special location or not. All of it was sold and belonged to the גוי and not you.

According to some, it would also depend if you generally sell מכירה in your מכירה. If you do, then you can use any חמץ found even if you forgot or were unaware of it. But, if you are careful not to sell חמץ, then if the item that you found is ממי you should get rid of it and destroy it. Others however disagree and hold that even if you are generally מקפיד not to sell חמץ גמור however the שטר used by most Rabbonim these days says that it includes even חמץ גמור. Therefore now, after סיפר, the שמעתי בשם הרה"ג ר') to be used and eaten. XIII. Selling אמץ when erev Pesach comes out on Shabbos

51. How to Arrange מכירת המץ in a year that erev Pesach comes out on Shabbos

51. מכירת חמץ when Erev Pesach comes out on Shabbos

When ערב פסח ערב פסח שבת we arrange the מכירה with the Rav like a year that ערב פסח ערב comes out on Friday. That means we sign the שטר before the 5^{th} hour on Friday even though eating and possessing חמץ is allowed all day Friday until the 5^{th} hour on Shabbos morning. The reason is so that we should not make a mistake the following year and delay coming to the Rav until after the 5^{th} hour (on ערב יו"ט) when it would be too late to make the מכירה.

Therefore, all the cabinets designated for storing the ממץ and the ממץ utensils should be marked off before Friday. Also all ממץ that we are not selling and are not eating on Shabbos should be disposed of (burned etc.) before the end of the fifth hour on Friday. We make בדיקת חמץ (and say כל חמירא (כל חמירא) on Thursday night (with a ברכה) and we arrange to burn the ממץ before the end of the fifth hour (לכתחילה). (However we do not say כל חמירא after the burning on Friday, rather we say it on Shabbos morning, before the end of the fifth hour). 104

For those making an "early" מכירה, they would follow the same procedure as they would on a regular year.

As far as when the actual sale occurs, generally the Rav will tell the גוי that the sale will go into effect at עי' פסקי on Friday (עי' פסקי on rי' אות r" אות r").

In the sale with the גוי it is stipulated that חמץ being left over for the meals on Shabbos are not included in the sale. According to some this stipulation is written in the שטר, but according to others it should **not** be written in but should be mentioned על פה.

If on Friday you find any item that you forgot to put away, you can put it into the storage area or cabinet. If the η item was found on Shabbos you should ask your Rav.

52. Are You Required to Make a בדיקה in the Storage Areas (closets, cabinets, etc.) That the the אמץ Will be Located in Over Yom Tov?

Many פוסקים hold ¹⁰⁵ that you are **not obligated** to make a crypt on the night of ליל י"ד) בדיקת חמץ items are being stored (i.e. the cabinets and the closets etc.) since you in any case intend to rent it out the next day (בבוקר י"ד) to the non-Jew ¹⁰⁶ and after which time the area would י"ד belong to the non-Jew (since you will be renting the storage area to him as well). Other פוסד ¹⁰⁷ disagree and hold that all places including those locations where the חמץ items will be stored over need to be checked on the night of מביקת חמץ, since when the night of the 14th begins these places still belong to you (the rental to the non-Jew only begins later the next day). To also accommodate the opinion of those who are stringent (המחמירין) there are those who ask the Rav to have the rental period of those storage places begin before the time for ליל י"ד) i.e. "early" מכירה "See Number 38.)

53. The Importance of Fulfilling the Mitzvah of Bedikas Chometz (and not to avoid doing so).

As mentioned (**Number 38**), a person can arrange an early מכירה (before sunset סכירה) and thereby not be obligated to make בדיקת חמץ. There is however a special בדיקת המץ to make בדיקת חמץ to make (ליל י"ד) 108 and it is not proper to arrange things in a way that allows someone to completely avoid doing a things in a way that allows someone to completely avoid doing a (עי' שו"ע סי' תל"ו ס"ג). Therefore in order to at least in some way perform the בדיקת חמץ of מצוה he should arrange to leave over a room (or rooms) that is not included in the rental to the non-Jew and then make the בדיקה in that specific room (and with a ברכה (ליל י"ד). (See Number 55.)

54. The Importance of Fulfilling the Mitzvah of Bedikas Chometz Specifically on ליל י"ד ניסן.

As mentioned earlier if someone were to go away for Pesach (within 30 days of יו"ט), he is required to make בדיקת חמץ on the **night** immediately prior to his leaving his home. However, he would

While a person who makes a בדיקה within 30 days of *Pesach* is also fulfilling this *Mitzvah*, nevertheless on the night of 14 *Nissan* it is especially important because that was the עיקר תקנה when *Chazal* instituted the requirement of and it is only on this night that one would make a ברכה when doing it. Therefore it would be most preferable to try to arrange that you are בדיקה the בדיקה or בדיקה.

The room that he will be leaving over to make the בדיקה on should be a room that is one where מקום שמכניסין בו חמץ). Also, while he can specify that he is only leaving over part of a room to search, it is preferable that it is a whole room. (ויש אומרים דצריך להיות לכל הפחות מקום של ד' על ד' אמרת).

not make a ברכה when doing the בדיקה is made only when the ברכה is done on the night of the 14^{th} of Nisan.

While in this case the person has fulfilled his obligation to search and remove any Chometz belonging to him, nevertheless there are some Poskim¹¹⁰ who hold that בדיקה the בדיקה should be done specifically on the night of the 14th, and doing so earlier (according to them) would only be בדיעבד (since you would not make a (ברכה). The question is how someone leaving his home for Yom Tov prior to ליל י"ד would be able to fulfill this requirement. (Assuming that he would be unable to travel to his home on ליל י"ד.)

There are a number of instances of a person going away for Pesach. One would be where he is going to spend Yom Tov by someone's home (a relative or friend etc.). A second case would be someone going to a hotel for all or part of Yom Tov (or something similar).

When going to someone for Pesach, generally the person you are going to will be making בדיקת חמץ. You can help them with part of that שליח and be their שליח (and **perhaps** may even be able to make a ברכה on this בדיקה) but technically you would not be making your "own" בדיקת חמץ since you are looking for **their**.

Some hold¹¹¹ that if you are given a private room (which has a מקום אם on it i.e. a מקום שמכניסין בו חמץ) to stay in over Yom Tov, then you can make the בדיקה in that room with a ברכה (even if the room is "given" to you without a קנין). Others say that if you would "rent" the room that you are staying in from your host (for a

nominal amount) you would be obligated to make a בדיקה, since the הלכה is that a renter has an obligation to make a הלכה. ¹¹² However, not everyone agrees with this "solution" and are unsure if you would be fulfilling **your** obligation. ¹¹³ ¹¹⁴

Others say that if you have a car, then you can make the בדיקה on the car and you would fulfill your בדיקה that way. that way. They also hold that you could make a ברכה when making the בדיקה on the car. However, others disagree and hold that while you are required to make a בדיקה on your car (see above, Number 30) you cannot make a ברכה on this בדיקה They hold that a car has the same דין as an appliance (כלי) i.e. like a refrigerator or oven. While you are required to remove the מול המץ found on your appliances you would not make a ברכה on the בדיקה if this was the only item that you would be making the בדיקה on. The option of making a ברכה, they say, is only when the בדיקה on. The option of making a ברכה say, is only when the בדיקה is being made on a place that you can live in, i.e. a בדיקה (The first opinion says that a car is a place that you sometimes eat in and also can sleep in and therefore is similar to a house, though you don't actually live in it.)

Concerning someone going to a hotel, they would be obligated to make a ברכה on ליל י״ד in their hotel room with a ברכה. If they arrived at the hotel the morning of erev Yom Tov (i.e. not ליל י״ד), they would make a בדיקה (with a ברכה) right away when they move into the room. And the same would apply if they arrived on חול (i.e. not on דו״ט וf it is a מחל hotel, then if he arrives on ערב יו״ט he should try to find out if a בדיקה was made the night before. If it was not then he should make the בדיקה at the time that he arrives (with a ברכה) and someone else had been using this room for the first days of יו״ט he should try to find out if a בדיקה and someone else had been using this room for the first days

cannot get this information, he should ask a שאלה by a Rav what to do or he should make a ברכה, without a ברכה.)

55. How to be יוצא the מצוה of בדיקת המץ when you will be going away for all of Yom Tov

Someone going away for the entire Yom Tov, and is leaving within 30 days of מסח, is required to make בדיקת חמץ before he leaves home. He should do so on the night prior to his leaving see footnote 80). For many people making a full and proper is difficult, so if they wish they may write in the שטר מכירה that they are renting to the גוי their entire home, and that the rental should begin on the 13th of Nissan, prior to sunset. This way, when it becomes ליל (the time when בדיקה needs to be done) the place is now rented to the and they are no longer obligated to make בדיקת חמץ however, in order for them to be properly fulfill the מצוה say that you should leave over [at least] one room in which to do the בדיקה (according to some, an area of 4 amos by 4 amos is sufficient). You do this by writing in the שטר the specific room (or area) that you do not want to rent to the גוי and therefore your בדיקה to make a חיוב of the make a nor remains. (See Number 53.)

This applies whether you are leaving a few days before Yom Tov or even if you are leaving on Erev Yom Tov. You need to leave over at least one room that you are not renting to the גוי in order to make a בדיקה. (The difference between leaving a few days before or leaving after ליל י"ד is that on ליל י"ד you would make the בדיקה with a בדיקה.)

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With a candle/flashlight, and some hold that you should put out 10 pieces of bread (but others disagree and say only when you do it on ליל י"ד you put out the bread).

56. Questions regarding בדיקת חמץ

Q: If I make בדיקת חמץ "early" (on a different night before ליל do the same בדיקה בליל י"ד apply? Do I have to start at the beginning of the night? Am I allowed to eat or learn before I will begin the בדיקה?

A: No these דינים do not apply. The (primary) reason for not eating or learning when the time for בדיקה begins (i.e. right after צאת begins (i.e. right after הכוכבים) is because we are afraid that a person will get very involved in his activity (eating, learning) and forget to make the בדיקה. Since when making אי" (for example on ליל (for example on י"ד before the night of "" (for example on בדיקה עבדיקה) there is still at least one other night to make the חסל הבדיקה we are not concerned that he may forget. Q: If I already made my kitchen "kosher-for-Pesach" a few days before Pesach and am already set up and cooking for Pesach etc., should the kitchen be checked for מיל בדיקת חמץ (and can I put some of the 10 pieces of bread there)?

A: When the kitchen is finished being cleaned and you want to start Pesach cooking, לכתחילה **it should be checked for חמץ** (at night) **before** covering and lining the shelves and sink etc. and **before** starting to use it to prepare for פסת. But if a בדיקה was not

done but the cleaning was thorough, בדיעבד it is fine. Also, once the kitchen has been prepared for מסח has been completely removed, you should **not** put any of the ten pieces of bread there.

Similarly if the refrigerator has already been cleaned and lined etc. and all ממן removed, and you began using it to store ממן items it is not necessary to remove everything and check it for ליל י"ד on דמץ, (though בדיקה ti should have first had a בדיקה with a candle/flashlight).

Q: If I don't have a candle or flashlight, can I make בדיקת חמץ?

Do I make a ברכה:

A: בדיעבד if you are unable to obtain a candle or a flashlight, and the room is sufficiently lit, you can make בדיקת חמץ and also make a ברכה (if it is דרכה). (ליל י"ד (ליל י"ד).

Q: Do I make ליל י״ד on the table that I will be eating my מרב meal the next morning (ערב יו״ט)?

A: If it is a large table and you will eat on one end, then you should make the בדיקה on the part that you will not be eating on. If you will use the whole table for your morning meal then you do not check it on בדיקת חמץ at night and you make a בדיקת חמץ in the morning after you finish with your .125

57. What is כל חמירא and who should say it

כל חמירא is a statement a person makes through which they renounce ownership of all חמץ that they own, and that our Sages instituted to be said immediately after completing בדיקת חמץ. (Say it

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According to הגרש"ז אוירבאך זצ"ל you have a חיוב to make a בדיקה on the table at night (לאור הנר) and then in the morning you just clean up from what you ate and check the area. (ע"ב שיעור מאת הר' ניסן קפלן שליט"א בעניני בדיקת חמץ, שנת תשע"א).

only when the בדיקה is **completed**.) Additionally, since we leave over some אמירא until the morning, the כל חמירא is said again at the end of the fifth hour on the morning of the 14th of Nisan (after the burning of the חמץ) (See below **Number 59**). By saying כל חמירא and "nullifying" the חמץ and declaring it "ownerless" a person is no longer its legal owner and will thereby not be guilty of transgressing the prohibition (איסור) of possessing מיסור) מיסור.

Generally the head of the household will make the בדיקת חמץ etc. and say afterward כל חמירא. However, in fact <u>anyone</u> who owns any or מערובות חמץ is required to get rid of it before מחמירא say כל חמירא.

The ספר לקט יושר writes that when saying the בעל חמירא all members of the household should be present to listen to the בעל as he says it and they should have in mind as well any nthat they may personally own. Some contemporary ספרים write¹²⁶ that all members of the home should say it (aloud), including the wife and all the children (male and female). I also found that this was done by Hagaon HaRav Shlomo Zalman Auerbach זצ"ל at his home. Similarly, I have seen brought down that this was the custom by Hagaon HaRav Chaim Kanievski שליט"א that his wife and children would say the כל חמירא both at night and by day. 127

(Note: when saying כל חמירא it is essential that you understand the words being said for it to be effective. See further, Number 58.)

58. The correct meaning of כל חמירא

The person saying כל חמירא needs to understand what it is that he is saying for there to be ביטול. Without understanding the meaning, the כל חמירא is worthless and he has not made ביטול. While many people seem to understand the words in their original Aramaic, there is a part that may cause a misunderstanding.

The mark נוסח begins as follows: כל חמירא וחמיעא א איכא ברשותי.

The general understanding and the common translation of איכא is "that is in my possession." However, that is incorrect. The proper meaning is "that I am the owner of." If you understand it to mean as "in my possession" it makes it seem as if only Chometz that is in your house or a property that you own is being gotten rid of. However you are in fact attempting to remove your ownership (בעלות) over ANY Chometz of yours even if it is to be found in a location that is not yours.

Therefore there are some who say (at night): 128 כל חמירא וחמיעא דאיכא ברשותי דאיכא ברשותי בכל מקום שהוא דאיכא ברשותי ובעלותי בכל מקום שהוא 129 דארעא ליה ליבטל ולהוי הפקר כעפרא דארעא

The English translation of the above (the כל חמירא that is said after the בדיקה at night)¹²⁸ would be as follows:

59. The reason we say כל חמירא twice

60. Questions regarding כל חמירא

Q: If I am a שליח to make בדיקת חמץ for someone else, do I also say the כל חמירא for him when I finish?

i.e. the ten pieces and any other חמץ that we may have found during the בדיקה.

See further **Number 60** (page 121) if you said the כל חמירא at night and forgot to say it in the morning (on ערב יו"ט).

A: It is preferable for the person who owns the חמץ to say the כל חמירא, however a שליח is allowed to say it. Therefore, if you are unsure if the person wanted you to also be their כל also for שליח you should say it just in case. The proper שליח for the שליח yould be: כל חמירא וחמיעא דאיכא ברשות פלוני וכו'. If you are doing it on behalf of your father you would say: דאיכא ברשות אבי מורי, (for your mother: ברשות אמי מורתי).

Q: If I make בדיקת חמץ before ליל י"ד, do I say כל חמירא then?

A: Yes.¹³² When you finish בדיקת חמץ you say כל חמירא even though it is earlier then י"ד. Also, in such a case (when the בדיקה is before ליל י"ד), when saying the כל חמירא you should say it as follows: כל חמירא.

Q: If I am making בדיקת חמץ in a different home that I own (for example a summer home) before ליל י"ד, do I say the כל חמירא then?

A: Based on the (סי' תל"ו סק"ג) it would seem that you should. 134

Q: What is the כל חמירא at night but forgot to say it a second time in the morning?

A: According to the שו"ע הרב (סי' תל"ד סעי' י"ג) as long as you said it at night you were מקיים the ביטול of עיקר דין with that alone (עי' שם).

Q: Does the גבאי who is making בדיקת חמץ in the Shul, say the כל חמירא when he finishes the בדיקה?

A: If it is a "public" Shul (not owned by an individual), then he does not say כל חמירא afterwards¹³⁶ because the חמץ there is not owned by anyone. He is only making a בדיקה so that no חמץ is found during יו"ט and might accidentally be eaten. (In a privately owned Shul the owner should say it.)¹³⁷

61. Questions regarding burning the חמץ

Ideally the חמץ found by בדיקת המץ should be **a)** burned **b)** by yourself **c)** at the beginning of the fifth hour of the day on ערב 138 If you are unable have it burned, then any method that gets rid of it is allowed (for example, flushing it down a toilet). If it is not

possible for you yourself to do it, then you can have someone else (a שליח) burn the חמץ (or get rid of it) for you. ¹³⁹ If you cannot do the burning on erev Yom Tov, then you can do it any day within 30 days of Pesach (see further, and see **footnote 137**).

Q: If I am making בדיקת חמץ a few days before Yom Tov can I burn the next morning or do I need to wait until ערב יו"ט?

A: You can burn the Chometz the next morning and it would be considered that you were יוצא making (תשביתו) through ביעור חמץ (עי' מ"ב סי' תמ"ה ס"ק ח' וע"ע בשער הציון ס"ק ט"ז). However the (עי' מ"ב סי' תמ"ה ס"ק ח' וע"ע בשער הציון ס"ק ט"ז) should be said on כל חמירא, see above **Number 60,** top of page 121.)

Q: If I make ליל י"ד on ליל and am then traveling and am unable to burn the morning, can I burn it **at night**?

A: Yes. If there is a need you can burn it at night right after making the בדיקה (or anytime after). As usual when doing בדיקה , in this case too the כל חמירא, in this case too the בליל י"ד. However if at night you are finished with <u>all</u> your pan and do not intend to have anymore חמץ in the morning (ערב יו"ט), then **after you** burn the pan at night you can and should say the version of כל חמירא (כל חמירא). 141

And afterwards the שליח should immediately inform you so that you can say the סוף זמן ביעור חמץ (before סוף זמן ביעור חמירא).

The numbers mentioned in the "Frequently Asked Questions" section refer to the numbers in the first part of the קונטרס (Sections I – XIV).

Why do I need to specify the type of ממץ I am selling?
 Can't I just check off "everything"?

(See Number 15.)

NOTE: The ממץ items that you are checking off are ממץ items that you want to put away and sell. It is NOT the ממף items that you "maybe" have (that maybe are hiding somewhere) and that you are including in the שטר "just in case." The מטר items that you "maybe" have are written in a different part of the שטר.

2. What if I forgot to check off one of the types of אחת that I do have and that I want to sell? Am I required to come back to "fix" the שטר?

It's not necessary as the שטר states that you also include any other that you own.

3. What if I check off something that I don't have?

Though לכתחילה you should not do so, it is still a valid מכירה.

4. Why do I need to specify the locations where the γαπ will be? Why can't I just write "everywhere" that it is located?

The reason the שטר should give the location that the המץ is being stored is in order for the buyer (the non-Jew) to know where it is.

Writing "wherever it may be" does not look like he is really buying something. (Note: In the שטר you should write all the location(s) of the that you remember and are aware of but other places that you left out are also included.)

5. I put my אחת and אחת utensils in a closet and wrote the place in the שטר. May I change the location to a different closet?

Once the קנין is made with the גוי you should not change the location of the חמץ. This is especially true if it is already after the סוף סמן ביעור ממץ. If necessary, you should consult with your Rav.

6. What if I specified in the שטר the location/storage area where the אחר will be and then I changed my mind and did not put the חמץ there but instead put it somewhere else. Do I need to go back to the Rav and change what I wrote in the שטר?

See previous question. If this is before the Rav made the קנין with the שטר some say it is not necessary to change the שטר since it says in the man the may will help the buyer (the חמץ) get access to the חמץ and the גוי is relying primarily on that rather than what's written in the though לכתחילה the actual location should be written clearly in the Rav Willer (See Number 17)

7. I don't know how much my חמץ is worth. What should I do?

Try to make a reasonable estimate. It would be best to go over all the אַטר you are selling before you come to the Rav to fill out the ...שטר.

8. Can I write the "value" as \$0.00? Can I write "between \$0.00 and \$5.00"? How about "between \$0.00 and \$50.00"?

You cannot write that the value is "0" as then it does not look like a מכירה at all. Writing an indeterminate amount (not exact) is also a problem since it creates less סמיכת דעת in the קנין. It would be better to write a low amount (e.g. \$2 or \$5) rather than "between this and that" (or a high amount). (See **Number 16** and **footnote 30**.)

9. I am leaving before the night of י"ד ניסן but am making a full בדיקה (without a ברכה) the night before I leave, when should the מכירה

Even though you are making an early בדיקה, if you are making a "regular" complete מכירה then the מכירה should be scheduled at the "regular" time i.e. when the Rav meets with the buyer (גוי) on Erev Pesach (not an early מכירה).

10. I will not be in my home for *Yom Tov* and don't want to clean the whole place but want to make a בדיקה on only part. How do I do this?

This can be done through what is known as an "early מכירה" (see Number 38). You write in the שטר מכירה that you want to rent your entire house (or apt.) to the non-Jew before sundown of י"ג, ניסן, except for one room. Then on the night of בדיקת חמץ you will fulfill the a מצוה on this one room (with a בדיקה מצוה). (See footnote 78.) (Note: the same would apply if you are making בדיקת חמץ earlier than ליל י"ד. There would be a קיום מצות בדיקה, however in order for it to be a מצוה you need to specifically exclude in the שטר at least a room (or area of at least a room (ד' אמות על ד' אמות על ד' אמות אור בייקה from the rental.)

11. I made an early מכירה on most of my house so as not to have to make a בדיקה on those rooms. Am I allowed to use those rooms on the night of י"ד ניסן or can I use only those rooms that I did not make an "early" מכירה מכירה

There is a dispute concerning this. Many פּוֹסקים hold that any of the rooms that you will be using on ליל י״ד (as well as the next morning) you cannot make an "early" מכירה since you are still using them and therefore you need to make a regular ליל י״ד on them on בדיקה and rely on the opinion of the Chasam Sofer and hold that since all the מכירה in these rooms will in fact be sold to the non-Jew the next day (ערב פסח) worning at the end of the 5th hour), therefore you are permitted to use the room tonight and do not have a חיוב בדיקה. (See **Number 39** and **52.**)

12. I want to make an "early" מכירה for any מכירה that "might" be in the <u>trunk</u> of my car and not use the trunk over Pesach but still use the car itself (and make a בדיקה just on the car itself). Can I do this (<u>and not have to do בדיקה in the trunk</u>)?

See Number 30.

13. How do I fill out the שטר מכירה when selling the חמץ for someone else?

Fill out all the information as you would your own. When you sign, you sign **your** name *"in the name of"* the person who you are arranging it for. When signing in Hebrew you would sign: Your Name "בְּעַד" the person whom you are signing for. For example: ראובן גאלד (See **Number 33.**)

14. My daughter works in New York and shares an apartment with a number of friends. They are all leaving for Pesach. Who makes the בדיקה and how is the מכירת חמץ arranged?

Each one should clean up and discard their own חמץ. If they wish to put some חמץ items away (for example: cosmetics, vitamins, medications etc.) and include it in the שטר מכירה they should designate a closet or cabinet etc. and mark it off. The same should be done for their חמץ utensils (they should be washed and put away). The night before each of them leaves they should make a מביקה of their area. For the "shared" space (kitchen, dining room etc.) one person can do the בדיקה for all (the night before they leave for Yom Tov).

Concerning מכירת חמץ they should decide amongst themselves to designate one person as the שליח for all of them (this can be done over the phone) and then that person should have a שטר מכירה done and write in it that is on behalf of all the occupants of this apartment. Also <u>each of them</u> should remember to say סוף זמן before סוף זמן (See Number 57) (It should also be mentioned to the Rav if any of them will be spending Pesach in a different time zone.)

15. When signing the שטר do I sign my English signature or do I sign it in Hebrew? Also, if I sign in English, do I need to use my "legal" name (i.e. my name as it appears on official documents)?

Halachically speaking it makes no difference. However, some sign the "large" שטר הרשאה with their Hebrew name (since that שטר they sign with their legal name since it is written to look more like a legal contract.

(<u>NOTE</u>: It is important to sign the שטר as you normally do when signing any legal document (like a mortgage application, credit card application, car loan etc.), and not just scribble on the line.)

- 16. "Chometz & you" in different time zones: 4 cases
- a. [Case #1: Chometz at home and you are traveling EAST]
 "I am going to Europe/Eretz Yisroel for Pesach. How do
 I arrange the מכירה? Do I need to make a בדיקה?"

When filling out the שטר מכירה you should tell the Rav where you will be for Yom Tov. Since for you Pesach will begin earlier than the place where the pau you are selling is located he will arrange for the מכירה to take place earlier as well i.e. before מכירה (See Number 42.)

As far as the בדיקה, if it is within 30 days of Pesach, the דין is you are obligated to make a בדיקה on any property you own or rent, and you should לכתחילה make it the night before you leave (see **FAQ #17**). If for some reason you are unable to do so, you should ask the Rav making the מכירה to arrange that the place you own or rent is rented to the יוז for the duration of $Yom\ Tov$ and that the rental goes into effect before it is sundown of י"x in the place that you are located.

b. [Case #2: Chometz at home and you are traveling WEST] "I live in Brooklyn and am going to Los Angeles for Pesach. What time after Yom Tov ends will the γαπ be bought back?"

Generally the γαπ is bought back by the Rav as soon as *Yom Tov* is over. However, since at that time where you are (L.A.) it will still be

Yom Tov, you should tell the Rav that you do not want the מוצאי to be bought back for you until it is מוצאי יו"ט in the place that you are. (See **Number 42**.)

c. [Case #3: You are at home and your ממיר is in the WEST]

Yes. Even though where you are *Pesach* will have ended and you are permitted to own γαπ once again, nevertheless you should not own any γαπ that is located in a place where it is still *Pesach*. You should let the Rav know about this and you should not reclaim ownership of that γαπ <u>until after *Pesach* ends over there</u>. (See **Number 42**, last paragraph.)

d. [Case #4: You are at home and your אח is in the EAST] "I am home for Yom Tov in Lakewood, but I have חמץ ממץ וtems (utensils etc.) and some מפק חמץ items in my דירה in ארץ ישראל וואל. No one made a בדיקה before leaving. What can I do about this? How do I arrange the מכירת חמץ? "(כל חמירא items) ביטול items."

If possible you should try to get someone to go make a בדיקה in the איר, preferably on ליל י"ד. (If the שליח makes it on ליל י"ד, preferably on ליל י"ד. (If the makes it on ליל י"ד.) If you cannot get someone then you should see to it that the apt. is rented to the גוי before יום י"ג on עקיעה (Israel time). Then, since on ליל י"ד you are no longer the renter of this apt., you

When arranging the שטר מכירה you can arrange it on behalf of everyone in the דירה, even if they did not appoint you to do it on their behalf (מטעם זכין ומטעם אומדנא). Even if you arranged to not be מחויב in the דירה (with an early rental to the גוי you still need to make דירה וt would be best if **each person** would say כל חמירא. It would be best if **each person** would say כל חמירא for you cannot reach them and are unsure if they said it, you should first say כל חמירא for yourself and then say כל חמירא for the others in the

(Note: When you say the כל חמירא for yourself you say the regular כל חמירא וחמיעא דאיכא ברשותי וכו') נוסח. When you say the ביטול for the בחורים in the דירה you say a slightly different כל חמירא וחמיעא - נוסח.

17. a. If I need to make the בדיקה before ליל מ"ד (for example, in an office) does it need to be made specifically on the last night that I am there or can the בדיקה be done even a few nights earlier? b. Can I be בדיק part of my house before ליל מ"ד?

If you are careful to no longer bring in any אמח after the בדיקה then, if necessary, the בדיקה can be done before the last night. So if you want to make the בדיקה in your office or factory or vacation home etc. before the regular night of בדיקת חמץ (i.e. ליל י"ד) then it can be done any night prior (and then no yan should be brought there). The same is true if you are going away for Yom Tov and it will be hectic the night of ליל י"ד, and it therefore may not be done properly, you should do it earlier on all or part of the apartment (and avoid bringing or using איד there). Also in your home, if it is difficult to do everything on בדיקה on part of the house earlier. (See Number 53 and 60.)

EXPLANATIONS FOR FILLING OUT THE SHTAR HARSHA'AH

- TIME WHEN SALE GOES INTO EFFECT There are three options listed for the time that the sale should go into effect (explained in detail below). You need to select and check off the proper time. → NOTE: If left blank (i.e. not checked) the chometz will be sold at the final (latest) time.
- **2 EARLIEST** If this time is checked off it means that the *chometz* etc. will be sold on the morning of 13 Nissan. If you have *chometz* items and/or utensils in Israel (and will be unable to make a בדיקה there on the night of the 14th of Nissan) this is what should be checked off. (See **Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 38** and **Number 42**).
- **EARLY** If this time is checked off it means that the *chometz* etc. will be sold in the afternoon of 13 Nissan. This is what should be checked off if you have *chometz* in Europe **OR** if you have *chometz* in a location that you will be unable to (or do not wish to) make a בדיקה on the night of the 14th of Nissan. (See **Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 38** third paragraph, also see **Number 42 "NOTE"** and **Number 44**).
- ◆ FINAL If you check off this time it means that the *chometz* etc. will be sold at the "regular time" at the end of the fifth hour on the morning of 14 Nissan. This is the latest possible time for the *chometz* to be sold and is the time that most people should check off. (Check off this time even in a case where you are

- leaving your house before ערב פסח and will be making the מדיקה **before** the night of 14 Nissan.)
- Here you write in **the name of the Rabbi** arranging the sale (i.e. the Rabbi that you are giving this document to). If you don't know his name leave it blank and fill it in when you are by him. (There are **three** places in the document that his name needs to be filled in.)
- When checking off the items that you want to include in the sale try to check off only those that apply. (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 15 second paragraph). Checking off everything on the list is not the preferred way. However, in a case where you plan to throw out all items which are chometz etc., and you are only making a שטר "just in case," then you can write "Any chometz that I may own." (Write it on the lines which say "In addition I wish to specify the following..."). Similarly, if you will be going away and not be at home at all over מסח you can just write "all chometz found at my home/apt. etc." (However, even in the case of going away for all מכתחילה it is יוייט preferable to specify as much as possible.)
- **CHOMETZ LIST** This is a list of many common items that people own and <u>want to keep</u> (by selling it to the non-Jew). (See **Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 15 par. 3**). **Note**: If you forgot and left something off, don't worry it <u>will</u> be included in the sale.

- **8 CHOMETZ AFFIXED TO ETC.** This is a list of some household items where it is common to find *chometz* attached to it.
- 9 CHOMETZ BELONGING TO YOUR CHILDREN (skip if children no longer live at home) NOTE: This item is not written in the shtar of Rabbi Blech.

Chometz belonging to your children living at home (or away during the year at yeshiva/school) are <u>not</u> automatically included in the sale that you are making. If you wish to include them you need to inform them (preferably beforehand) that you will be selling their *chometz* for them and check off this item on the document. (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 34).

- **D** LOCATIONS It is important to list the areas where the *chometz* you are selling will be located (stored) over Pesach. (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 17, see also Numbers 27 32). Please note: in case you forget to list a place, it is nevertheless included.
- **PRIMARY PLACES OF THE CHOMETZ** This should be a list of the main places where you intend to store the *chometz* as well as utensils etc. (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Frequently Asked Questions, number 4.)
- **10 LOCATIONS WRITTEN ON BACK OF DOCUMENT** The שטר is being made for all *chometz* that belongs to you. This includes any **specific** *chometz* at work or at a summer home or a car(s) (that you

will not be using over Pesach). (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 17.) The location for these places needs to be specified clearly in the שטר. (Note: if you will not be going to those locations over Pesach you can just write the address of the location and write that you are selling "all chometz found there" (though לכתחילה it would be best to list the specific chometz being sold). Otherwise write the specific location of the chometz items to be found there.) Also the location of the your children should be written in the you, see Number 34.

- **B** SPECIAL RENTAL This is for those wishing to sell/rent their entire house (or apt.) before the 14th of Nissan and thereby not be required to make a בדיקה on the night of 14 Nissan. In order to still fulfill the מצוה some part of the house would need to be excluded from the rental to the non-Jew. Write the specific areas that you wish to exclude from the sale/rental. (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 38 and Number 53).
- **SHARES, STOCKS** If you own any shares in a company that owns or deals in *chometz* items, please indicate in the *shtar* that it should be included. (See **Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 21.**)
- GOODS IN TRANSIT This refers to *chometz* or possible *chometz* items that have been shipped to you via messenger, mail or UPS etc. and will arrive either on Pesach or were in transit during the days of Pesach. (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 27.)

- Period OF TIME Write in the secular dates from <u>Erev</u>
 Pesach through the last (8th) day of Pesach. For example: In
 2018 the dates would be March 30, 2018 to April 7, 2018.
- REYS The location of the keys for the storage area(s) or house or business (or car) need to be written in clearly. (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 20 and Number 24). If you will be at home you can write "at address listed below." If you will be in multiple locations, write that in as well. If a neighbor or a landlord has a key/access you can write their address. (If your neighbor or landlord lives at the same address write their apartment number. For example: "apt. 2" or "upstairs neighbor.") If you use a combination lock you can write the combination in the שטר (in Hebrew if you wish) or write it on a piece of paper and give it to the Ray to hold separately.
- **® RENT OR SELL** the storage places For the sale to be valid the storage locations (i.e. cabinet or closet) need to be sold or rented to the non-Jew. (See **Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 25**).
- **(b) KEY TO THE CAR** If you are including the *chometz* in your car in the sale, you must write in the *shtar* where the key to the car will be over <u>all</u> 8 days of Pesach (and also on Erev Pesach, after the fifth hour). (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 30).

<u>Note</u>: if you have separate keys for the locks (doors, trunk) and the ignition, you need only give the key to the doors/trunk.

- **ACCESS TO THE CHOMETZ** This sentence means that you agree to give the **buyer** permission to enter any part of your home necessary for him to have access to the *chometz* that he is acquiring through this *shtar*. This is known as דריסת רגל to be valid.
- VALUE It is necessary to write an approximate value of the chometz being sold. (Do not include the value of the appliance etc. only the value of the actual chometz.) The value cannot be a very high (exaggerated) amount and it cannot be "zero." A reasonable estimate should be written. (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 16 and also Number 21).
- **22 AMOUNTS AND VALUE OF INDIVIDUAL PRODUCTS** Those who wish can write this information on the back of the document (or on a separate paper attached to the document (Note: Many hold that it is not necessary to have these details written in the document, but others hold that it should be done if at all possible.)
- **3 KINYAN** (קנין סודר) This is done in order to solidify the Rabbi's status as your representative in the sale of the *chometz* to the non-Jew. See **Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz:**Number 12 for a full explanation of this (and also see there footnote 17 and 19).
- ② DAY/MONTH/YEAR Fill out the secular date (clearly). (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 20).
- SIGNATURE This should be your regular "legal" signature (in English). (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: footnote

- **17**). (Also see **Number 33** regarding how to sign the *shtar* when filling out the document of behalf of someone else.)
- NAME/PHONE Make sure to write these clearly. (See Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz: Number 20). The phone number must be one that you generally pick up and/or check messages.
- **ADDRESS** Usually you write the address of the place that the *chometz* will be at (i.e. your home). If it is an apartment, write in the apt. number and if it's a basement apartment write that **clearly**. If this document is for אם located not at your home e.g. *chometz* at your business or summer home etc., the **address** for those locations should be written above where it says "LOCATIONS." (If the שטר is only for those other locations then here you should write the address of where you will be staying over שטר.)

 NOTE: A P.O. box is not acceptable.
- FOR RABBI'S USE This applies only if the Rabbi is transferring his authorization to sell the *chometz* to someone else (i.e. another Rabbi). The Rabbi (or designee) that you are giving this document to needs to fill out this part.
- **NAME** The Rabbi (or designee) who is arranging the filling out of this document writes his name on this line.
- SIGNATURE The Rabbi (or designee) signs here in order to transfer his authorization ("power-of-attorney") to the Rabbi that will be conducting the actual sale of the Chometz to the non-Jew.

מטר הרשאה (הכללי) and it's translation

As mentioned (see Practical Guide to Mechiras Chometz, **Number 13** par. 3), in many places it has become the מנהג to use **two** types of שטר. One is the "big" שטר, in which there is basically a long Hebrew text (נוסח) on top and underneath people sign their name. In this generally not too many details are given for each person's particular yan that is being sold. Primarily it has their name and address. (In some places people add the locations of the מבירה and the value.) While it is certainly a valid שטר, some felt that to make the מבירה look more concrete a more detailed שטר should be used. This lead to the development by Rabbi Blech (and others) for the separate detailed individual שטר in use in Lakewood (and also in many other communities).

However, since it was a long established מנהג to use the "big" שטר (especially in Europe), the נוהג si עולם to use it also. Now before a person signs a document he should read it first, yet the fact remains that when coming to the Rov to sell the chometz the שטר is hardly given a glance.

First, it is written in Hebrew. Second, the letters are very small. And third, it is very long. The Poskim write that לכתחילה before signing one should at least read the main parts to understand what it is that he is signing.

To alleviate this issue, I have decided to print the שטר here in clear and readable אותיות. I have also tried to provide an accurate English translation. In addition, I have highlighted the main parts so that those in a rush can quickly glance and have a general understanding of the שטר.

I have also seen the שטר הרשאה as used by HaGaon HaRav Y.E. Henkin זצ״ל as well as the individual שטרות used by the Bais Din of K.A.J. and the Bais Din of Australia. I have found them interesting and enlightening and have printed them here as well.

Translation of the Shtar Harsha'ah

(the shtar commonly used in Lakewood)

בע״ה, We whose names appear at the end of this document, either through our [actual] signature or through מסירת קולמוס (i.e. having someone else sign for us) give "power-of-attorney" and permission to Rabbi _____ to be our representative concerning all types of chometz that may be found by any one of us. Whether the is in a room or in the attic or in the basement or other area [e.g. garage or warehouse/storage area or business], whether on land or sea (or in the air). Whether it is אמץ which actually belongs to us or אמץ which does not belong to us but it is our responsibility to maintain; whether the responsibility is one placed on us by the Torah or one placed on us by the secular authorities, והן מצד אלמות. Whether it is chometz gamur or ta'aruvos chometz or chometz noksheh or something which we suspect might possibly contain chometz (sofek chometz). This also includes any liquid which contains chometz, even those which are for medicinal purposes. Whether the chometz is something consumed by humans or only by animals. הן מיני אומנות and baked items, and all grain that might have a suspicion of chometz; וכל מיני גרויפין and flour and whiskey/liquor or beer or other drinks, and even if the chometz is not recognizable in it. This also is includes all animals (or pets) belonging to us, whether horses or whether large or small cattle or birds (or fish). In other words, any living animal that is fed chometz.

Also if any one of us owns a business, or has a financial interest in a business or factory, that involves chometz, or a business involving animals etc.; whether the chometz is something that we actually own or it is leased to us in some manner. In other words, regarding

any item of chometz or possible chometz that one can state or imagine. Whether it is currently in our possession or whether it will be bought by us in the near future before the 14th of Nissan of this year _____ while it is permitted for us to purchase or sell it. Whether it will be our responsibility in any manner and whether it is something that might possibly become chometz between now and Pesach. In all of the above, regarding the chometz and regarding the storage areas that the chometz or chometz utensils, as well as anything else mentioned above, is being stored; whether the places belong to us or are rented or lent to us, with all legal rights that we have in them.

On everything we appoint the aforementioned Rav to be our agent in our stead, to arrange with the above chometz and chometz utensils and the storage places as he wishes and as he sees fit. His mouth is like our mouth, and his hand is like our hand and his actions are like our actions.

Permission is given to the aforementioned Rav to nullify and sell, during the time period that selling is permitted, to whoever wishes to buy and with any method of acquisition (קניק) that he desires; whether he sells for cash or on credit whether to someone trustworthy or even to someone who is not trustworthy. He may also keep the deposit money for himself. And he may sell all this whether for the market value or even below the market value even if the difference is more than 1/6 of the actual market value. ביטול מקח And even if the buyer gives no money and the Rav wishes to give it and all the associated items to him as a gift. To whomever he wishes. Whatever he does shall be approved and adjudicated and we cannot protest his actions and say "I sent you only for my benefit but not for my detriment." Whether he acts in a manner similar to that which has been done here in the past or in a different

manner by adding or subtracting any action; whether intentionally or unintentionally; it should all stand forcefully without any change or עיכוב ושיור כלל. Both regarding all the chometz and sofek chometz items and also regarding the locations of the chometz; permission is also granted to the aforementioned Rav to rent or lend the locations or even sell the locations (those that belong to us).

Also, it will be necessary for the non-Jewish purchaser to have the "right of passage" to get through our homes, attics or basements, etc to the places where these items will be located and we therefore give permission to the aforementioned Rav to give to the purchaser the required "right of passage" to him or to anyone sent on his behalf. And also [the seller] will give us "right of passage," to enter any of the locations that are being sold or rented or given to him [the non-Jew], during this time period, if necessary.

And permission is also given to the aforementioned Rav to write for the buyer a document valid according to the laws of the land; to write it at length and in detail and in strong and clear language stating the buyers unequivocal ownership in the best possible manner; whether according to Jewish law or whether according to the laws of the state and country and we the ones listed below, whether signing or having someone else sign for us, obligate ourselves completely and totally to allow this agreement to be written and signed in accordance with the laws and instructions of the secular courts in the strongest way possible in order that the actions of the aforementioned Rav be completely effective and validated 100% without any dimunition.

And this authorization is made openly and is well-known not like a "gentleman's agreement" and not like , טופסי דשטרא, and we hereby

nullify and invalidate any עידי מודעה like by a divorce document (גם). And any ambiguity or error or crossed out or erased words, shall be judged in favor of the afformentioned Rav and/or any representative of his. And we explicitly condition that if his designation as our representative should in any way be partially nullified for whatever reason, nevertheless it remains in force in that which remains without any dimunition in his power, G-d forbid, and his designation should not under any circumstances become totally nullified.

All of the above has been made by each one of us with our complete agreement. And for additional force and strengthening, and to expand on the above, we grant to the aforementioned Rav to be our representative with קנין אגב סודר and as if it were done in front of a בית דין חשוב and from now.

And as a proof [of our designation] we each write our names below, [and designate him] either through our actual signature or through מסירת קולמוס ("giving the pen over" to someone else to sign for us) or through כת הרשאה.
