
OVERVIEW ON THE PROGRAMME

The Interreg MED Programme is a European transnational cooperation programme adopted by the European Commission and co-financed by the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF). It provides funds for cooperation projects developed and managed by public bodies – and in some cases by private entities – in the Northern regions of the Mediterranean.

Its overall objective is to promote sustainable growth in the area by fostering innovative concepts and practices and a reasonable use of resources and by supporting social integration through an integrated and territorially based cooperation approach.

From Portugal to Cyprus, stakeholders of 13 different countries work together to find shared solutions to common challenges such as the implementation of low carbon economy, the protection of natural and cultural resources and the strengthening of innovation. These three challenges have been identified as the most critical for the area.

In order to be as efficient as possible, our projects will also be working on triggering changes in policies and political strategies on these three different topics. In this regard, the Programme aims to build a new community of interests through the implementation of tools and policy framework.

TYPES OF PROJECTS

For the 2014-2020 programming period, the Interreg MED programme has established three project categories: Strategic, Horizontal and Modular projects. Each type corresponds to different objectives and levels of impact necessary to build a solid framework of territorial cooperation. Likewise, the modular projects have three specific units that can be combined according to the targets of each project, enabling greater quality and efficiency. A modular project combining the three units makes for an integrated project.



GOVERNANCE & STRATEGIC PROJECTS

To influence and define policies towards a common goal of territorial development.

These projects seek to foster partnerships among local, regional and national public stakeholders to make an impact in policy-making. They are implemented following a top-down approach to improve governance tools in the Mediterranean.



HORIZONTAL PROJECTS

To create a new cooperation method between the various projects.

This is the mission that the Interreg MED Programme set up when creating the "Horizontal projects". They are the unifying elements of the Modular projects. Their objective is to design and implement common communication and capitalisation activities. Horizontal projects coordinate a thematic community.



MODULAR PROJECTS



MODULE 1 – STUDYING

Projects from this module will analyse an intervention field, complement data, build networks, references and design common approaches, shared methodology, models, and strategies. These activities can be the main objective of the project or become the first phase of a broader project.



MODULE 2 – TESTING

A module designed to cover testing and pilot activities where project partners will have the occasion to test processes, techniques, and models, in order to create solutions applicable to a wider set of users and territories. Testing activities can be set up when the context, data and actors are already well identified and when technical and institutional conditions are favourable.



MODULE 3 – CAPITALISING

When methodologies, practices, and intervention tools have been successfully tested and implemented in regions, projects can suggest capitalisation and dissemination activities in the Mediterranean area. A specific attention will be paid to the transfer of results towards regional and national programmes, funded by the ERDF and to the involvement of end users in the communication processes.




INTEGRATED PROJECTS

GOVERNANCE & STRATEGIC PROJECTS

During the 2014-2020 programming period, the Interreg MED Programme invested in the Axis 4, to reinforce governance efforts in the Mediterranean Region. The Programme participating States acknowledged the need to improve the coordination of policies and actions to ensure a more informed use of public funds and seize additional opportunities for development and growth.

This approach is reflected in the PANORAMED project, a platform for intergovernmental close and permanent dialogue among national, regional, European and international actors in the region.

PANORAMED: SUPPORT GOVERNANCE COORDINA-TION IN THE MEDITERRANEAN

The PANORAMED platform is an innovative intergovernmental project that joins 21 ministerial and regional authorities of the European States of the Mediterranean shores and of the three pre-accession to the EU States, namely Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Montenegro. The main goal of this initiative is to contribute to the definition of shared policies and actions to respond to challenges and sustainable growth opportunities of the Mediterranean Region. Under the coordination of the Lead Partner, the Spanish Ministry of Finance and Public Administration, the partner authorities will discuss themes of high relevance for the region, such as coastal and maritime tourism or maritime surveillance, in order to identify top down strategic projects and contribute to shared policies and frameworks.

Approved in June 2017, with a nine million euros budget and running until spring 2022, the project ensures a medium/long term perspective and has the potential to give a positive contribution to new EU strategies in the Mediterranean beyond the time length of the Interreg MED Programme.

2019 has been the first year when the governance processes have been fully operational, with all different types of projects, including the new 4 Governance strategic projects, working together with the thematic projects communities and the platform project that coordinates the Axis.

Four strategic projects were approved to work on coastal and maritime tourism and on maritime surveillance. Two new strategic projects on innovation are foreseen in early 2020.



STRATEGIC PROJECTS: SUPPORT GOVERNANCE PROCESSES IN THE MEDITERRANEAN

2019 has been the first year when the governance processes have become fully operational. The new four strategic projects, approved in 2019, completed the governance processes within the Programme architecture, bringing it to its fully operational scope.

These projects aim to bring together public authorities of various regions and countries to coordinate tourism, maritime surveillance and innovation policies in the region. Many stakeholders and initiatives spread around the Sea basin call for a better coordination of actions and approaches.

More concretely, they carry out their activities building notably from the outcomes of the Interreg MED thematic projects. The four strategic projects involve actively 39 public partners on the ground (national authorities, regions and municipalities), from 10 countries, developing pilot actions and new coordinated action plans, organising data storage, fostering policy coordination and offering training or giving assistance to relevant authorities to help them improve their technical capabilities.





BEST MED

Strategic project on Coastal and Maritime tourism

The project aims to achieve a better coordination and a touristic planning for a more sustainable tourism in the Mediterranean coasts, to contain the phenomenon called "seasonality". The partnership works on a more balanced distribution of tourists between the coastal and inland areas. This is done by implementing the "MED Sustainable Path and Cultural Routes Model" (MED S&C Path) method. The project also oversees spreading the use of tools already developed, adapted or promoted by Modular projects such as the "Tourism Data indicators toolkit", the "Green Beach Model" (designed by MITOMED+) or "Tourism sustainability toolkit in Mediterranean" (CO-EVOLVE project).

Strategic project on Coastal and Maritime tourism

The project's overall objective is to promote the MED area as an attractive, smart and inclusive destination, by setting up a permanent collaborative platform for joint action as well as networking events and regional forums. The capacities of all stakeholders in tourism business and policy making thus are strengthened, along with the competitiveness and the attractiveness of Med Destinations through the development of a transferable and sustainable SMART Tourism Business Model.

This should allow the attainment of a new long-term vision for tourism in the Mediterranean area, that is actually failing to attract innovative business in tourism especially during off peak seasons, leading to heavily seasonal labour market and putting great pressure on natural resources, local infrastructure and public services.



WHAT RESULTS HAVE THEY OBTAINED?

The Blue Growth Community has integrated dynamics between projects and transnational key stakeholders and the support of Mediterranean clusters active in Blue Economy. Results: its work is synthetized in informative factsheets on clusters, maritime surveillance, yachting, blue energies and a policy paper.



MODULAR PROJECTS







The project aimed at stimulating, coaching and funding Cross-Sectoral and trans-boundary innovation of the med key sector "blue growth". Main change sought was to improve basic conditions for bridging the gap among the Mediterranean maritime clusters and within their quadruple helixes, thanks to the collaboration with the non-institutional innovation agents such as fab labs, co-working spaces, makerspaces, creative hubs, etc. The project first offered an intense cycle of coaching and matchmaking sessions, and then offered an innovation voucher scheme for 48 small scale innovation projects, such as the creation of innovative mobile apps, the support to solar boats and the promotion of virtual and augmented reality for educational and promotional purpose.

BLUE CROWDFUNDING





The project aims to develop the capacity building of Blue Economy stakeholders to effectively use crowdfunding. Its strategies will allow SMEs to shift from public funding to crowdfunding and crowdsourcing, with the goal of financing and validating Blue Economy products and services. The lack of capital hinders innovation in the Blue Economy: banks are mistrustful of SMEs and there are not alternative financing tools. The project will provide SMEs with better access to different financial support. Partners will work with Blue Economy clusters, crowdfunding experts, universities and local authority to develop these skills through such means as international training.



In Mediterranean regions, buildings represent one of the main sources of Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions, especially public buildings (schools, administrative bodies). Most of such buildings requires heavy upgrading in terms of insulation and cooling systems currently partly financed by national, regional and EU thematic programmes.

Projects co-funded by the Interreg MED Programme under this thematic are focusing on increasing the capacity of public buildings owners and managers to develop and implement energy efficiency practices. The Efficient Buildings community has been created precisely to cope with these issues. Starting from a bottom-up approach, this community, coordinated by the MEDNICE Horizontal project, intends to test and spread good local practices in neighbouring Mediterranean regions and countries.

The Efficient Buildings community developed tools to help public authorities in the implementation of energy efficiency building renovation. Several methodologies and protocols were tested. All technical knowledge is available in four Technical Papers, which led to 2 policy papers on financing and information and a manifesto for a Mediterranean energy transition.

The project has developed an integrated multi-scale assessment system connecting the urban and building scale to support decision-making processes for sustainable public buildings. 8 contextualized assessment tools (CESBA SNTools) were developed to support decision makers and the managers of public building stocks in the implementation of more efficient energy retrofitting plans, combining the building and the urban scale. It aimed at improving the capacity of owners and managers of public buildings for better management, planning and verification of energy, through a Life Cycle Assessment approach. 

WHAT RESULTS HAVE THEY OBTAINED?

Territorial planning is at the core of the Renewable energy community, as a governance tool for energy adaptation in islands and rural areas. This Community created a new approach to implement renewable energies in islands and local communities: the Ecosystemic Territorial Units (ETU). It aims to involve populations, authorities and civil society in a positive dialogue to welcome energy infrastructures. Different components are part of these units: energy community (social component); energy planning (territorial component); energy governance (legal component) and energy facilities (technology component). Key policy recommendations and a manifesto synthetise the outcomes of this community.



COMPOSE



The project contributed to an increased sustainable Renewable Energy Sources (RES) planning capacity at the decision-making and planning-expert levels. It built on existing experience and knowhow from previous projects and initiatives by promoting the development of local business in combination with the development of local added value chains. WHAT IS IT ABOUT?

The increase in population during touristic seasons is changing Mediterranean cities. They are often unprepared and need to adapt to provide sustainable transit systems between city centres, ports and the neighbourhoods. However, cities also have to deal with the necessary preservation of their natural and cultural heritage, particularly in their historical centres.

Projects co-financed under the Urban Transports thematic especially address issues related to the use and access to low carbon and multimodal transport systems for the different categories of population and territories.



The project aimed at striking a balance boosting the economic advantages of cruise ship tourism while simultaneously mitigating the negative impacts on the natural environment and urban mobility. The project supported local public administrations to draft Low-Carbon Transport and mobility Plans (LCTPs), providing cities with a long-term vision for urban mobility. LCTPs were developed and implemented in seven pilot cruise destinations using an integrated transport and land-use planning process. LCTP were devised to be easily integrated in the city SUMP or SECAP. These actions have been replicated in further 11 Mediterranean cities, that developed their own LCTP under the mentorship of LO-CATIONS partners. In all affected territories, LOCATIONS fostered innovative concepts. practices, governance, technologies, services, effective resources management and a territorially-based approach. The project was able to successfully reduce impacts on environmental, natural and cultural assets, and improving accessibility and quality of life for tourists and local populations.

REMEDIO



It addresses the challenge of the high-density areas surrounding the city centres with commercial and directional roads often suffering from traffic jam to the point of becoming wounds in the connectivity of the wide spread city and elements of additional economic crisis and even social exclusion. By an innovative approach, based on a strong participative approach and tested in 4 pilot cities, REME-DIO proposes to transform the congested roads into «horizontal condominiums», forms of participatory governance that actively engage institutions, stakeholders and citizens and with which the Municipality directly interact to improve multi-modal and low carbon mobility, freight logistics and environmental quality. Further the governance model of the condominium and the pilot activities, the project developed an Integrated Modelling Tool (IMT) that provides to users (i.e. technician responsible for traffic management of the city) the possibility of analysing the main effects of traffics over congested roads in the current situation, as well as analysing the effects of apply potential soft-actions to mitigate the road-congestion problems.



BLUEISLANDS





It aimed to develop effective ways to identify, address and mitigate the impact of the seasonal variation of waste generated on Mediterranean islands. During the first year, it measured the correlation of tourism and waste generation, through analysis of micro-plastics and marine litter on 18 selected beaches, and an investigation of the quality of coastal seawater through short-term macro algae deployments. 

EU policies have reaffirmed the importance of protected areas for the conservation of biological diversity. 

Posidonia oceanica is a Mediterranean endemic sea plant, which is vital to aquatic ecosystems and coastline protection. However, municipalities in tourist areas see it negatively. The project aimed to define a transnational joint management strategy for Posidonia beach/dunes systems.
